Stanley S. Takahashi, a respected hotel executive who rose through the ranks at Sheraton during a 50-year career, died Dec. 23, 2002. He was 70. Takahashi was remembered yesterday for his brutal honesty, his good advice and a quiet style of effective leadership. For the past 13 years, Takahashi had been executive vice president and chief operating officer for **Kyo-ya Co.**, which owns the four Sheraton hotels in Waikiki and the Sheraton Maui. He didn't start at the top, however. A Farrington grad, Takahashi became an accounting clerk for Matson Waikiki hotels in 1952. Sheraton bought the hotels in 1959, and Takahashi became controller of Sheraton Hawaii Hotels in 1965. Three years later, he became regional controller with

responsibilities for Sheraton in Asia. Takahashi retired from Sheraton in 1989 as executive vice president and assistant director of operation for Sheraton-Hotels Japan. He then jumped to Kyo-ya, which also owns the Sheraton Palace in San Francisco and the Grand Cypress Resort in Orlando, Fla. Takahashi served on the board of directors of **Bank of Hawaii** from 1984 to April 2002. He was also on the board of **United Laundry Services Inc.**, which is part owned by Kyo-ya, from 1992 to August 2002. "When he spoke, everybody listened," said Alton Kuioka, vice chairman of Bank of Hawaii. "His comments were very profound. His questions were pretty direct. He was not one to beat about the bush." "People around the world worked under Stanley," said Keith Vieira, senior vice president and operations director for Sheraton's parent company in Hawaii. Takahashi was best known for his advice, which was to stay humble and cool. "If things were going well, he'd be the first to say, 'Hey, don't get swell head,'" Vieira said. If things were going bad, Takahashi would caution against doom and gloom. Takahashi also played a quiet political role in guiding the state's tourism industry. "He gave a lot of advice to legislators and governors on how to best try to help the industry," Vieira said. "Stanley seemed to know a lot about everything." During this year's contract negotiations between unionized hotel workers and Sheraton hotels in Waikiki, Takahashi pushed toward a resolution that avoided a strike, according to observers on both sides. "Stanley was definitely a giant in labor relations in Waikiki," said Eric Gill, financial secretary-treasurer for the Hotel Employees & Restaurant Employees union Local 5. "Stanley was the guy who could say 'yes' on the money items." At Kyo-ya, Takahashi oversaw more than 5,000 workers in the islands, a significant portion of the state's work force. "It's my understanding that our members who work at the Sheraton hotels have a lot of respect for Stanley Takahashi," said Jason Ward, Local 5 researcher. "He wasn't like an absentee owner," said Gill. "He was the guy that really cared about the operation in Waikiki and Hawaii." Takahashi also oversaw the \$50 million restoration of the Sheraton Moana Surfrider in 1989 and the \$160 million redevelopment of the Sheraton Maui in the mid-1990s. Services will be held Jan. 17 at the Sheraton Waikiki ballroom. Takahashi is survived by his wife, Annette Takahashi; brother, Nelson Takahashi; sisters Carol Tanaka and Jean Morita; daughter Nan Some; son Tod Takahashi; and granddaughter Lindsey Some. Kyo-ya, a subsidiary of Japan-based Kokusai Kogyo Co., came to Hawaii in 1956 when it opened Kyo-ya Restaurant on Kalakaua Avenue. Francis S. Takemoto, who went from teaching mathematics to serving with the heroes of the 100th Infantry Battalion in World War II and on to become the first American of Japanese ancestry to achieve the rank of general, died Sunday in Honolulu at the age of 89. It was in 1964 that Takemoto was promoted to general of the Hawai'i National Guard to become the first American of Japanese ancestry to reach that rank in the U.S. armed forces. "He was a man of quiet dignity. He was never ruffled in combat and he excelled in leadership qualities," said Denis Teraoka, 84, who served with Takemoto in the 100th Battalion's Company D. "He was concerned for the men under his command and always made sure that his men knew their

assignments." Takemoto was born on Nov. 28, 1912 in Honolulu, the son of Tsunetaro and Tane Takemoto, who were Japanese immigrants. He graduated from McKinley High School and majored in chemistry at the University of Hawai'i. While at the university, Takemoto joined the Reserve Officers' Training Corps and was commissioned a second lieutenant in 1935. Takemoto worked for a pineapple plantation but was unhappy with the work. He then decided to apply for graduate studies at Santa Barbara State College in California, where he earned a teaching degree. He returned to Hawai'i and began his long career in education as a math teacher. But all of that was put on hold with the start of World War II. Takemoto was called to active duty and assigned to the 100th Infantry Battalion of the famed 442nd "Go for Broke" Regiment. During a battle in Italy, Takemoto was hit in the head by shrapnel, for which he earned a Purple Heart. By the time the war was over, Takemoto had received four battle stars, the Victory medal and a Presidential Citation with cluster. In 1946, Takemoto returned to Hawai'i and resumed his teaching career. He also joined the National Guard and helped reorganize Headquarters Company of the 299th Infantry Battalion on the Big Island. Takemoto managed his dual career as an educator and a military officer for more than 20 years. He served as principal at Aliamanu Elementary and later Manoa Elementary. After a full day at school, he would change into his uniform and spend most of his evenings and weekends with the Guard. In January 1964, Takemoto made history when he was promoted to brigadier general and took command of the Guard's 29th Infantry Brigade. Takemoto's son, Harvey, said his father didn't talk much about his military career. "He was typical of most of those guys. ... he didn't wear it on his sleeve. It was just part of their duty that they had to do," Harvey Takemoto said. "If you were to meet him, you would have never known that he was a general. And talking to his friends, that was kind of the image that he had. He wasn't a showboat," Takemoto said. "He earned the respect. It wasn't just because he had the title." In 1968, during the height of the Vietnam War, the 29th Infantry Brigade was called to active duty. Takemoto had hoped to go with his troops to Vietnam, but he was forced to retire because he had served the maximum amount of time in the Guard. On May 4, 1968, he was presented the Medal of Merit, the highest award given by the Guard. Takemoto is survived by a daughter, Carol Dee Nishimura; son, Harvey; sisters, Elsie Sumida and Sue Awada; and six grandchildren. Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. June 9 at Hosoi Garden Mortuary [Adv 30/5/2002]

Francis Shigeo Takemoto, veteran of the famed 100th Infantry Battalion and the first American of Japanese ancestry to reach the rank of brigadier general, died in his sleep Sunday May 26, 2002 in Honolulu. He was 89. Takemoto was a math teacher before serving in the Army during World War II and was later principal of Aliamanu and Manoa elementary schools. As an infantry lieutenant in Anzio, Italy, he was hit in the head with shrapnel, according to his friend Denis Teraoka, who was about 300 yards away. The battle wound earned Takemoto a Purple Heart. For his military service, he also was awarded the Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Bronze Star, the Asiatic-Pacific Medal, a European Theater medal with four battle stars, a Victory Medal and a Presidential Citation with cluster. Takemoto was a role model for other soldiers, Teraoka said. "When you see someone like Francis, who didn't show any fear and had good control of himself, we wanted to follow in his footsteps. He gave us confidence. He was an excellent soldier," Teraoka said. Takemoto was "like an older brother" when they met in 1944. "I depended on him to help me out," Teraoka said. He served as Teraoka's best man at his wedding. After the war, Takemoto helped reorganize the headquarters of the Hawaii National Guard's 299th Infantry Battalion on the Big Island and was promoted to major. He later became commander of the 2nd Battalion, 298th Infantry, then took over the 1st Battalion at the guard headquarters at Fort Ruger. Later he became executive officer for the 29th Infantry Brigade, with the rank of colonel. His promotion to brigadier general soon followed. When then-Gov. John A. Burns pinned on his general's stars, it was one of the proudest moments in Takemoto's life, according to a 1964 news story. His wife, Gladys C. Uyeno, also helped pin on the stars. A math teacher by training, Takemoto became a principal at Aliamanu Elementary School in 1957 and later Manoa Elementary in 1965. After spending a full day at school, he would change into his uniform for his second career. According to Teraoka, the general "wasn't the type of guy to be satisfied being just a schoolteacher. He continued to be a leader in the National Guard. He was full of energy and always looking for something to do to better himself." Takemoto, son of Japanese immigrants, graduated from McKinley High School in 1935 and attended the University of Hawaii. He earned a teaching degree in 1940 from Santa Barbara State College. He is survived by daughter Carol Dee Nishimura, son Harvey, sisters Elsie Sumida and Sue Awada, and six grandchildren. Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. June 9 at Hosoi Garden Mortuary. Walter Tamashiro - Legend has it that residents in Kalihi-Palama saw a bunch of Samoan crabs running wildly down King and Palama streets many years ago. Rather than panic or scoop up the large crustaceans for their own pots, they caught the wayward crabs and returned them to Tamashiro Market. Everyone in the community knew that there was only one place other than the Ala Wai canal that the Samoan crabs and other live seafood could come from, and that was from Walter Tamashiro's store. Tamashiro, a pioneer in the seafood business who turned a mom-and-pop store into a Hawai'i landmark, died Thursday Aug 15, 2002 in Honolulu. He was 72. Tamashiro was one of a few business owners in the early 1960s who sold fresh and live seafood. But because he was new at the business, he didn't quite know how to keep many of the live creatures. "He didn't tie them very

well, so they got loose and ran down the street, underneath the neighbors' houses and under the buses," said his son, Cyrus Tamashiro. "That's how he learned how to tie crabs a little better — they ended up chasing them down and the neighbors came and retrieved them." Cyrus Tamashiro gave the crab incident as an example of how his father would try new things. Tamashiro Market was one of the first retailers to import live Maine lobsters, and Kona and Dungeness crabs. The store also featured an expanded poke section, which has become common in many fresh fish stores. Tamashiro Market didn't start out as a seafood operation. Walter's parents, Chogen and Yoshiko Tamashiro, opened the original grocery store in Hilo, where Walter was born. The 1946 tsunami wiped out the family store, and Chogen Tamashiro decided to move the family to Honolulu in 1947. The Tamashiros set up a new store at North King and Palama streets, where it operated as a typical mom-and-pop grocery. When Chogen Tamashiro's health began to fail, Walter took over the store in 1954. The only other employees beside himself were his wife, Louise, mother and one worker. Walter Tamashiro wasn't satisfied with just a grocery store, so he looked at what his customers wanted, which was fresh seafood. "He just saw a niche that wasn't being filled, and he realized that his customers loved fish," Cyrus Tamashiro said. "He focused on quality seafood and variety." The business began slowly, and Tamashiro was lucky to sell a few pieces of opelu and half an aku, his son said. But Tamashiro Market grew in popularity, and the store, with its pink building and famous crab sign, would become a regular stop for residents and visitors. "His approach to business was building relationships and trust," Cyrus Tamashiro said. "His relationships usually developed into friendships, and quite often they lasted a lifetime. He had a lot of friends and was very well liked." One of the market's early employees was Hari Kojima, who began as a part-time clerk when he was in high school, more than 40 years ago. Kojima often demonstrated the art of fish cleaning for customers and made guest appearances on the "Let's Go Fishing" television show. Kojima eventually became host of the show and later "Hari's Kitchen." He was delivering newspapers when Tamashiro asked his mother for permission to hire him, he said yesterday. Kojima described Tamashiro as a father figure. "There were many occasions when I was on the clock, he would take me on the side and talk about different things — not necessarily business, just talk," Kojima said. "I would feel guilty because I was getting paid. But (he wanted to) teach you something. It didn't have to be about business — and that was a really neat part of him." Pat Arakaki has known Tamashiro for more than 50 years. The chief executive officer of Hawaiian Candies & Nuts said he admired Tamashiro, who started his career as a pig farmer. "He

learned the business the hard way," Arakaki said. "He wasn't a fisherman. But he made it a go, and as you know Tamashiro Market became famous in Hawai'i. Even on the Mainland they know Tamashiro Market." Entertainer Danny Kaleikini, a longtime friend of Walter Tamashiro, called him "truly Hawaiian." "He would always support no matter what thing I got involved with that had to do with the people of Hawai'i, and I thank him for all the support," Kaleikini said. "He will be truly missed." Besides his wife and son Cyrus, Tamashiro is survived by sons Guy and Sean; five grandchildren; mother, Iris Yoshiko; and sisters, Ellen Konishi and Loraine Tamashiro. Albert Takeo Teruya, co-founder of the homegrown Times Super Market Ltd. and son of Big Island plantation workers, died yesterday July 21, 2002 afternoon. He was 89. "He really loved his family and he worked hard to provide for us," his youngest son, Galen Teruya, said today. "He said to always take care of your family and to never give up when you're down." Albert Teruya and his brother, Wallace, founded Times in 1949 on a 6,000-square-foot patch of land near the corner of McCully and King streets. The company rode the post-World War II boom to become the state's third-largest grocery store chain in the 1990s with 13 stores on Oahu. Albert moved to Honolulu from the Big Island in 1929, at age 15. Wallace followed two years later. The brothers' first venture was the former Times Grill on Kapiolani Boulevard in the 1940s. The grocery store, named after the restaurant and sold last year to a Northern California-based food stores company, was the brainchild of the third brother, Herman Teruya, who died in combat during World War II. Albert Teruya is survived by daughters Lorraine Yoshioka and Arlene Kozuma; and sons, Elton and Galen Teruya. [SB 22/7/2002]

Albert Teruya, a businessman who co-established the chain of Times Super Markets on O'ahu, died Sunday Jul 21, 2002. He was 89. Teruya opened the first Times Super Market, a small 6,000-square-foot store, on South King Street with his brother, Wallace Teruya, in 1949. The business grew steadily, with 13 stores across O'ahu, and became the state's third-largest supermarket chain. The Teruya family sold Times Super Market Ltd. to Quinn Supers Inc., a California supermarket operator, in January. "It's something to have a string of successful businesses," said Teruya's nephew, Dexter Teruya. "A lot of people try with several businesses, and when one makes it, that's good. But, to have a string of successes, that's more than just luck. "He just felt you could accomplish a lot of things through hard work, and all his life, he always worked hard." Albert Teruya was born in February 1913 in Honomu, Hawai'i, and lived on a sugar plantation. He worked on the plantation until he moved to Honolulu in 1929 and worked as a dishwasher, waiter and cook. The Teruya brothers opened the South King Street store after they sold their first business venture, Times Grill, later known as Columbia Inn, in 1947. They built Times Super Market Ltd. in memory of their third brother,

Herman, who had been killed in Italy during World War II, and expanded the chain during the post-war boom into one of the biggest supermarket operators in the Territory of Hawai'i. In 1960, after celebrating the company's 11th anniversary, Teruya credited his business success to "the loyalty and cooperation of our employees." Dexter said his uncle was a respected businessman because of his modesty. "He always gave credit to his customers, but he also gave credit to his employees," Dexter said. "He knew in any business, you can't do it on your own. The supermarket business is service-oriented and you're very dependent on your employees. He appreciated them." Teruya was elected as a director of the City Bank of Honolulu in 1961. Teruya was also a director of the Honolulu Chamber of Commerce, the Honolulu Japanese Chamber of Commerce and the Hawai'i Economic Study Club. In 1979, Teruya spearheaded a program that donated \$180,000 to the Blood Bank of Hawai'i's fund to build a new building. "He was more than just a businessman," Dexter said. "He also helped out with fund-raising, and he was a generous person who was active in the community." Arthur K. Trask, a lawyer, politician and patriarch of the Trask family, died June 3, 2002 on Kaua'i. He was 91. Trask was born on Oct. 14, 1910, to David and Anna Trask. David Trask was an early member of the Democratic Party in Hawai'i whose influence on his nine children was immense. The Trask offspring included eldest son Arthur; Bernard, also a lawyer and father of Haunani-Kay and Mililani Trask; and David Jr., former head of the Hawai'i Government Employees Association. The Trask family, particularly Arthur, is well-known for having strong opinions and voices. "Uncle Arthur was without peer," said Haunani-Kay Trask, a professor at the Center for Hawaiian Studies at the University of Hawai'i-Manoa. "He was the most jocular, talkative, opinionated, humorous of all of the Trasks." Trask said her uncle was a notable storyteller and orator, a throwback to the "great lawyers of that era." In his later years, Arthur Trask regularly attended public hearings and meetings, regaling those in attendance with wide-ranging lessons in the history of the Islands and of the world. "He had an untiring ability and limitless wealth of knowledge to speak about historical and current issues, be it economics, health, religion, science or politics," said his son, Arthur "Pepe" Trask Jr. Arthur K. Trask graduated from Saint Louis School and did his undergraduate work at the University of Southern California, University of Hawai'i and Iowa State University. He earned his law degree from Georgetown University in 1936. Before leaving the Islands for school, he sometimes performed errands for deposed Queen Lili'uokalani, collecting debts owed her. A member of the Hawai'i and Washington, D.C., bars, Trask practiced for 40 years as a trial lawyer. From 1940 to 1944, he served as a magistrate in the Ko'olaupoko district. But politics also was in his blood and he served as chairman of the Democratic Party's platform committee in 1936-46. Trask also was a supporter of statehood and was the last surviving member of the Statehood Commission, which he sat on from 1944 to 1957. While fighting for statehood, Trask also was a supporter of Hawaiian rights. During the formation of the sovereignty group Ka Lahui, led by lawyer Mililani Trask, Arthur Trask argued eloquently for a nation-within-a-nation form of government for Native Hawaiians. Haunani-Kay Trask said she at first could not understand how her uncle could be an advocate for statehood and Hawaiian sovereignty at the same time. "Statehood meant they could vote for the governor, and once I understood that I could understand why they wanted statehood because before that the governors were all appointed by the president," she said. "They knew very well that until they got the vote they would never control who was governor." Arthur Trask was married six times.
