Dr. Patrick Koon Hung Pi'imauna Charles Aiu, a physician who delivered a generation of Kaua'i children and a leader in the Hawaiian voyaging canoe culture, died Oct. 28, 2002. He was 63. Aiu, who retired as a colonel from the Hawai'i National Guard, was doctor to countless patients on Kaua'i and Ni'ihau, and was the county's first specialist in obstetrics and gynecology. Dr. Patrick Koon Hung Piimauna Charles Aiu, a physician on Kauai and Niihau for more than 30 years, the first ship's doctor on the voyaging canoe Hokule'a, retired National Guard colonel and accomplished guitarist, died Monday Oct 28, 2002 on Oahu at age 63. The youngest of eight children, Aiu was born on Kauai on Sept. 14, 1939, and grew up in Wailua Houselots on Kauai's East Shore. He graduated from Kapaa High School and attended several universities, ultimately graduating from the UCLA medical school in 1964. After serving three years as an Army doctor in Germany, Aiu returned to Kauai and became the first obstetrical/gynecological specialist on the island, his family said. He visited Niihau regularly and retired from his medical practice three years ago. As a pioneer native Hawaiian physician, he received the 1998 Kaionohi Award for Outstanding Contributions in Hawaiian Health. He also served as a member of the state Board of Medical Examiners and remained in the Hawaii National Guard until his retirement. Aiu sailed aboard the Hokule'a on its first trip to Tahiti in 1980. Later he sailed on several legs of the Hokule'a's two-year "Voyage of Rediscovery." He considered his voyages to be among his proudest accomplishments. In 1999, Aiu and two fellow Hokule'a crew members, John Kruse and Dennis Chuan, began building a voyaging canoe, Na Mahoe, for Kauai. To fund the project, Aiu started the Na Pali outrigger canoe race, which has been broadcast worldwide and has become an annual event. Aiu's ashes will be brought from Oahu to Kauai aboard the voyaging canoe Hawai'i Loa by master navigator Nainoa Thompson, with whom Aiu sailed to Tahiti. Bumpei Akaji, whose copper sculptures grace the University of Hawaii, Central Union Church, Fort DeRussy and many other public places, died Oct. 27, 2002 in Honolulu. He was 81. Using a hammer, tin snips and a torch, Akaji molded bits of copper into abstract figures of Hawaii's environment and its citizens. He said he liked copper because of the way it looks when it ages. The native of Lawai, Kauai, served with the 442nd Regimental Combat Team in World War II, receiving a discharge in Italy, a country he came to love, said close friend and family attorney James Koshiba. On a Fulbright Scholarship, he studied art in Italy, receiving his bachelor's degree there. He came home to earn a master's degree in fine arts from the University of Hawaii. Koshiba said Akaji was loath to sell his work. "If you were his friend, he'd want to give it to you" or even loan it, Koshiba said. "His art was so much a part of him, you knew that when you acquired something from Bumpei, you were receiving something of him." Koshiba said Akaji was the most unpretentious and truly humble person he has known. Akaji was among a group of prolific artists in Hawaii who began their work in the 1950s. Others included Satoru Abe and Tadashi Sato. Abe said Akaji devoted himself to his art full time instead of worrying about making a living because "he had a good wife; we all had good wives. It was a little different in those days," Abe said, chuckling. Akaji was a "very consistent person" in his style of art as well as his production, often choosing Hawaii's water, mountains, ocean and wildlife as his subject matter, Abe said. Since he and Akaji knew each other for so many years, they could "communicate without saying anything ... or with just one sentence," Abe said. Asked if he would miss Akaji, Abe replied with sadness, "Yes, yes, yes, yes, yes ... But I believe in reincarnation. He'll come back ... as a human being to create more artwork." Many of Akaji's works were commissioned by the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts and are part of its "Art in Public Places" collection. Akaji's works are also known throughout the United States and Japan. One of Akaji's more recent works was a monument to honor Japanese Americans who fought in World War II, erected at Fort DeRussy in Waikiki in 1998. Rose Marie Alvaro, a dark-haired beauty whose striking poses on a series of Hawai'i Visitors Bureau posters lured millions of visitors to poststatehood Hawai'i, died Wednesday Dec 18, 2002 in Straub Hospital. She was 59 and suffered from breast cancer. At 18 and fresh out of Sacred Hearts Academy in 1961, Alvaro was selected to become a "poster girl" for the Hawai'i Visitors Bureau in an aggressive new effort to sell the Islands in the jet age. Little did she know then that her face would be the one that would launch millions of trips to Hawai'i. "Her poster gave an image of Hawai'i that inspired people or had people longing to come to Hawai'i," said Fred Honda, general manager of the Halekulani Hotel and a hotel industry veteran, who vividly remembers the promotional tool that made Alvaro an informal but important cultural ambassador for Hawai'i' from the early 1960s to the mid-1970s. "I thought she was one of the most gorgeous poster girls," said Myrtle Lee, a retired hotel industry executive, who was with Amfac/Island Holidays in the heyday of the tourism posters. "Besides being one of the most popular HVB poster girls, she was also a fine human being." Other hotel and entertainment industry veterans fondly remembered Alvaro, who studied hula and danced with the Kent Ghirard troupe, often performing barefoot and in grass skirts in promotional shows around the world. "She set an example for the rest of us to be cute." said Cha Thompson, a vice president of Tihati Productions and a former hula dancer. "She was sweet. She was the prettiest of all the poster girls and she really helped sell Hawai'i." Of Hawaiian, Portuguese, Chinese and English extraction, Alvaro had the requisite long hair, graceful figure, beguiling smile and lovely face that came to symbolize exotic beauty in the set of now-classic poster photos shot by Robert Wenkam. Her image appeared in three editions of the posters, in English and in Japanese, and she also received near-iconic status on 10 million Arden Farms milk cartons. For more than two decades, her image appeared in millions of magazines and on Wicked Wahine perfume products. "She never thought of herself as a celebrity and she was not awed by celebrities," said her sister, Margaret Apao. "She performed all over the world, visited the Kennedy compound and met people like Ted Kennedy and Jackie Kennedy, and Sammy Davis Jr. even used to call the house. One time, she was at the Danny Kaleikini show at the Kahala Hilton and Mary Tyler Moore was there, and Rosie didn't know who she was. She never got excited about the people she met." She also never got rich, receiving worldwide recognition but little money for her work as a symbol of Hawai'i. At the time of her death, she was in the interior design business, the Rose in RobertRose

Interiors. Interior design became her passion after her work as a poster girl. Alvaro also worked briefly at the Hyatt Regency Hotel, training hostesses. She also operated a modeling agency that helped visiting film industry executives locate people, props, transportation and accommodations. "She was always a planner, a stickler for details," Apao said. "She was the greatest. As I looked over her things after she died, I could feel she was here, over me, telling me 'this,' 'this,' 'that.' " Apao said Alvaro's partner, architect John Tatom, took her to the Straub emergency room on Wednesday, when she was having difficulty with her oxygen at home. "The fire engines came, the ambulance came, and Rosie was quite upset," Apao said. "She was a little furious about the fuss by the time I got to the hospital." Alvaro's cancer had spread, Apao said. "But she was working pretty much down to the wire — she was a fighter." Services will be held at Star of the Sea Church in Wai'alae-Kahala at 5:30 p.m. Dec. 26, her 60th birthday, with burial the next day at 9 a.m. at Hawaiian Memorial Park. "It will be a simple funeral, just how Rose wanted it," Apao said. "Because it will be her birthday, friends have been asking, 'What shall we bring?' I've been telling people to wear a lei; the tuberose was Rose's favorite, but any kind of lei would do. She hated those floral wreaths, so the family requests no flowers, just lei. Peter Amcotts - Former Oahu resident and agribusiness and engineering consultant Peter Amcotts, 78, died at his home in Marin County, Calif., May

7. Among his accomplishments during 35 years in Hawaii were work in 1960 as a consulting engineer for reconstruction after the Hilo tsunami; consulting to Henry Kaiser for the original Hawaii Kai project; planning and design for the Kalani-Iki development; vice president of engineering for Castle & Cooke's Mililani Town; consultant to Alexander and Baldwin for the Aepoeha Reservoir on Kauai; and senior project manager for the Villages of Kapolei. His company, International Research and Development Corp., provided consulting services in Hawaii and overseas from 1970 until this year. Though a civil engineer by training, Amcotts provided agricultural consulting with a jojoba oil project on Maui and a number of projects overseas, said daughter Julie Dougherty. Dougherty said her father kept a map of all his flight routes on travels to 68 countries. Amcotts was born in Buckinghamshire, England, in 1924 and was a captain in the British Royal and Indian Corps of Engineers during World War II. He and his wife, Daphne, met in Ceylon and lived in England, Africa and Canada before settling in Hawaii from 1960 to 1996. Dougherty described her father as an entrepreneur. "Either we had money or were eating coconuts in the back yard. He was one of those people who'd make it and then lose everything," Dougherty said. "He'd come up with ideas and do these projects, very creative. Afterward, he'd get back on the horse and do something else. He never wanted to retire." One of his not-so-successful ventures was a plan to grow jojoba on Maui and sell the plant's oil for use in cosmetics, detergents and food products. The family moved all over Oahu as Amcotts pursued his avocation of buying houses, fixing them up and then selling them, Dougherty said. An avid sailor, he did the same with sailboats. Dougherty credited her father with being ahead of his time when he designed condominium complexes with underground utilities and community centers. Despite failing eyesight, Amcotts self-published an autobiography about his life titled "The Best Laid Plans." "He always kept a little notebook in his pocket, and whenever he met someone or did something, he took a note," Dougherty said. He wrote his life story based on 50 years of those little notebooks. Dougherty said her parents were able to vacation on Oahu and Maui within the past year, which was important for her father. "My dad really missed Hawaii. I think his last wish was to come back to Hawaii and have a vacation." In addition to his wife and Dougherty, Amcotts is survived by daughter Karen, brother Bill, sister Kathleen Ellis and four grandchildren. Kimi Mito Amemiya - When Kimi Mito Amemiya passed away June 4 2002, the 96-year-old Mililani resident left behind a line of descendants that includes two former state attorneys general, a school vice principal, a former city budget director, the head of the state high school sports association and a genetic medical researcher. Amemiya always stressed education and doing your best, said son Ronald, the state attorney general from 1974 to 1978. But it was her love, hard work and sacrifice that really made the difference, he said. "She was self-taught and had an amazing mind," Ronald Amemiya said of his mother, who had only three or four years of formal schooling. Henry Ayau, a famed sportsman and businessman known for his excellence in water sports like canoe paddling and diving, died at the Straub Clinic and Hospital, this morning Wednesday May 5, 2002, a spokeswoman at the hospital and friends said. He was 60. Ayau, who only learned to board surf after moving to Oahu, was actively involved in canoe paddling, diving, spearfishing and surfing. In 1983, he was awarded the Winged O by the Outrigger Canoe Club for service to the club's athletic program. The honor was first conferred upon Duke Kahanamoku in 1966. Ayau and Kahanamoku became friends in the latter years of Kahanamoku's life. Ayau was general manager of Duke's night club in Waikiki and later an executive vice president for the legendary surfer's complex, which included Diamond Head Restaurant, Surf Development, Inc., and Duke Kahanamoku Corp. In 1971, he was appointed executive vice president of the annual Duke Kahanamoku Hawaiian Surfing Classic. Adam Suapaia, general manager of Don Ho's Island Grill at Aloha Tower, said he will always remember Ayau for his easygoing demeanor. Suapaia said Ayau hired him more than 36 years ago as a doorman at Duke's night club in Waikiki. Most recently, Ayau

was head of the host department at Don Ho's Island Grill, where he had previously been vice president and general manager. "I guess that's what you call a full circle," Suapaia said. "It's a tremendous loss. There's nobody like him." Added David Nagaishi, the former general manager at Don Ho's: "He was our ambassador of Aloha." A past-president of the Molokai Chamber of Commerce, Ayau enjoyed success in business, real estate and the entertainment industry. He appeared in commercials and advertisements, including a national campaign for American Airlines. Ayau was found Wednesday, floating lifeless in waters off the Elks Club on Kalakaua Avenue in Waikiki. A surfer discovered Ayau in the water wearing a snorkel and fin, said Dan De Fries, a firefighter at the Wailupe Fire Station. Raised in Pukoo on Molokai, Ayau caught the attention of Punahou School after pitching a successful baseball game against an Oahu team. The 1959 Punahou grad lettered in baseball, and was named No. 1 hitter. He also captained the basketball team during his senior year. He played football until he suffered a leg injury during his sophomore year. He was named Athlete of the Year in 1958-1959, as well as an outstanding scholar. Ayau attended Oregon State University and the University of Hawaii. He was born in Ho'olehua, Molokai. He is survived by sons Patrick, Bruce and David; daughters Kathy Rohrbacher and Leslie Holland; mother Mabel; brothers Ronnie and Burelle "Butch"; sisters Dana Ayau and Lana Alamillo; and six grandchildren.
