Leabert Roberts Fernandez, 91, of Kailua, one of the first plastic surgeons in Hawaii, died Wednesday May 29, 2002 at Ann Pearl Nursing Facility in Kaneohe. Fernandez was born May 14, 1911, in Honolulu to Edward K.

"E.K." Fernandez and Lydia Roberts Fernandez. Fernandez' father founded E.K. Fernandez Shows, the Hawaii entertainment dynasty which was continued by his half brother, Kane S. Fernandez, who died in 2001. Before becoming a plastic surgeon, Fernandez was a plantation doctor on the Big Island in Laupahoehoe in the 1940s, said his wife, Florence Uda, whom he married in 1967. Fernandez was a Punahou student body president and valedictorian, as well as captain of both the football and baseball teams, said Marsue McShane, his wife from 1946-64, whom he rescued from the Hilo tsunami before they were married. Fernandez worked two years after high school setting up Ferris wheels for his father's shows on neighbor islands before graduating from the University of Utah and Washington University medical school in St. Louis and returning to Hawaii, McShane said. He worked at Aiea Hospital for 30 hours straight treating victims of the 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor, she said. During a decade on the Big Island, Fernandez "delivered more than 1,000 babies, set all the bones, did all the surgeries," McShane said. After a surgery residency at Queen's Medical Center and plastic surgery training in California, he returned to Hawaii in 1956 began his plastic surgery practice. McShane credits Fernandez with inventing an eye surgery "that made Oriental eyes more Western," and said he did a lot of hand surgery and made trips to Guam for years, where he would repair cleft palates and harelips for free. "He was so dedicated. He really gave his life to a lot of people," said his daughter Linda Fernandez, who is a physical therapist. "I meet so many people at my clinic that had known him." One was a woman who as a girl was caught in a pineapple machine and had restorative surgeries by Fernandez. Fernandez retired in 1997 and remained an avid tennis player until 2000, Florence Fernandez said. Kam Fong, best known for years as Chin Ho Kelly on the TV series "Hawaii Five-O," died Oct. 18, 2002 after a long battle with lung cancer, his family announced today. He was 84. Noboru Furuya - In the 1950s, people lined up at Nippon Theatre on Beretania Street to watch "Kimi no Nawa," a love story set during the war. Theater owner Noboru Furuya continued to entertain residents with Japanese films for the next 30 years. Furuya, an entrepreneur in entertainment, cosmetics and broadcasting, died Jan. 30, 2002. He was 82 years old. In the mid-1930s, Furuya's father purchased Park Theatre next to Aala Park as an investment. After serving in the 100th Infantry Battalion, Noboru Furuya reopened the establishment as the Nippon Theatre in October 1948. Sixteen years later, Furuya and his brothers moved the Nippon to Beretania Street at the Palace Theatre. In 1960, Furuya started selling a Japanese cosmetic line

called Shiseido in Hawaii. He later became the president and owner of Shiseido of Hawaii before selling his share of the stock to Shiseido Co. Ltd. While promoting the cosmetic line in the 1960s, Furuya acquired KZOO Radio Station, one of two Japanese-language programs to run seven days a week. The station drew a loyal following, especially from the Japanese elderly. In January 1981, Furuya closed the theater after the number of moviegoers declined. Following his accomplishments as a businessman, Furuya was recognized for strengthening the relationship between Hawaii and Japan when he was awarded the Order of the Rising Sun Imperial Decoration by the government of Japan. Furuya is survived by his wife Mitsuru, son David, daughter Aileen Nagaoka and seven grandchildren. Funeral services will be held 6 p.m. Thursday at Diamond Head Mortuary. Burial will take place at 1 p.m. the following day at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific at Punchbowl.

Noboru Furuya, a veteran of the 100th Infantry Battalion and a businessman who promoted and perpetuated Japanese language and culture in Hawai'i, died Jan. 30, 2002. He was 82. Furuya was the retired owner of the old Nippon Theater, KZOO Japanese language radio station, and Shiseido of Hawai'i. Furuya was born on Aug. 16, 1919, in Honolulu, and at age 3 was sent to Japan to live with his grandparents. At age 19 he returned to Hawai'i and worked as a delivery driver for the family's Asahi Furniture Co. In 1940, he enlisted in the Army and was assigned to the unit that would become the 100th Infantry Battalion. He took part in campaigns in the Pacific and Europe and received several citations and medals. After being discharged from the Army in 1945, Furuya returned home and drove a bus for the old Honolulu Rapid Transit Co. Robyn Furuya said her father-in-law saved most of his earnings as a bus driver to bring his four sisters and two brothers back to Hawai'i from Japan, where they were sent during the war. Furuya entered the business world in 1947 when he took over the family business, A'ala Theater. He later moved the theater to the site of the old Palace Theater at Ke'eaumoku and Beretania Street and renamed it Nippon Theater. Furuya brought in the latest movies from Japan so first-generation Japanese Americans could enjoy movies in their native language. Furuya also brought many famous Japanese movie stars, such as Toshiro Mifune, to the Islands. In 1964, Furuya mortgaged his home so he could bring the Grand Kabuki production from Japan for the opening of the Honolulu International Center Concert Hall, now known as the Blaisdell Concert Hall. In addition to the theater business, Furuya opened the first

international branch of Shiseido cosmetics. He retired as president in 1989. To further serve the Japanese community, Furuya purchased KZOO radio station in 1967. "At a time right after the war, when people were moving away from their cultural heritage, he strongly felt that through his Japan connections with the movie and cosmetic company, that he could help to promote the culture through the radio ownership," Robyn Furuya said. On Nov. 3, 1997, he received the Kunsho Japanese Imperial Decoration, Order of the Rising Sun for his contributions to preserving the Japanese culture in Hawai'i. Furuya is survived by his wife, Mitsuru; son, David; daughter, Aileen Nagaoka; brother, Koji Mizota; and seven grandchildren. Service will be at 6 p.m. Thursday at Diamond Head Mortuary.
