Richard H. "Dick" Hadley, a real estate developer from Seattle who created some of Hawaii's best projects, died Tuesday Mar 19, 2002 in Honolulu. He was 80. Hadley was best known for the Amfac Center, downtown twin towers created in the early 1970s in a joint venture with Amfac Inc. It was one of the first all-steel high-rise complexes in Hawaii. Hadley, remembered by friends as a stickler for detail and quality, even in humble warehouse properties, developed 30 projects from his Pacific Northwest base, many of them in Hawaii. Examples are the Whaler, a luxury condominium on Maui's Kaanapali Beach that was Hawaii's first successful timeshare development, and the Waikiki hotel that is now the Radisson Prince Kuhio. In 1989 his son Robert joined the business, and they created the 717,000-square-foot Airport Industrial Park. While Hadley was a downto-earth developer, he had a romantic side, too, as shown in his 1981 purchase of one of the great passenger liners of all time, the SS United States, launched in 1982 as the fastest trans-Atlantic liner. The ship had gone out of business but was kept in mothballs by the U.S. government, and Hadley planned to spend \$200 million to refurbish it and launch it into worldwide cruising, including regular mainland-Hawaii service. That was just too complicated to pull off, however, and the deal fell through, leaving the ship resting and rusting now in a New Jersey port. Hadley, who was chairman of Pacific Building Corp. and AIPA Properties, was born in Seattle. In World War II he flew C-47s for the Army Air Corps in Europe. After the war he gained a master's degree in structural engineering and a doctorate in business administration at the University of Washington. He joined his father's structural engineering business, where he developed his creativity and engineering ability. He is survived by his wife Barbara, sons Robert and Scott, daughters Lisa Ann and Alisa, sister Eleanor and six grandchildren. Services will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday at the Pacific Club. Jack Hamilton - Jack Hamilton's passion for tennis led him to be a key player in establishing tennis facilities as well as neighborhood parks on Oahu. Hamilton's daughter Sarah Preble said he would constantly watch and play tennis. Once a week, they would play tennis together. "He always won," she said. Hamilton, an active community member, died March 22 at the Pohai Nani Good Samaritan Retirement Community. He was 97. His body was donated to the University of Hawaii medical school. John Leonard Hamilton Jr. was born on Dec. 4, 1904, in Chicago. He worked as an architect at a New York firm called York & Sawyer. From 1942 to 1944, he helped design Tripler Army Medical Center. Hamilton and his wife, Betty, moved in 1966 to Kailua, where he devoted many years as an active volunteer, primarily in parks and recreation programs. Hamilton was a member of the Kailua Community Recreation Council, serving as chairman from 1974 through 1978. Also, he organized and headed the council's tennis committee that proposed designs of tennis courts at the Kailua Recreation Center. Hamilton was instrumental in the establishment of the Kawainui Community Park, Kalama Beach Park and Maunawili Neighborhood Park. He also played a key role in getting a swimming pool built at Kailua District Park. He also was a member of the Honolulu Tennis Advisory Council, where he served as chairman of the Facilities Committee. Aiko Hamura used to sell her saimin noodles and produce from the back of her old black Ford sedan, working the plantation residential camps. She took the back seat out of the car to make room for the goods. "She sold the noodles in balls. People would buy one or two or three — however much they wanted," said her daughter Hazel Hiraoka. When Hamura died Jan. 21 at age 91, she left a business that had grown into a saimin restaurant known to noodle connoisseurs across the state: Hamura Saimin. She and her husband, the late Charles Hamura, who died in 1980, started their little hole-in-the-wall restaurant in 1952. It's on Kress Street, named after the long-

closed Kress Store, a block and a half off Rice Street. "In those days, lucky if they sold five bowls a night," Hiraoka said. "This place is on a back street. Hard to find." But the amazing saimin drew more and more customers, and fame spread. Hamura had learned to make saimin from a friend in Lihu'e and had tinkered with the recipe until she was satisfied. "My mother perfected it to her liking," she said. It is a full-bodied, flavorful treat, dense noodles in a steaming broth, sprinkled with onions and other goodies. Thirty years ago, the restaurant often stayed open until 4 or 5 a.m., catering to the lateworking crowd and drinkers. "People would call my dad and say, 'Don't close. We're bringing a gang,' " and he would keep the place going until they left. Now, the restaurant is open from 9:30 a.m. to 11 p.m. weekdays, and midnight weekends. It's a place where construction workers sit shoulder-toshoulder with politicians and bankers, where the elderly chat with teenagers in neon hair, and where the occasional tourist finds the place and stares with amazement at this local wonder. Over the years, the menu has changed little. Aside from the classic saimin special, there's won ton mein, bbg stick, and the tall lilikoi chiffon pies made by Hiraoka's daughter, Wendy. Patrons come and sit on low stools at low counters, in full view of the kitchen. There have been two major renovations, but Hiraoka says it's still a modest place. Hiraoka's brother Herbert and his wife make the noodles according to his mother's old recipe, six days a week. The restaurant is open seven days a week. Hiraoka herself is getting ready to pass it on. At 74, she still works four hours a day. "Wendy is going to take over," she said, but doesn't say when. The family closed the restaurant Saturday out of respect for the cofounder, but then spent most of the day answering calls from concerned customers who were surprised to find the doors locked. Hamura was born in Pu'unene, Maui. Aiko Hamura - Lihu'e, Kaua'i, died Jan. 21, 2002. Born in Pu'unene, Maui. Black ribbons and closed doors at Hamura Saimin in Lihue yesterday signaled the loss of co-founder Aiko Hamura, who perfected the restaurant's saimin recipe and helped make the business into a Kauai institution. Phone calls poured in to find out what happened since the 50-year-old saimin stand closes only for three major holidays. The family held a private service yesterday. Customers were shocked to learn of the 91-year-old's death Monday from a heart attack. "She had a lot of spunk in her, so when she

passed away I was really shocked myself," said 74-year-old daughter Hazel Hiraoka, owner of Hamura Saimin. The family-run restaurant is frequented by locals and is on the list of must-visit eateries on Kauai and written up in travel books and brochures. Islanders often stop by the factory at Hamura's Lihue house to pick up boxes of the fresh noodles. Hamura and husband Charles opened the saimin stand with only six wooden stools in 1952 on Kress Street. Business was slow in the beginning because the shop was hidden in a back alley. Hiraoka said her mother told her father, "You better just hang up this business and go find a job so we get a more steady income." But through word of mouth, business grew. "They never gave up," Hiraoka said. "I'm proud of them, it's so famous." Born in Puunene, Maui, on April 30, 1910, Hamura spent a few years in Hiroshima prefecture as a child and returned when she was 8 years old. She got her start peddling vegetables from a black Ford sedan. "In the 1940s you never heard of women driving," said daughter-in-law Jean Hamura. "She was quite a person." She then learned a recipe for saimin from a friend in Lihue, and sold the noodles along with the produce. "Before she opened the place, she perfected the recipe," Jean Hamura said. "It wasn't up to her standards. She felt something was missing, so she used to mix so much and practice and taste until the noodles were up to what it is today. "She would make her own won ton, roast her own pork, fry her own eggs for garnish. She worked very, very hard. She really was the backbone of what it is today," Jean Hamura said. Her mother-in-law taught her the secret family recipe, and now Jean makes the dough, while her husband, Herbert, kneads and slices it into noodles. The original broth for the saimin was made with Hokkigai clams, but they became too difficult to get and too expensive, and the couple devised a new blend of chicken broth and dried shrimp, which is used today. Aiko Hamura remained active and had looked forward to a Feb. 10 trip to Las Vegas, where she played the slot, keno and poker machines, her family said. Even a leg amputation couldn't keep her down. She remained positive and upbeat, using an artificial leg to get around. Hamura is also survived by sons Charles and Herbert, daughter Doris Hironaka, brother Hiromu Ikeda, sister Yoneko Yamamoto, caregiver Whitey Kurasaki, eight grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. D. Elmo Hardy, a renowned entomologist who is known as the "father of evolutionary biology" in Hawai'i, died Oct. 17, 2002 in Honolulu. He was 88. Hardy was an emeritus professor of entomology at the University of Hawai'i-Manoa and research associate at the Bishop Museum. During his 32-year career at the university, Hardy is credited with ground-breaking research on flies that influenced agriculture worldwide. He wrote 235 papers and books on flies in Hawai'i and around the world and described nearly 3,000 new fly species. His studies included pioneer research on the

Mediterranean and Oriental fruit flies. "He was a systematist so classifying, describing and naming new species was his love," said J. Kenneth Grace, chairman of the UH Department of Plant and Environmental Protection Services, "He was a really modest, but hard-working person. To have described nearly 3,000 species of flies is pretty impressive." Hardy was born Sept. 3, 1914, in Lehi, Utah. He earned degrees at Brigham Young and Utah State before receiving his doctorate from the University of Kansas in 1941. During World War II, Hardy served in the Army and was awarded a Bronze Star and Presidential Citation for his work in controlling insect-borne diseases in India, Burma and China. After a stint at Iowa State University, Hardy joined the University of Hawai'i in 1948 as an associate professor of entomology. From 1956 to 1968, he served as chairman of the entomology department. Grace said Hardy established himself as a leader in fly research. More than 80 senior scientists and 400 students who trained at the university founded their work on Hardy's data. Hardy's status in the world of flies is reflected in the number of species — 50 — named after him. They include the Elmomyza, Elmohardyia, Hardyella and Hardyadrama. "Naming an organism after someone is really considered to be an honor," Grace said. "Most people in the field of insect systematics are lucky if they have one or two insects named after them in their life. So that's quite an amazing honor." Hardy was honored for his work in 1976 when he was presented the Entomological Society of America's Outstanding Research award. In 1981 he received the UH excellence in research award, and in 1992 he was recognized by the Hawaiian Entomological Society for Lifetime Excellence. The UH Board of Regents awarded a Medal of Distinction to Hardy in 1997. Hardy retired in 1981 with emeritus status and remained active at the school until recently. Hardy is survived by his wife, Ilse; children, Patricia Jane Swiger, Joan Marie Layton, Cheryl Kay Maloy and Dee Elmo Hardy; 21 grandchildren; and 23 great-grandchildren. He belonged to the Jaycees, Chamber of Commerce, Moloka'i High School alumni association, and was a member of the Moloka'i Catholic Church. He also was a driving force in establishing Kulana 'Oiwi, the state's first multiservice center serving Hawaiians. Larry Helm joked that his brother, who was a member of the National Guard during the Vietnam era, was one of the only Republicans on the island and "wouldn't waffle from the law." In a family of liberal activists, Gregory Helm didn't always fit in, particularly with the activities of younger brother George. "(Gregory) didn't think that was too cool back then, but he was trying to be supportive and trying to understand." Larry Helm said. "We might not agree politically, but he was supportive. At the end of the story he really saw the fruits of what George was about." Gregory Helm would later be involved in the reforestation of Kaho'olawe, a former military target island. Larry Helm borrowed a quote from Mother Theresa to best describe his brother: "The fruit of love is service, which is compassion in action." Gregory Giles Helm - Friends remember Gregory Giles Helm as the kind of person who brought people together to get projects done on Molokai. Helm died in his sleep at his home in Hoolehua Sunday Dec 22, 2002. He

was 59. "It's a tremendous loss. He was an all-around good guy," said Molokai activist Walter Ritte Jr. "He just had an even-keel way of dealing with issues that allowed a lot of people to have a great respect of him." Before his retirement a few years ago, Helm served as the project director for the state Department of Hawaiian Home Lands on Molokai and helped to establish Kalana 'Oiwi, a complex used by a number of Hawaiian service groups. Many residents also remember his work in the community, including his help in bringing a Stanford-University of Hawaii volleyball game to Molokai last year and in establishing an enterprise zone for start-up businesses on the Friendly Isle. He served in the Molokai Jaycees for a couple of decades, becoming a director and later a president, and worked also as chairman of the organization's fair on the island. Molokai physician Emmett Aluli said Helm had been holding meetings and looking at ways to solve long-term nursing home care on the island. "He was truly a leader and role model," Aluli said. Take's Variety Store owner Ralph Kanemitsu said Helm helped to organize and was nearly finished with restoring facilities at Kiowea Park, known for its coconut grove. "He really liked to help people and improve Molokai. That was his style," Kanemitsu said. One of Helm's brothers, George Jr., died in waters off Kahoolawe in 1977 when he was involved in an effort to stop the Navy from bombing the island. Takashi Hirose was one of the bigger kids playing sandlot ball in Pu'unene, Maui's "Camp 5" neighborhood back in the early 1930s. So when he missed an easy pop fly one day, the other kids yelled out, "Eh, you big ... but you hollow!" The name stuck. Hirose was called Halo, pronounced the same as "hollow." "At first, he didn't appreciate it," said Keo Nakama, one of Hirose's Camp 5 playmates. "But after a while, he accepted it." A few years later, Halo Hirose became nationally known in the world of swimming, the result of several AAU, Big Ten Conference and NCAA championships. Hirose, a top pupil of legendary coach Soichi Sakamoto, died of a heart attack on Aug. 24, 2002 at age 79. He had undergone a kidney operation at the end of June and became anemic soon after, said his wife, Kiyomi. "The last week, he was feeling very tired," his widow said. "Before (the operation), he was the healthiest man in the neighborhood." In his younger days, Hirose was one of the fastest swimmers in the world. Like many kids in Pu'unene's sugar plantation, he began by swimming in irrigation ditches before joining Sakamoto's famed "Three Year Swim Club" in 1937. Along with Nakama, Bill Smith, Jose Balmores, Charlie Oda and others who trained under Sakamoto, Hirose brought national acclaim to Hawai'i swimming. At age 15, Hirose placed second in the 200-meter freestyle and fourth in the 100 free at the National AAU meet. Also that year, 1938, Hirose was a member of the United States' 400-meter freestyle relay team that set a world record in Germany. "He became a national figure," Nakama said. "That was something that opened the eyes of the other camp boys." In 1941, Nakama and brother Bunmei "Bunny," Hirose and Balmores won the National AAU's 800-meter freestyle relay championship in record time. The 1940 Olympics had been canceled because of World War II, and Hirose later served as a member of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team and 100th Infantry Battalion. After the war, Hirose enrolled at Ohio State University and became a three-time All-American for the Buckeyes. He was an NCAA champion in the 100 free and helped Ohio State win Big Ten, NCAA and AAU team titles. Hirose was inducted into Ohio State's Sports Hall of Fame in 1987. After earning his degree in 1949, Hirose did graduate work in California and eventually returned to Hawai'i, where he was assigned to the 1st Circuit Adult Probation Division. Hirose later became the state's chief probation officer and retired in 1982. In his spare time, Hirose started the Town Swim Club and also coached swimming at Iolani School, Punahou, St. Andrew's Priory and Manoa Swim Club. "He really enjoyed it," said wife Kiyomi. "And the kids loved him because he treated everybody the same, no matter if you were the slowest swimmer or the fastest."Smith, who won two gold medals in the 1948 Olympics and was Hirose's teammate at Ohio State, said Hirose carried on Sakamoto's legacy. "He passed on all the attributes that coach gave to us," Smith said. "He was wonderful with the kids, and he was very likable. Everybody liked Halo." Besides his wife, Hirose is survived by his daughter, Sono Hirose-Hulbert; sisters, Harriet Uchigaki and Yaeno Hirose; and two grandchildren. Shurei Hirozawa was revered by many as a soft-spoken gentleman who had a vast pool of knowledge. He became the labor and business editor of the Honolulu Star-Bulletin after working on a sugar plantation on Kauai. "He was a great personal friend. ... He was respected from every major CEO in Hawaii," said Walter Dods, chief executive officer for First Hawaiian Bank. Hirozawa died yesterday Sep 5, 2002 in his Manoa home. He was 83. Hirozawa was born in Eleele, Kauai, on May 12, 1919. He attended Waimea

High School. After nine years of working as a mill worker and payroll clerk at the McBryde Sugar Plantation, he moved to Minneapolis to attend Hamlin University after an Episcopalian priest convinced him to attend college. During his two years at Hamlin, Hirozawa overcame a stuttering problem. He later transferred to the University of Iowa where he earned a bachelor's degree in journalism in 1950. Soon after he graduated, Hirozawa moved to Honolulu where he started as a general assignment reporter at the Star-Bulletin. Lyle Nelson, a Star-Bulletin reporter for 31 years, started working at the newspaper the same week as Hirozawa. "He was one of my best friends. He was a wonderful guy and very humble," said Nelson. From 1962 to 1970, Hirozawa was the labor and business editor for the newspaper. "We were very impressed with what he could do. He was the type of guy that got the confidence of people," Nelson said. "He was respected by all." Hirozawa and Nelson often enjoyed attending University of Hawaii baseball and football games together. In September 1970, Hirozawa left the Star-Bulletin to work at First Hawaiian Bank as an assistant vice president for economic research. He later became the vice president for the public relations department before retiring in June 1991. "He was very competent and well liked," Dods said. "He was one of a kind." Star-Bulletin reporter Helen Altonn said: "He was beloved by everyone who knew him. "They just don't make people like that anymore. He was wonderful at his craft. He was a gentleman. Toshiko Hokama - Although Toshiko Hokama loved music, she couldn't carry a tune. "But she certainly sang anyway," said youngest offspring Amy Mitsuda. Hokama's lack of musical ability didn't stop her from opening Hokama's Music in Honolulu and Wailuku -- which specialized in traditional Japanese music -- and running it for more than 70 years. Nothing stopped the enterprising Hokama in pursuing new ventures and ideas. "Whatever assets she had as a person, she used them to the fullest," said daughter Yasuko Betty Inada, who helps run the shop on South King Street. Hokama, 98, died at home Jan. 17, 2002. She was Toshiko Tamanaha when she was born in Nishihara, Okinawa, in 1903. A family friend predicted she would

succeed in Hawaii because she was a go-getter. That prediction proved to be true. Hokama arrived in Kohala on the Big Island at age 18 to marry Seiko Hokama, a plantation laborer. But plantation life was not for her, so they moved to Wailuku, Maui, and opened up Hokama Store, a general merchandise store. "She was the engine, the decision-maker," Mitsuda said. The savvy businesswoman believed she could best sell what she personally liked. "Since she liked music, she decided to go into the record business," Mitsuda said. "She knew nobody else was selling, so it was a nice market for her at the time." So in the 1930s, she was one of the few to sell Japanese recorded music in Hawaii and perhaps the only one on Maui. After the bombing of Pearl Harbor, the store's entire Japanese record inventory was confiscated. Undaunted, Hokama took the opportunity to sell American music to U.S. troops on Maui. After the war, the store resumed selling Japanese music. In 1958, Hokama and her husband moved to Honolulu to open a store on Beretania Street. They began importing records directly from In 1967 the Hokamas purchased the 1319 S. King St. site for Hokama's Music. The store is renowned locally and in Japan for its wide selection of traditional Japanese recorded music. The Nippon Columbia Recording Co. awarded Hokama with a gold record plaque in 1984 as the longest continuous dealer for its recordings. "She always had in the back of her mind that it was a good way to promote the Japanese language and culture," Mitsuda said. But more than that, Mitsuda said, Hokama believed "good music cleanses your soul." Hokama is also survived by son Masatoshi, daughter Hazel Wada, 10 grandchildren and eight greatgrandchildren. Hucks insisted that the facility be simple — a carport cover for archers to take their marks and a storage shed to store the bull's-eyes. He also insisted that members of the 24-member Koko Head Archery Club help build it. But the city has been concerned about stray arrows, which at times have landed in neighboring tennis courts. Money to build the Koko Head archery facility was approved recently as part of the 2002 city budget. A construction date has not been set. Maxine Hughes, a Big Island radio and newspaper figure for nearly a half-century, died Wednesday May 22, 2002 at her son's home in Waimea where

Hughes worked at KHBC, the town's only radio station at the time, and later went to work for the Hawaii Tribune-Herald. For years the Hughes were considered a volunteer family center for visitors, always eager to show off their adopted island. Her husband died in 1979 after a long illness. Hughes was a founding member of the Big Island Press Club and gave hundreds of volunteer hours over 35 years. Her daughter, Margaret Woods of Colorado, who was with her mother when she died, described her as a person who reached into everyone's heart. "She cared about everyone. She always wanted to know what was beneath the surface," be it an interview with a VIP or getting to know her grandchildren, Woods said. John J. Hulten, former state senator and longtime proponent of an interisland ferry system, died Sunday. The Kailua resident was 88. Hulten was a Democrat who represented Windward O'ahu in the Senate from 1962 to 1978. In 1967, Hulten was named Senate president, a position he held for

two sessions. Former Republican Sen. D.G. "Andy" Anderson represented Windward O'ahu with Hulten when multiple senators were elected to the same district. Anderson said Hulten was an "honest, common sense guy." "Black was black and white was white and if it got too gray he wanted to know why," Anderson said yesterday. Former Hawai'i Democratic Party Chairman Walter Heen served with Hulten in the Senate in the late 1960s. Heen's first job out of college also was as a junior appraiser under Hulten and partner John Child. Heen left the firm after a few months to enter law school and later politics. But Heen said he always valued Hulten's intellect. "He was highly recruited by all of us because he was respected for his intelligence, his wisdom, his knowledge, particularly of real estate values and land use," Heen said. Hulten was born Nov. 2, 1913, in San Francisco. He began his business career with the San Francisco Bank, where he worked as a loan clerk until 1945. He later worked as regional tax adviser with the U.S. Public Housing Administration. In 1948, he moved to Hawai'i when he was named chief appraiser for the Veteran Administration. In 1951, Hulten and Child opened a business that provided real estate appraisals and economic studies. In 1957, he opened a consulting firm that specialized in urban renewal projects. In the late 1950s, Hulten began to promote the idea of a state-run interisland ferry system. He said the system would be an economic plus for the Islands and could employ hundreds of people. Hulten was elected to the Senate in 1962 and continued to push the ferry plan. In 1965 the Legislature passed a measure that would set up the system, but the state was unable to find a vessel to lease. In addition to his political and business careers, Hulten was an active member of the Catholic Church.
