Charlotte McLean Cades, a ballet and modern dancer and longtime supporter of the arts in Hawaii, died at her Oahu home last Friday Feb 14, 2002. She was 96. Cades' son, University of Hawaii professor Ian McLean Cooke, said they had been "a very close-knit couple all their lives," and, until a few weeks ago, enjoyed good mental and physical health. In her autobiography, written in 1988 about her marriage to Cades, she said, "My life had found a plateau of happiness, serenity and growth based on a companionship with matched enthusiasms, especially for the various arts -- literary, visual, and musical, which has never stopped growing, which is fed by all our experiences." She was born in San Francisco, but her family moved to Honolulu days before the great earthquake of 1906. She graduated from Punahou School in 1924 and attended the University of Hawaii until 1926 when she married her first husband, Douglas A. Cooke, a plant physiologist. After a short time in Europe, she returned to Honolulu in 1930 and supervised the design and building of a residence on Makiki Heights Drive that was later to become the

residence of the late Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos, according to Cades' son. In 1938 she married Cade -- a prominent attorney with the law firm now called Cades Schutte Fleming & Wright. She and her husband maintained horses and rode at their Palehua mountain retreat above Makakilo until both were approaching 90, Cooke said. She served on the Citizens Advisory Board of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts. With the founding of the Contemporary Museum, she joined the core of docents in 1988 where she escorted visitors until 1997. Cades is also survived by son Russell McLean Cades and five grandchildren. Julius Russell Cades, former partner of the law firm Cades Schutte Fleming & Wright and one of the most influential attorneys in Hawai'i, died Saturday Feb 9, 2002 at his Tantalus home. He was 97. Cades graduated at the top of his class at the University of Pennsylvania in 1928. A year later he moved to Hawai'i and joined the firm Smith & Wild. Specializing in corporate and tax law, Cades made an immediate impact in Hawai'i. During World War II he represented hundreds of firms that did business with the U.S. Army and Army Corps of Engineers. "He is probably as responsible as anyone for the development of the law here in the state of Hawai'i through the '40s, '50s, '60s and even the '70s," said attorney Jeff Portnoy, a member of the Cades firm. "There's only a handful of people who have been prominent in the Hawai'i legal establishment in the last century, and he's certainly in the top of that group." E. Gunner Schull, who joined the firm in 1964 as a young attorney and is now a senior partner, said Cades had built up an impressive list of corporate clients by the time the war ended, and was acknowledged as the top attorney in town. "He was just a very generous person and a delight to work for, and a perfect gentleman in all respects, in addition to having a very keen legal mind," Schull said. "His influence on a lot of the members of the firm who are my age was pervasive." Cades was born in Philadelphia on Oct. 30, 1904. He received his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1928 and served a fellowship in corporation law before coming to Hawai'i. He planned to join a New York law firm, but was talked into giving the Islands a one-year tryout by attorney Urban Wild. That year did not end until his death last weekend. "When he stopped coming to the office (18 months ago), the office went to him," Schull said. "He maintained an interest in the firm literally until the time of his death." Law was not

Cades' only interest. He also was an accomplished musician, playing the viola and violin with the Honolulu Symphony for more than 30 years. He also led the fight to build what is now the Blaisdell Concert Hall. Cades served on the boards of many Hawai'i companies, including Amfac, Hawaiian Life Insurance and Universal Motors, and was a member of the University of Hawai'i Board of Regents, director of the Honolulu Art Society, trustee of the Honolulu Academy of Arts, and director of the Contemporary Art Center. In 1978 Gov. George Ariyoshi presented him with the Order of Distinction for Cultural Leadership Portnoy, who specializes in First Amendment law, credited Cades with leading him in that direction. "He was a true civil libertarian — believed in free speech and free press and fought for it for decades," Portnoy said. "Russell's knowledge of the Constitution was without peer in the state of Hawai'i." Cades is survived by his wife, Charlotte; son, Russell McLean; brother, Daniel; and sisters Zelda David, Libby Levenson and Lillian Waldman. Services are pending. The Rev. Eli Carter, the associate pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help church in 'Ewa Beach who was the driving force behind a homeless and hungry outreach ministry at St. Rita church, died Monday while on vacation in Texas with parishioners. He was 52. In the early 1990s, Carter used to walk the Nanakuli shoreline, looking for families to partake of the free meals served at regular intervals at the neighborhood church, said his former secretary, Essey Ho Carter, who was born in Hawai'i on Jan. 29, 1950, was the first man to be ordained a priest from St. Benedict church, the so-called "Painted Church" on the Big Island. He had been ill for a long time, suffering like the rest of his siblings from diabetes, said his sister, Sonja Lee Kalili of Honaunau on the Big Island.

He was in full cardiac arrest by the time the ambulance arrived at Wilford Hall Medical Center on Lackland Air Force Base, according to a spokesman for the medical examiner there, who said the cause of death was heart disease. "We've all lost a very dear and much beloved priest," Bishop Francis X. DiLorenzo said. "He was one of our few priests of Native Hawaiian background. He had a gentle, kindly way." Carter had been a priest for 27 years. He was a charismatic Catholic priest, which means he held healing services, and he also headed a prayer group at Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Carter was the son of Pauline L. Carter and the late Eli Carter of Honaunau. He entered St. Stephen's seminary, then received his bachelor's degree in sociology from Chaminade College. He earned a master's degree of divinity at St. Patrick Seminary in Menlo Park, Calif. Carter was ordained a deacon in 1974 and served at St. Rita church. He was associate pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in 1975-81. His next assignment was as associate pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes at Honoka'a and, after that, associate at St. John the Apostle and Evangelist, Mililani. He was a pastor at St. Rita and later at Immaculate Conception, 'Ewa, as well as Sacred Heart, Wai'anae. He had served at Our Lady of Perpetual Help since August. The Rev. Gary Secor, vicar for clergy at the Diocese of Honolulu,

who went to college with Carter, described him as a "very good priest ... (with a) very gentle strength which came from his Hawaiian heritage." In addition to Kalili and his mother, Carter is survived by his other sisters, Barbara Jane Parish of Honaunau, Jennifer Friels of Kailua, Kona, and Janice Omori of Captain Cook. Daniel H. Case - Since his middle school days at Punahou, Daniel H. Case's curiosity and a thirst for adventure pushed and pulled him from one entrepreneurial venture to the next until he found the perfect match in California's high-flying technology sector. Case, chairman of J.P. Morgan Chase's JPMorgan H&Q division, played a key role in forging Wall Street's fascination with young Internet companies in the late 1990s and was one of its best-known investment bankers. He died Wednesday morning at his home in the Bay Area among his friends and family after a yearlong battle with brain cancer. He was 44. Case was just 34 when, in 1992, he became chief executive officer of the fabled San Francisco-based technology investment bank, Hambrecht & Quist, and presided over some of the Internet economy's most efflorescent IPOs, including Netscape and Amazon .com. Born in Honolulu, the Rhodes scholar graduated from Punahou School and earned a bachelor's degree in economics from Princeton University. When William Hambrecht, co-founder of Hambrecht & Quist, asked faculty at

Princeton to recommend the school's "smartest student" for a summer internship, they sent him Case. Case worked his way through Hambrecht & Quist's corporate finance, venture capital and mergers and acquisitions departments before becoming co-chief executive in 1992 and sole chief executive in 1994. He was named chairman in 1998. In 1999, two years after an aborted attempt to sell Hambrecht & Quist to Merrill Lynch & Co., Case sold the 31-year-old firm to Chase Manhattan Corp., now called J.P. Morgan Chase, for \$1.2 billion. While struggling with cancer, Case created a foundation called Accelerating a Brain Cancer Cure, with his brother Steve Case, chairman of AOL Time Warner, and their wives. Case is survived by his wife, Stacey Black Case, and his four children, Alexander, Winston, John Daniel and Charlotte. In addition, he leaves his parents, Dan and Carol Case, his brothers Steve and Jeff, and his sister, Carin. Funeral services will be held at Grace Cathedral in San Francisco July 2 at 3:30 p.m. The family has asked that any gifts in Case's honor be made to ABC2. Kirk H. Cashmere, a prominent civil rights lawyer who fought for the rights of minorities and challenged Hawai'i's ban on same-sex marriages, died yesterday Dec 2, 2002 after a long illness. He was 47. Cashmere was born on July 18, 1955, in Milwaukee, Wis. His family moved to Hawai'i when he was 5, and he attended Iolani School. After earning his law degree from the University of Hawai'i William S. Richardson School of Law, he began his career as a civil rights attorney. Cashmere served as legal director for the American Civil Liberties Union. He also worked with the Legal Aid Society of Hawai'i, the Life Foundation and was a member of the State Ethics Commission. He had been in private practice since 1993. Throughout his career, Cashmere took on controversial issues, including a challenge to the state's Good Friday holiday. In 1996, he and two other lawyers represented three same-sex couples who sought legal marriages in Hawai'i. Hawai'i Intermediate Court of Appeals Judge Dan Foley worked with Cashmere on the same-sex marriage case. Foley, who preceded Cashmere as ACLU legal director, said Cashmere dedicated his legal career to civil rights. "He was very committed, very single-minded to the task at hand and a very

passionate advocate for the causes that he took, whether it was the separation of church and state, gay rights, privacy issues related to HIV and AIDS," Foley said. "There haven't been that many civil rights attorneys in Hawai'i at one time, and he was one of the few that stood out." Foley said Cashmere fought for legislation dealing with AIDS and privacy when the disease was first making headlines in the 1980s. Longtime friend Trudy Schandler-Wong said Cashmere "wanted to help everyone, and nothing seemed to be too small. "His grandparents were immigrants from Europe, and they really shared with him a love for this country and a love for justice, for doing the right thing. I think that probably drove him," Schandler-Wong said. In addition to his legal work, Cashmere was active in the Jewish community. He wrote a treatise on the history of Jews in Hawai'i dating from 1840, and in 1975 he conducted the first High Holy Day service on the Big Island to what would become the Kona Beth Shalom. Cashmere is survived by his mother, Eileen; brother, Randy; and half sister Chantelle Goldstein. Graveside services will be held at 2 p.m. today at Mililani Memorial Park. A memorial service is set for 2 p.m. Sunday at Temple Emanu-El, 2550 Pali Highway. Kirk H. Cashmere, a civil-rights attorney who helped make same-sex marriage a major issue in Hawaii, died Dec. 2, 2002. He was 47. He was of three attorneys who represented three same-sex couples who wanted to be legally married in Hawaii. In 1996, then-Circuit Judge Kevin Chang ruled that the state failed to show any compelling reason to ban same-sex marriages. That led to a hotly debated 1998 constitutional amendment giving the Legislature power to limit marriage to people of the opposite gender. A friend of 26 years, Trudie Schandler-Wong, said "civil rights was his main mission." "He took upon himself any group that was not being treated equally or fairly," Schandler-Wong said. Cashmere was the American Civil Liberties Union's attorney in a challenge to the state's Good Friday holiday contending it violated the principle of separation of church and state, but a federal judge rejected the case in 1987. Nancy Kern, the HIV/STD Prevention Coordinator under the state Department of Health, said Cashmere "worked truly selflessly to advocate for people not recognized or were discriminated against." "He was always there for the underdog. He was so well-respected in the community for so many different reasons. He worked so hard to bring people together. He was honest and forthright. ... His loss is huge to our state," Kern said. Kern was on the Governor's Committee on

HIV/AIDS with Cashmere in the late 1980s and early '90s. He was instrumental in drafting policy on "confidentiality and informed consent," among other rights of HIV/AIDS victims, and "made sure these compassionate and protective laws were passed," Kern said. David Brustein, an attorney and personal friend for 17 years, said Cashmere was an "absolutely brilliant, brilliant attorney" and a "very religious, spiritual person; a good-hearted soul." Cashmere took on the controversial gay rights cases because "no one else was doing it." "It was new at the time ... and he was not afraid of tough issues," Brustein said. Schandler-Wong said Cashmere observed every Jewish holiday and flew special religious items in from the mainland. Every holiday was "more joyous and complete with him there. ... We knew the wheres and the whys" of a holiday because of him. "He was a perfectionist, and it carried over to his legal work," she added. "Kirk held himself to the highest of standards, but he brought his friends all along with it." Born in Wisconsin, Cashmere's family moved to Hawaii when he was 5. He attended Iolani School and graduated from Brandeis University in Waltham, Mass., where he majored in Near Eastern and Judaic Studies. Cashmere earned his law degree from the University of Hawaii's William S. Richardson School of Law. He served as legal director for the ACLU, and worked with the Legal Aid Society of Hawaii and the Life Foundation. He was a member of the state Ethics Commission. Cashmere is survived by mother Eileen, brother Randy and half-sister Chantelle Goldstein. Graveside services were held yesterday. Sau Ung Loo Chan, the first female lawyer of Asian ancestry in Hawai'i and an advocate for the underprivileged, died March 1. She was 95. Born Aug. 8, 1906, in Ho-nolulu she was the last of six children born to Joe and Choy Shee Loo. Her father emigrated from China and counted among his friends Sun Yat Sen, who led the overthrow of the last Chinese emperor in 1911. Chan graduated from Punahou School and received her law degree from Yale University at age 22. She moved to Hong Kong, married and had a child. During the Chinese-Japanese War, Chan worked as an assistant legal counsel for William Hunt & Co. in Hong Kong. In 1940 she returned to Honolulu and passed the Territory of Hawai'i's bar examination to become the first Asian female lawyer in the Islands. In 1943 she organized the Circuit Court Small Estate and Guardianship Division, which she managed until her retirement in 1976. Throughout her career, Chan fought for the

rights of the less privileged. Her testimony in 1948 before Congress helped amend unfair aspects of the Immigration Act of 1924. Daughter Janice Parrott said her mother was ahead of her time. "She was a single mother raising a daughter, and she was able to combine a successful career and accomplish raising me," Parrott said. "I think that's something that a lot of women today are still struggling with." In 1994, Chan was recognized by the Hawai'i State Bar Association for her distinguished career along with former Hawai'i Chief Justice William Richardson, U.S. District Judge Martin Pence and influential attorney J. Russell Cades. A year later, she was honored by the United Chinese Society as Model Chinese Mother of the year. Richard Parrott said his grandmother was a pioneer and supportive of him. A journalist, he is seeking a masters degree in film and video production at the University of Southern California. "She did touch many lives," he said. "She used her law for humanitarian reasons and to fight prejudice and economic injustices. That was her special mission in life." Chan is also survived by stepsons Robert and Tim Ching. Yun Tau Chee, the first Miss Hawai'i in 1948 who broke the color barrier at the Miss America pageant, died Feb. 21 in Kailua. She was 73. Chee, a retired public school teacher, was born Yun Tau Zane in Kohala, on the Big Island, on March 27, 1928, the fourth of eight children. She graduated from Kohala High School and moved to O'ahu to attend the University of Hawai'i, where she majored in home economics. As a 20-year-old college junior, she entered the first Miss Hawai'i pageant, primarily to earn scholarship money.

She finished second in the contest at the 49th State Fair at Kapi'olani Park. But she was declared Miss Hawai'i after the winner disqualified herself because she had not met eligibility requirements. Hawai'i had never before sent a representative to the Miss America pageant because "only girls of Caucasian races previously were admitted," according to newspaper accounts. Chee was the first Asian contestant, and with Irma Nydia Vasquez from Puerto Rico, the first non-Caucasians to participate in the Miss America pageant. Chee said she was "in awe" when she arrived in Atlantic City. Under the tutelage of Winona Beamer, she performed hula for the talent contest. Chee was named Miss Congeniality and won a \$1,000 scholarship, which she used to attend the University of Wisconsin, where she earned her fifth-year teaching certificate. She married Hon Ting Chee and had four sons. She taught kindergarten for 31 years and retired from Ma'ema'e School in 1986. David Childs, small-town crusader, unabashed liberal and irascible contributor to The Advertiser's letters-to-the-editor section, died of cancer Tuesday Dec 10, 2002 at his home in Ma'ili. He was 59. In the mid-1970s Childs was elected mayor of his hometown of Shenandoah, Iowa, by the largest majority in the town's history. He was defeated in the following election by the same margin. As mayor, Childs gained national attention for his crusade to expose the difficulties faced by America's small towns. Childs formed the National Rural Communities Mayor's Conference, a maverick mail-order coalition with representation from every state. He drove his car to little towns from coast to coast, including a famous trip to Plains, Ga. His travels were followed by The Associated Press and all three major television networks. In Plains, he vowed to sit on Jimmy Carter's doorstep until the president-elect promised to befriend little towns, which Carter did. Childs "always understood that the little guy was really the big guy," said his friend, author Will Campbell of Mount Juliet, Tenn., who became acquainted with Childs during his small-town crusade. A frequent annual visitor to Hawai'i since the 1980s, Childs moved with his family to Ma'ili in 2000. Never shy about expressing an unpopular opinion, Childs wrote letters to the editor favoring legalized gambling, claiming that pidgin holds back local students, and describing those who oppose cockfighting as hypocrites. His provocative stances, he once explained, were a means of getting others to consider alternative sides of an issue. "Generally, when I write these letters I

assume a certain intelligence in the reader," he said. "Editorial page readers are usually educated." Shortly before his death, he worked as a substitute teacher at Wai'anae High School. Childs is survived by his wife, Patricia; sons, Bill, Randy and Cody; brothers, Steven and Michael; and sister, Susan Hagemann. Hung Wai Ching, retired real estate developer, prominent Chinese community leader, former YMCA administrator and former University of Hawai'i regent, died Feb. 9, 2002 at St. Francis Medical Center Liliha. Ching, who lived in Honolulu, was 96 years old. In 1928, he received his bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Hawai'i. In 1989, UH awarded Ching, who had argued against the imprisonment of Hawai'i's Japanese community during World War II, an honorary degree. Hung Wai Ching - In his 96 years, businessman Hung Wai Ching, along with his brother Hung Wo Ching, helped found Aloha Airlines. He was also a University of Hawaii regent and held directorships with Liberty Bank, Pacific Insurance Co. and Pacific Management Co. and was a general partner in Pacific Land Hui and Oahu Homes. But Ching's greatest contribution was "his outspoken affirmation of the loyalty" of Japanese Americans during World War II, says Ted Tsukiyama, veteran and historian of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team. Ching died of cancer Saturday Feb 16, 2002 at St. Francis Medical Center. Tsukiyama, who will deliver a eulogy tomorrow at his funeral, said Ching "grew up in the slums" around the Nuuanu YMCA as one of six children born of Chinese immigrants. He went to school and played with people of different races and ran programs at

the YMCA in his neighborhood. "(This) accounts for his position. He needed no convincing whether these guys (the Japanese) were loyal Americans or not," Tsukiyama said. "Who knows if we would've had a 442nd if it wasn't for all the things Hung Wai did." Ching was known as the "father of the Varsity Victory Volunteers," a group of UH ROTC students who were discharged from the Hawaii Territorial Guard in 1942 because they were Japanese, an event that sowed the seeds for the formation of the 442nd. Ching was appointed to the Council on Interracial Unity's Morale Division, a liaison group of civilians and the military, and used his position to prevent the detention of Japanese in Hawaii or have them released, Tsukiyama said. He persuaded Army intelligence not to fill its daily quota of indiscriminate arrests, he added. Ching also worked tirelessly for their orderly return to civilian life after the war, Tsukiyama said. That is why Ching was one of the first to become an honorary member of the 442nd Veterans Club, he added. Eddie Yamasaki, a 442nd veteran who is collecting memoirs for a book to be released, said, "He made a difference in how the military and the FBI looked at us." Ching graduated in 1924 from McKinley High School. Among his classmates was the former Elsie Tong, whom he married in 1934. He graduated from UH in 1928 with a degree in civil engineering and earned a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary and a master's degree from Yale Divinity School in 1932. Soon after becoming a real estate broker in 1945, Ching helped found Aloha Airlines, serving as a director for 25 years. He was on the board while his brother, Hung Wo Ching, was board chairman, and was elected a director emeritus when he retired from it in 1971 at age 65. Ching was president of the advisory board of St. Francis Hospital and held trusteeships with Honolulu Academy of Arts, Leahi Hospital, Hawaii Veterans Memorial Fund, United Church of Christ Foundation and the University of Hawaii Foundation. He was a member of the board of governors of McNerny, the Hawaii apparel chain, and president of Hawaii Motors. He is survived by wife Elsie, sons King Lit and Sai Lit, daughter Su Sun, sister Bessie Loo and nine grandchildren. Hing Hua Chun was anything but "hunky." But the local medical leader and father to Hawaii's own version of the "Brady Bunch" kept the nickname, even after he quit smoking in the '60s, lost a few extra pounds in the '70s and ran the Honolulu Marathon 25 years in a row. Chun, wife Connie and their six children -- Chun's three boys and Connie's three girls -- were deemed the "Hunky Bunch" in the '70s when the family set out together to run the Honolulu Marathon and then the Boston Marathon. Chun died of lung cancer Wednesday June 12, 2002 at Queen's Medical Center. He was 70. "There are so many people he touched, (and) I thought he'd beat it (cancer)," said Chun's oldest son, Jerold, a senior director at the pharmaceutical company Merck Inc. "You just don't come by this kind of guy anymore. I can say this with absolute certainty. ... He really lived to be the best physician that he could be." Chun and Connie, his second wife, married in 1970. Four years later, the family's eight members were sporting "Hunky Bunch" sweatshirts while running the nearly 30-mile Boston Marathon. Chun told the Associated Press after the race: "It was a once-in-a-lifetime thing. ... If the kids can't get a wedding reception ... remember, blame it on the Boston Marathon." For Chun, the chief of medicine at St. Francis Medical Center for 13 years and associate professor at the University of Hawaii's John A. Burns School of Medicine, marathon running was more than a hobby. It was a way to fuse two families into one, Jerold Chun said. "He was looking for activities to kind of get us together. It was a challenge that my dad saw for us. He decided that this was something he wanted to do." At the peak of their running days, the family collectively ran more than 25,000 miles and wore out 24 pairs of tennis shoes in one year. But it was Chun's philanthropy that Jerold Chun will most remember his father by. Up until only months before his death, Chun was making house calls for his senior patients and making his rounds at nursing homes around the island. "He was a doctor's doctor," and he prompted his three sons to pursue his profession, Jerold Chun said. Chun graduated from Roosevelt High School

in 1948, the University of Hawaii in 1952 and Northwestern Medical School in 1956. He is survived by wife Connie; sons Jerold, Daven and Hingson; daughters Maylyne Gill, June Beltran and Joy Groody; brother Ping Son; and 10 grandchildren. Kam Fong Chun, known to millions of TV viewers as the stalwart Detective Chin Ho Kelly on "Hawai'i Five-0," has died, his family announced yesterday. He was 84. Chun died Oct. 18, 2002 after a long battle with inoperable lung cancer, according to a written statement released by his son Dennis Chun. He was born in May 1918 in Kalihi and lived for many years in Hawai'i Kai. Family members did not announce his passing earlier because they wanted some private time after having shared him with the public for so many years. He was buried at Diamond Head Memorial Park, across the street from the old "Five-0" sound stage. "Like his character, our father faced his last battle with courage, determination and a deep faith in God," the statement read. Chun was surrounded by family members when he died. His wife of 54 years, Gladys, recently preceded him in death, the statement said. "There is no need to feel sorry either for us or our dad," the statement read. "He had a good and long life." The statement said Chun could never understand how "a poor barefoot boy from Kalihi" could wind up on a Hollywood sound stage. When he appeared on "Five-0," Chun adopted the stage name Kam Fong. He appeared on the successful CBS crime drama from its premiere in 1968 until 1978 as a stocky, streetwise detective who was part of the elite state police unit run by Steve McGarrett, played by Jack Lord. "In his last show, when the character Chin Ho Kelly was killed while on an undercover mission, he looked at death and declared that 'It was all worth it,' " the family statement said. "We think those words sum up our father's life. It was a life that was worth it. It was a life that mattered." Chun was one of the last surviving members of the regular "Five-0" cast. Lord died in 1998. James MacArthur, who played "Five-0" Detective Danny Williams, said he spoke to Chun only two weeks ago. "His voice sounded good; I told him so and he told me 'I may sound great, but I

don't think I have much time," MacArthur said from his home in Palm Springs, Calif. "He confessed to me that the voice was the only thing working well." MacArthur said he believed he was the closest cast member to Chun and that they always tried to get together when he was in Hawai'i. "I remember him as a gentleman of great dignity; Kam and I had a bond, maybe because he was a little older, maybe because he took to my young son and told him 'I'm your Chinese grandfather,'" MacArthur said. "He was a man of great respect, of great class. He said he wanted to go quietly, which is pretty much the way he was in life. A man with great sensitivity." Before finding success as a character actor in the 1960s, Chun struggled through years of adversity and was confronted by overwhelming personal tragedies. On June 8, 1944, Chun's first wife, Esther, and his two young children, 4-year-old Marilyn, and 2-year-old son, Donald, were killed when two B-24 bombers collided and crashed over Kalihi. The flaming debris rained down on the neighborhood and killed 12 people. "My father had to carry his daughter from the house," Dennis Chun said. "As a young child, he also saw his older brother burn to death in front of him. They were painting the house and someone lit a match. My father had to take care of his mother, and four brothers and sisters after his brother died." Years later, Kam Fong Chun said he was so despondent after the deaths of his wife and family that he began drinking heavily and that at one point he put a gun to his head and tried to kill himself. He said his mother walked in and begged him not to do it. He was so ashamed he never tried again. "All the adversity in his life made him sensitive to people," Dennis Chun said. "He displayed tremendous confidence throughout his life. Even with the cancer, he fought it head-on." A 1938 graduate of McKinley High, Chun was a member of the Tigers' 1937 football team and president of the school's drama club. "He loved performing, even at a young age," Dennis Chun said. In the 1950s, Chun served as a real-life police officer, working for 16 years with the Honolulu Police Department. After he quit in 1959, he ran a real estate business and a talent agency and appeared in local theater and Hollywood movies, including "Gidget Goes Hawaiian" and "Diamond Head" with Charlton Heston. Before joining "Five-0," Chun was considered one of Honolulu's best-known character actors. Chun said he decided to leave "Five-0" because the scripts had grown "static" and followed a predictable pattern. He went on to make several guest appearances on "Magnum, P.I." in the 1980s. In a 1998 interview about remakes of old TV shows, Chun said there was nothing like the original. "When you have a show that runs successfully and you try to duplicate it, people who watched the earlier version can't help but associate the current cast with the former one," he said. "If they did 'Five-0'

again, everybody would compare Jack Lord with the new guy. It's never the same. The original is always better than the remake." "When (my brother) left to go to graduate school, someone needed to tend the bees, and he told him, 'You know that if you harvest the honey, it's \$18 a gallon' — and that sort of got him interested," Douglas Chun said. Lee Ong Chun remained active in the association for 20 years and performed honeybee demonstrations in schools and at the Hawai'i State Fair. When police and fire received calls about swarms of bees, they often would call on the beekeepers for help. William Clarke - Hawaiian fashion promoter and newspaper columnist Walter Clarke, whose business card once read "Royal Hawaiian Beach, 3rd umbrella from the left," died in Palm Springs, Calif. Tuesday. He was 89. Clarke owned dozens of Waltah Clarke's Hawaiian Shops selling aloha wear, stretching from Beverly Hills to Florida, with one of the original stores at Ala Moana Center. He began his longtime love affair with Hawai'i after moving here fresh out of college in 1938. He made friends with the beachboys fronting the Royal Hawaiian and gathered information from them for his syndicated column called "Hawaiian Holidays" about the comings and goings of the rich and famous for the Chicago Tribune, Los Angeles Times and San Francisco Chronicle. "He absolutely loved Hawai'i and taught all of his children to love Hawai'i too," said Walter Jr. "What a nut he was. He drank and partied all night with the beachboys." It was the beachboys who mispronounced his name as "Waltah," and gave him the nickname that stuck with him the rest of his life. He met his future wife Gretchen at the Royal Hawaiian while she was here with her prominent Chicago family, who were trying to cure her of a crush on a suitor of whom the family did not approve. Clarke used his connection with the hotel's social hostess to get an introduction. "Dad took her out to Diamond Head the first night and tried to kiss her," Walter Jr. said. "She looked up and there was a sign that said 'You're in Hawai'i, have fun,' so she thought 'What the hell, I'll kiss him on the first date.' It was love at first sight. She even mailed the ring back to the boy she was engaged to." The couple moved to Palm Springs, Calif., and, with a \$3,000 loan from his father, opened their first Hawaiian clothing shop in 1952. The company grew quickly, and at one time had stores across the country and on all the major Hawaiian islands. Tim McCullough, president and CEO of Reyn's clothing store, met the couple on Catalina Island off Los Angeles, where they had a store in the 1960s, and described their taste in Hawaiian wear as kitschy "lu'au connoisseurs." "He was a very sharp business man," McCullough said. "He knew what

statement he wanted to carry in his stores. He was extremely important in taking Hawaiian aloha clothing to the Mainland." In the 1950s, he produced and emceed an album called "A Beachboy Party with Waltah Clarke," which featured Duke Kahanamoku and other beachboys Chick Daniels, Splash, Kalakaua, Steamboat, Panama, Fat and Jimmy singing and playing songs on Waikiki Beach. The album was re-released as a CD in 1999 on Taboo Records and is available at local record stores. The couple ran their clothing stores from Palm Springs; Gretchen designing the fashions and her husband handling the promotions. Clarke wrote much of his own ad copy using pidgin sayings like "No poo poo da muu muu, it might be your wife inside." "English teachers have told me I was setting language back 20 years," Clarke told The Advertiser in 1972. He went on to co-found the Pidgin English Hall of Fame. Clarke visited the Islands regularly, bring his entire family to Hawai'i every summer to stay at the Royal Hawaiian, teaching the children to swim, surf and fish with the beachboys, Walter Jr. said. Clarke will be buried May 14 in Palm Springs — wearing, of course, an aloha shirt and shorts. "If you put him in anything else, he will roll over in his grave," Walter Jr. said. Richard Cleveland, an Olympic swimmer who helped revolutionize training methods in the sport, died Saturday July 27, 2002 in Kona. He was 72. A protege of legendary coach Soichi Sakamoto, Cleveland set eight

world and 13 American records, and represented the United States at the 1952 Helsinki Olympics. He, along with Ford Konno and other Hawai'i swimmers, helped make the Ohio State swim team the dominant power of the early 1950s. In 1991, Cleveland was inducted into the International Swimming Hall of Fame. He also is a member of the Hawai'i and Ohio State halls of fame. Cleveland was born in Honolulu and graduated from Punahou School. He was a U.S. Army veteran and retired real estate broker in Maui. But it was his swimming feats that set Cleveland apart. Cleveland used weight training as part of his swimming regimen far before it became fashionable. "Today, power training is a big part of sprint swimming, but (Cleveland) was years, decades, ahead of his time," Bill Wadley, current Ohio State coach, told Advertiser columnist Ferd Lewis in a 1990 article. Cleveland got into weights at the suggestion of an Army buddy who thought Cleveland, then 6 feet and 138 pounds, could benefit from it. In time Cleveland got up to 175 pounds and could bench press 300 pounds. Still, Cleveland recalled that the Ohio State "coach at that time was positively horrified that I was lifting weights. That was something swimmers just didn't do. Some teams trained with pulleys, but that was about it. The thinking was that swimmers should remain loose." Cleveland said that one time after three months of lifting and hardly any time in the water, he "went out and swam the 50 in 22.2 and the world record at the time was 22.1. "Pretty soon some of my teammates were getting real interested." When he went back to Columbus in 1984 for induction into the Ohio State University Sports Hall of Fame, Cleveland said a guide took him on a tour of the swimming team's 5,000-square-foot weight room and said, "Well, see what you started." Cleveland is survived by wife, Pauline of Kailua, Kona, and a sister, Ann Richards of Maine. A private service will be held. J. William "Bill" Cook loved Hawaiian music. In his 30-year connection to the islands, he amassed a collection of more than 6,000 Hawaiian music recordings on everything from Thomas Alva Edison cylinders to LPs and CDs. And he listened to them all the time, said his daughter Janice Arai, 56, of Seattle. Cook, 89, a resident of Virginia who owned a condominium on Oahu and spent his winters here, died May 15, 2002 of Alzheimer's Disease at Washington, D.C.'s Inova Fairfax Hospital. He was a former director of the Division of Pesticide, Chemistry and Toxicology at the Food and Drug Administration. "He wanted to play ukulele in college, but he never did," Arai said. "(But) from the time that he and my mother first came to Hawaii, he fell in love with Hawaiian music." Cook, a chemist, began working for the FDA as a food inspector in 1940 and "worked his way up," said his daughter Charlotte LaRoy of Midlothian, Va. He retired in 1972. In 1990, Cook donated more than 1,200 of his Hawaiian music recordings to the University of Hawaii-Manoa's Hamilton Library music collection. Cook's other passion, and what drew him to Hawaii, was travel, Arai said. In the late 1960s, Cook got unheard-of permission to travel to Cuba with his first wife, Chloe Cook, to oversee a health program there. The two also visited Cambodia during a brief lull in the Vietnam War. But it was Hawaii, not any of the usual retirement states, Arai said, that calmed his wife's acute arthritis and gave Cook his favorite haunts: the island's botanical gardens, Aloha Stadium's flea market and Columbia Inn. "He was very much what I consider the aloha spirit. (He would) do different things that were not on your tourist map." Cook was born in Erie, Colo. He received his bachelor's degree in chemistry from Oregon State University and a master's degree in chemistry from Washington State University. For his research with the FDA, Cook received the Department of Health, Education and Welfare Distinguished Service Award. His ashes will be scattered in waters off Honolulu in July, as his first wife's ashes were. Chloe Cook, to whom he was married for 42 years, died in 1979. His second wife, of 18 years, Margaret Cook, died in 2001. Cook is survived by his four children, three stepchildren, five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. In lieu of

Irving Marmer Copi, retired University of Hawaii philosophy professor who was world-renowned for his textbooks on logic and early work on computer developments, died Aug. 19, 2002 at his Honolulu home. He was 85. "He was a towering figure in the history of 20th-century philosophy," said Kenneth Kipnis, UH professor of philosophy. "Irving was blessed with both a powerful mind and enormous clarity." A UH professor from 1969 to 1990 when he retired because of ill health, Copi wrote the most widely used textbook in America on logic. Titled "Introduction to Logic," it was translated into many languages, including Hebrew, Kipnis said. "And he wrote new editions every few years, which killed the used-book market. I doubt that any philosopher since (Bertrand) Russell, and maybe not even Russell, has sold more books than Irving Copi." Kipnis also thinks of Copi as "laying the groundwork for the upsurge of computers in America." Thomas Jackson, associate specialist in the UH philosophy department, said Copi "was at the cutting edge of the computer age, explaining theoretically what this whole thing was about and laying the foundation for what happened to our world." Bertrand Russell, Copi's teacher at the University of Chicago, said in his autobiography that Copi (whose last name originally was Copilowish) was one of his most impressive students. Copi was educated in mathematics and philosophy and devoted his life to study, teaching, writing and research. His bibliography includes 160 books and articles, with works translated into 10 languages. "(Copi) confessed to me at one time he thought of himself as an aspiring metaphysician -- one who explores the nature of reality and human existence in the very broadest terms," said Eliot Deutsch, UH philosophy department chairman. Copi had great integrity and wry humor, Deutsch said, recalling when a student asked Copi what to expect on a logic exam. Copi told him to ask the secretary to look at some recent exams. The student complained to Copi after the exam

that the questions hadn't changed, Deutsch said, and Copi replied, "Yes, but we changed the answers." Growing up with such a brilliant father had its challenges, said Copi's daughter, Margaret, a Honolulu psychiatrist. "He would demand that we support our assertions," she said. He would change a decision if reasons were convincing, she said. Former students recalled Copi's unique traits as a teacher at services Aug. 23 at Temple Emanu-el, his daughter said. "He was popular, but ... you had to work very hard in his class and he never succumbed to grade inflation." He won many academic honors during his career, which included teaching at the University of Michigan from 1958 to 1969 and appointments at the University of Illinois, the Air Force Academy, Princeton University and Georgetown University Logic Institute. He was involved with research at the University of Michigan and consulted with the Office of Naval Research. Asked to teach logic at the University of Michigan in the early 1950s, Copi "looked at all the textbooks and none were any good, so he wrote one," Kipnis said. "The publisher told him it was too big, to split in two, and so he did." He said the text was "head and shoulders above anything else out there, which is why people talk about Copi as being, in a sense, the father of logic courses now taught at every university. "As logic courses boomed, philosophy departments hired more logicians, who were doing more publishing, and all of a sudden by the 1960s and 70s there was a huge number of people with background in logic when computers started taking off," Kipnis said. "One of the real pluses for people who know logic, it is an easy translation to artificial languages that make computers work." Copi co-authored several books and produced other writings concerning computer developments, artificial languages and "logical nets." He and his late wife, Amelia, were Jewish community leaders here and in Ann Arbor, Mich. Copi is also survived by sons Thomas of San Francisco, and David and Bill of Ann Arbor; and four grandchildren. Interment was at Mililani Memorial Park. Joseph C. Cravalho - Former Maui police chief Joseph C. Cravalho, 65, died Monday Jan 7, 2002 at his home in Kahului. Cravalho joined the Maui County Police Department in 1959 and was named chief in 1981. He retired seven years later. Police Chief Tom Phillips said Cravalho oversaw the police force during a time of rapid growth in the department and in the community. One big change during his tenure was the department's move from outmoded, overcrowded facilities into modern quarters on Mahalani Street. But if Cravalho was known for anything, it was his professional demeanor and caring, Phillips said. "He was very smart and had a real big heart. I never saw him lose his temper. He was very calm all the time and had a very professional appearance, and I think we all learned from that," he said. "He really cared for his employees, not just on the job but for their families." Following his retirement, Cravalho was branch manager for Wackenhut of Hawai'i from 1991 to 1999. He was involved in the Boy Scouts of America and Boy Builders, and served on the Governor's Committee on Crime. He was born Sept. 11, 1936, in Kula. Maui Police Chief Thomas Phillips said he learned a lot from Cravalho about how to treat people. "He had a big heart. He was nice to people. I never saw him get mad. "He set the tone for the department. I learned a lot from his leadership." Phillips said Cravalho and a number of other ranking officers held softball games in the mid-1970s and got to know the new recruits and their families. "They made me feel welcome. It was nice," he said. Cravalho selected Phillips to head the Vice Division even though other sergeants had seniority. "He gave me my start," Phillips said. Cravalho served more than 28 years in the Police Department and was selected as deputy chief by Chief John San Diego in 1976. He was appointed police chief in 1981, becoming the first Maui police officer in modern history to be selected for the top post from within the department. Before Cravalho, several Maui police chiefs had been selected after serving with the Honolulu Police Department. Cravalho is survived by wife Germaine, two sons and three daughters.
