Robert E. MacGregor, a key figure in the growth of Hawaii's tourist industry for more than 50 years, died Tuesday April 15, 2002 in Honolulu. He was 88. MacGregor started International Travel Service in Honolulu in 1946 with Leong Hop Loui, and it is now one of Hawaii's biggest retail travel agencies. Later, he formed Trade Wind Tours to sell retail and wholesale tours to Hawaii from the mainland and elsewhere. For a time, that business was the largest U.S. marketer of Hawaii tours. MacGregor developed other local tourism-related businesses covering a range of activities such as Pearl Harbor tours, bus travel and Polynesian shows. He sold Trade Wind Tours in 1987 but remained involved in other businesses. including International Travel, until his death. Outside his business activities, MacGregor was known for his passion for polo, which he started playing in 1958 when the local polo grounds were in Kapiolani Park. Polo moved later to Mokuleia, and 16 years ago, MacGregor co-founded a new Honolulu Polo Club at Waimanalo, where the MacGregor Cup is one of the trophies each year. MacGregor's wife, Emalita, whom he met in the Philippines while working for Pan Am, died in 1992. He is survived by his daughter, Roberta Masson of Tiburon, Calif., and one granddaughter. A memorial service will be held Tuesday at Diamond Head Memorial Park Chapel, with viewing at 8:30 a.m. and service at 9:30 a.m. The family requests that in lieu of flowers, contributions be made in MacGregor's memory to the American Cancer Society or Hawaii Public Radio. Charles "Chuck" Machado Jr - They called him the Lu'au King, and Chuck Machado earned the title, serving millions of Hawaiian feasts to visitors in Waikiki and introducing dozens of Hawaiian stars to the world of entertainment. Charles "Chuck" Machado Jr., who was born Aug. 1, 1939, in Kailua, Kona, died here Saturday morning May 4, 2002 at Straub Clinic & Hospital of heart problems. He was 62. If tourists didn't encounter Machado's brand of aloha at the lu'au they were likely to have been met by Machado and his minions at the airport, where Machado got his start as a lei greeter and later opened his own Aloha Lei Greeters company. In later years, Machado sponsored popular and profitable jackpot fishing and golf tournaments on the Big Island. By 1977, the United States Small Business Administration had named the 36-year-old Machado Hawai'i's businessman of the year. He was the first person of Hawaiian ancestry so honored, and Hawaiian cultural scholar George S. Kanahele said at the time the award would put to rest the stereotype of Hawaiians as non-business people. At the time, Machado was grossing \$2 million a year, employing 142 people, staging five to 10 lu'au a week and running four other visitor-oriented businesses. In 1988, Gov. John Waihe'e saluted him on his 25th business anniversary as "a leading Hawaiian entrepreneur" who built an empire on hard work, zeal and vigor while participating in business associations and groups as well. Machado attended Konawaena and then Kamehameha Schools, and was a student at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa when he got into the lei trade. Chuck Machado's Luaus began as a moonlighting operation at the Chinese American Club in the Ala Wai Clubhouse in 1963, moved to Fort DeRussy to cater to the military rest-and-recreation crowd, then settled in for two decades on the beach at Waikiki in front of the Outrigger Hotel. Between 500 and 700 visitors three times a week tucked into the kalua pig, the chicken long rice and the lomi salmon, and of course, always poi. Machado eliminated 'opihi from the menu reluctantly, and not until the late 1980s. It wasn't the \$200-a-bucket cost, he said, but the

scarcity. "It gave me too much stress worrying about whether it would show up or not," he said. "He tried to keep the lu'au Hawaiian," said Mamo Howard Ornellas, former vice president for 17 years with Chuck Machado Luaus and his corporations. "Most of our lu'aus, you know, have no kalua pig, no nothing. It's just a buffet called a lu'au so the tourists could eat," Ornellas said. "But he tried to keep it as authentic as possible. He would include maybe a piece of teriyaki, so (lu'au-goers) ... would have something to eat if they didn't want to try anything else. But he was known for being authentic." When Machado put on a lu'au at Washington Place in 1975, his staff worked around the clock to make sure the fish was fresh, and picked through 400 coconuts to find 200 with tender spoon meat. "He was the first commercial lu'au person in the state," Ornellas said. "He was just a brilliant man. He paved the way for the lu'au industry and entertainment. He paved the way for a lot of entertainers. He was too helpful and generous. He took care of everyone." Those who worked early in their careers for Machado included Nohelani Cypriano, Jack and Cha Thompson of Tihati, Kimo Kahoano, Noe Noe Zuttermeister, Leinaala Simerson, Kawika Trask, Squires of the House of I, Brickwood Galuteria, Al Harrington, Cathy Foy and Doug Mossman. It was during one of Machado's own rare appearances on stage that Mossman got the better of him when Machado kidded the audience by asking them to give Mossman a standing ovation, because he had never got one. The applause hadn't died down when Mossman turned to his boss and said, "Well, I've never had a pay raise" either, so "how about a raise?" "How could he turn me down?" Mossman grinned later. "And it was a juicy raise." Machado is survived by sons Charles III of Kahului and Myles of California; daughter Monica; brothers Lionel and Barry; sisters Carolyn and Brenda Lee of Kona; and a granddaughter, Chelsie. Stanley Marcus, whose name has been synonymous with high-dollar retailing and extravagant gifts for nearly a century, died yesterday Jan 22, 2002 at 96. The chairman emeritus of Neiman Marcus was hospitalized Sunday and died with family members at his side, a spokeswoman for Stanley Marcus Consultancy said. Marcus long had been hailed as the last

bastion of the day of the Merchant Prince. His philosophy was simple: "I do believe the best is discernible to the observant eye." Walter Loeb, publisher of the Loeb Retail Letter, said Marcus created a standard "for quality and dignity" that still exists for Neiman Marcus shoppers who expect the highest level of service and couture. "He had such an eye for fashion," Loeb said. "Today we've lost an icon and patriarch in the business." Marcus' father, aunt and uncle founded Neiman Marcus in 1907 in downtown Dallas. Marcus graduated from Harvard University in 1925 and received his master's degree in business administration from Harvard's business school a year later. In 1926, at age 21, Marcus took over as the company's secretary, treasurer and director. Eventually, he retired from the company in 1975 with the title chairman emeritus. Early Neiman Marcus customers included cowboys, Indians and women from rural outposts in Texas where the land had yielded oil. In the 1920s, the store was the first to offer personalized gift wrapping for customers and created the first weekly retail fashion show in the country. In 1960, it also started a Christmas tradition of exotic his and her gifts, which continues today. The catalog first began in 1915. Today, Neiman Marcus has 32 stores nationwide, from Honolulu to Beverly Hills, Calif., to Boston. Marcus was founder-trustee of the Stanley and Linda Marcus Foundation, which benefits endeavors of art and culture. In 1974, he wrote the best seller "Minding the Store: A [Adv 23/1/2002] Memoir."

Dolores Martin, a pioneer of the modern Democratic Party in Hawai'i, died Saturday in Honolulu after suffering a stroke. Martin, an advocate for Democrats at a time when women were not very welcome in politics and Hawai'i was dominated by Republicans, was 93. The daughter of Lahaina butcher and Postmaster Antone Furtado, one of the few Demo-crats in town, and a Hawaiian woman who was a schoolteacher, Martin was at the heart of the 1954 Democratic revolution and the drive for statehood. As Democratic national committeewoman from 1956 to 1964, she was one of the attractive faces of Hawai'i on national television coverage of the presidential conventions, and it was from her that many national Democratic leaders gained their impressions of the Territory. When U.S. Sen. Ted Kennedy came to the governor's mansion at Washington Place a few years ago during a campaign swing for local candidates, he looked around the room and asked, "Where is Dolores Martin?" Told that Martin didn't get out much, Kennedy asked for a telephone and called her. They talked for 15 minutes while all the other Democrats stood waiting, said Martin's son, Watters Martin Jr. She was a longtime close friend of the late U.S. Rep. Patsy Mink, and of Mink's husband, John, who yesterday described Martin as "a driving force in the Democratic Party during its early formative years, and deeply involved and highly recognized on both the local and national level, particularly during the Kennedy-Johnson era. "She served all of her party functions well, and she managed to do the things she did without causing any animosity," John Mink said. Martin attended The Priory, graduated from Punahou in 1928, and then attended Woodbury Business College in Los Angeles. She returned to Hawai'i to work for her father in the Lahaina Post Office, then in the law firm of William Heen in Honolulu. She met and married ardent Alabama-born Democrat activist Watters Martin, a used car dealer, and became his partner and then successor after his death in family real-estate investments, which included property in the heart of Lahaina, as well as in Waikiki. She was a member of the Daughters and Sons of Hawaiian Warriors, of 'Ahahui Ka'ahumanu Chapter 1, of Daughters of Hawai'i, and of the Ladies Oriental Court of North America, Hawaii Court

No. 60. In 1991 she endowed a merit scholarship at Punahou with a gift of a \$1.6 million Waikiki property to the school. Martin is survived by her son, Watters O. Martin Jr.; daughter, Mahealani Riley; brother, Richard Furtado; sister, Gertrude Berger; three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Dolores Martin, who was among the leaders of the Democratic Party in Hawaii when it came to power in 1954 through statehood, died last Saturday Nov 16, 1001 in the Queen's Medical Center after suffering a stroke earlier this month. She was 93. Martin was Hawaii's Democratic national committeewoman from 1956 through 1964, served as one of four electors from Hawaii who cast ballots for President Lyndon B. Johnson, and helped organize local support for John F. Kennedy and Robert Kennedy in their bids for president. She also ran unsuccessfully for the state Senate in 1966. "She worked for social and economic changes to the Democrat Party, which our family felt was the only way there could be changes in the early days of the Territory of Hawaii," said son Watters O. Martin Jr. Her father A.D. Furtado, a butcher, helped start the Democratic Party on Maui, where Martin was raised. Her mother was a schoolteacher. Martin Jr. said his mother's family came from a plantation town and understood the value of education. They sent her to Honolulu at age 9 to go to school. She graduated from Punahou in 1928 and attended Woodbury Business College in Los Angeles. Martin later endowed a merit scholarship at Punahou with the donation of a \$1.6 million Waikiki property, said Martin Jr., who noted the endowment pays tuition for 12 students. Martin married Watters O. Martin, a used-car dealer whom she met when he sold her a car. He was raised a Democrat in Alabama. Martin Jr. said the assassination of Robert Kennedy was one of the reasons his mother withdrew from national politics. "She was heartbroken when that happened because she knew the Kennedys," he said. But she remained active in Hawaiian issues and was involved in the Protect Kahoolawe Ohana and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. Martin Jr. said his mother voted absentee in the last election and was disappointed by the lack of voter turnout, especially among the children of plantation families. "She found that hard to understand because people have forgotten what it was like," Martin Jr. said. "They (the early Democrats in Hawaii) struggled so hard." Besides Martin Jr., she is survived by daughter Mahealani Riley, brother Richard Furtado, sister Gertrude Berger, three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Yayori Matsui, a pioneering Japanese journalist and women's rights advocate who fought for greater Japanese disclosure of its sexual enslavement of Asian women during World War II, has died of liver cancer Matsui fought against injustice and the exploitation of the underprivileged, especially women. Her strong views sometimes earned her enemies in Japan's right wing. "She never hesitated to fight against something she thought was wrong," said her sister, Yayuki Mukoyama, 66. "In a sense, her life was a battle." Matsui was visiting feminists in Afghanistan in October when she was overcome by illness. She was diagnosed with terminal cancer upon returning to Tokyo but continued to work from her hospital bed until shortly before her death on Dec. 27, 2002. Given all the unfinished work, "I wanted to live at least 10 more years" she told supporters in one of her final e-mails. Matsui was born on April 12, 1934, in Kyoto, the eldest of six children. Her father, a Christian minister who had served in China during the war, adored her and would explain to her in great detail what he had witnessed, including many abuses committed by Japanese troops. She went to college in Minnesota and Paris. On her way back to Japan, she stopped in Asian mainland, and was exposed to abject poverty for the first time. "I believe this was the first real trigger that would drive her life's work," said longtime friend and fellow activist Rumiko Nishino. Matsui started working in 1961 at the mainstream Asahi Shimbun newspaper, placing her among the first career female reporters in Japan. She worked in journalism for 30 years. After retiring, she dedicated herself to social activism. In 2000, she helped organize a mock tribunal that drew former comfort women from all over Asia to testify. She was infuriated when the Japanese news media refused to publicize it and filed a lawsuit charging falsified reports against national broadcaster NHK, which is pending. She spent her final days planning a Japanese museum on the comfort women issue and other war-related subjects, scheduled to open in 2006. [Adv 12/01/2003]

"She wanted to educate young people about the culture, and embed in them the same passion she held," Bright said. Mattos' trademarks were the yellow plumeria her students wore in lei and head ornaments, and the long hair styles worn by her dancers. The plumeria was a nod to older times: memories of her uncle and of greeting shiploads of visitors, Bright said. The hair was a rule: Everyone had long hair, all kept at the same length. "Once you were in the halau, she owned your hair," Bright said. Mattos worked with her brother, Kunewa Mook, who runs Hula Halau O Kamuela II in California. Bright said her sister was training her young assistant, Kau'i Kamana'o, to take over as kumu hula. "I've been dancing with her for 21 years, since I was 3 years old," Kamana'o said last night. Mattos did have interests outside of hula, centering on her family, he said. The last familyrelated goal she had told him about was that her daughter, Michelle, would give her a granddaughter. The Rev. Canon Frederick McDonald, a former headmaster of Iolani School, "was the first architect to put his hand print on the school," said current Headmaster Val Iwashita. The Episcopal clergyman spent 10 of his 60 years of service in Hawaii, as rector of St. Clement Parish in Makiki for six years before being selected to head the school from 1955 to 1959. He died Friday Mar 8, 2002 in San Francisco at the age of 93. Iwashita said McDonald was in charge during the school's transition from a Nuuanu

Avenue site to the Ala Wai campus, which was a military compound during World War II. "We still benefit today" from decisions made then, he said. Iwashita visited McDonald in San Francisco recently. "In my brief time with him, I got a glimpse of his sincerity and intellect. He was a high-minded individual, fond of memories of Hawaii and Iolani." "I told him about Iolani winning state championships in basketball and swimming. His answer to me was, 'Don't forget to emphasize academics," Iwashita recalled. During World War II, McDonald was an Army chaplain of Special Troops, 12th Army Group, commanded by Gen. Omar Bradley. Bradley's memoirs, "A Soldier's Story," quoted McDonald's sermon at a service held when the war ended in Europe. McDonald visited damaged churches and synagogues during the war, methodically collecting shards of glass from their demolished stained-glass windows along with a story about each location. A memorial project is under way to use those remnants for new windows at the Interfaith Center at the Presidio Army post in San Francisco. "Bringing back a work of beauty out of the destruction seems to reflect his personality perfectly," Iwashita said. McDonald was born in Seattle and graduated from the University of Washington and the General Theological Seminary in New York. After leaving Hawaii, he served in Europe and worked to unite Anglican dioceses in the Middle East and North Africa. In 1991 he celebrated the first Eucharistic service ever held at the North Pole while aboard a Russian icebreaker. He is survived by sister Elizabeth Parsons, nephews and nieces. Queenie B. Mills - A memorial gathering in honor of Queenie B. Mills, a former Punahou School principal and innovator in child development as well as human-pet relationships, will begin at 11 a.m. tomorrow at O'ahu Cemetery. Mills was 89 when she died Aug. 6 in Urbana, Ill. Her remains are being interred in the Monsarrat family plot, where the memorial is taking place. PATSY TAKEMOTO MINK - Patsy Takemoto Mink, who personified liberal Democratic politics in Hawai'i and Washington for more than 40 years, died yesterday after battling viral pneumonia for more than a month. She was 74. Mink was the first minority woman to serve in Congress. Over the course of 24 years at the Capitol, she never wavered from her role as a proud, partisan, liberal feminist Democrat who always chose her own path, even when it was a solitary one. Mink was a primary force behind the landmark Title IX legislation that opened up school athletics and academics to women in 1972. She was involved in writing scores of other significant laws affecting families and women, from early childhood education initiatives to family medical leave. She had been running for re-election to the 2nd District, representing rural O'ahu and the Neighbor Islands. Mink's name will remain on the Nov. 5 ballot. If she wins, the seat will be declared vacant and a special election will be held 60 to 120 days later. Mink's office announced her death in a statement released about 1 p.m. yesterday. It said her husband, John, and daughter, Gwendolyn, had been at her side since she was hospitalized Aug. 30 at Straub Clinic & Hospital. The viral pneumonia was brought on by a case of chickenpox. Mink was placed in the intensive care unit Sept. 1. Her death drew condolences from across the state and nation. "It's a great loss for Hawai'i and our nation. But in a way, it's a personal loss for me because her political career almost parallels mine," said U.S. Sen. Dan Inouye. "But her career was a brilliant one. She was the great voice and advocate of women's rights, not just freedom of choice but college sports. She was a great voice for peace and education, and she will be sorely missed in the Congress." U.S. Transportation Secretary Norman Mineta called Mink "an American hero," and described her as "an inspiring voice for the people of her state, and for the forgotten, the disenfranchised, the poor." "Patsy was a petite woman with a powerful voice and a peerless reputation as a champion for equal opportunity, civil rights and education. She was a courageous and tenacious leader whose lifetime of public service made Hawai'i a better place," said U.S. Sen. Daniel Akaka in a statement. In addition to her years in Congress, Mink served in the Hawai'i Territorial Legislature, in the U.S. Interior Department under President Jimmy Carter and on the Honolulu City Council. At various points in her career she ran unsuccessfully for Honolulu mayor, governor, U.S. senator, and briefly in 1972 for president, as a symbol of protest against the Vietnam War. Mink, who earned her law degree in 1951 but was drawn almost immediately to politics, devoted her entire adult life to public office, serving in the U.S. House of Representatives from 1965 to 1977 and from 1990 to 2002. She said she never thought of retiring. "I'm not ready to turn it over to anybody," she said in 2000, explaining why she was running for yet another term in the House, at age 72. "I don't feel my work has come to an end. I still see so much that needs to be done." Mink always considered herself a "Kennedy liberal," who came into office as part of the huge Lyndon Johnson "coattails class" after President John F. Kennedy's assassination. Her immediate introduction into Johnson's "Great Society" style of activist politics stayed with her throughout her career, even as the country turned more conservative and other Democrats tried to slide quietly toward the political middle on issues such as national defense, tax cuts and spending on social programs. Yet once she was firmly established in Congress, Mink also had the luxury of rarely facing serious opposition from Democrats or Republicans. Most recently she was publicly skeptical of the government's response to the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks. She raised concerns about the potential loss of civil liberties and the creation of a new Department of Homeland Security. And she was one of only 11 members of the House who refused to vote for a resolution condemning terrorist attacks on Israel, because she said the

measure would have cut off diplomatic channels with the Palestinians. Mink joined the NAACP in the early days of the civil rights movement in the 1960s and had a nearly 100 percent voting record on votes that were supported by the American Civil Liberties Union, the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees and the League of Conservation Voters. In 1992, McCall's magazine named her one of the 10 best politicians in Congress. Her brash style and unwavering commitment to social causes often put her at odds with more conservative members of Congress, and even with members of the Hawai'i congressional delegation. Mink was a passionate Democrat, but she was anything but a quiet loyalist within the Hawai'i party. In fact, she operated somewhat as an outsider, loyal to her own agenda but not necessarily to that of people who sought to maintain political control above all else. And she was never much of a glad-hander, whether it be at political functions or even her own campaign events. She was private and somewhat aloof — some would say gruff — and made it clear that she was never terribly concerned about what people thought of her, personally or politically. On several occasions — and at least once successfully — party insiders tried to keep Mink off the official Hawai'i delegation to a national nominating convention. She listened to her own convictions, not to the dictates of party leaders. Born into the Maui plantation community of Pa'ia on Dec. 6, 1927, to Suematsu and Mitama Takemoto, Mink's first taste of leadership came as student-body president and valedictorian at Maui High School in 1944. Fascinated by what she called "life processes," she began pre-medical studies at the University of Hawai'i. She transferred to a small college in Pennsylvania, then to the University of Nebraska, where she fought and won a battle against segregated student housing. After returning to Manoa to graduate, Mink took a job at the Honolulu Academy of Arts, but became restless. She applied to dozens of Mainland medical schools but was rejected by all because of her gender. She decided to try law school and was accepted by the prestigious University of Chicago. There, she met John F. Mink of Pennsylvania, a doctoral student in geology. They were married in 1951 and soon had their only child. The Mink family moved to Honolulu, and Patsy Mink began a private law practice, the first Japanese American woman attorney in Hawai'i. But as an Asian woman, she recalled years later, she simply was not well accepted by the legal "club" of the day. She quickly realized that unless she worked actively to change things, she would never get anywhere professionally. "I didn't start off wanting to be in politics," she once told a reporter. "I wanted to be a learned professional, serving the community. But they weren't hiring women just then. Not being able to get a job from

anybody changed things." Her frustration pushed her to join the Democratic Party at a meeting at Mabel Smyth Auditorium in Honolulu. When the Young Democrats organization was born at the party's 1954 convention, Mink was chosen president, an early sign that she never would be satisfied simply to go along with the majority. Historian Lawrence Fuchs has written that the group was created precisely to keep returning war veterans such as Dan Inouve and Spark Matsunaga from taking control of the Democratic Party. Mink was elected to the Territorial House in 1956 and to the Territorial Senate in 1958. Her first electoral loss came in 1959, when she was defeated in the Democratic primary race for Congress by up-and-comer Inouye. She returned to the state Senate, where she chaired the Education Committee. But Mink kept her eye on Congress, and in 1964 was elected to her first term. Mink stood out simply as a woman and an Asian in the nearly all-white, all-male House of Representatives. Her blunt, forceful, even harsh style of speaking — especially on such issues as civil rights, public education and the Vietnam War — gave Mink national exposure. "She didn't mind believing in things and letting people know about it," said former Lt. Gov. Tom Gill, who served in Congress from 1962 to 1964. In 1966, she won re-election by the highest vote tally ever recorded at that time in the state. Mink was one of the earliest and loudest opponents in Congress to the war in Vietnam, and she accompanied fellow Rep. Bella Abzug of New York to Paris to talk to participants in the Vietnam War peace talks. It was a position that did not endear her to many of her own constituents, and also grated on the politically influential Hawai'i veterans of World War II. During a heated 1968 re-election campaign against former Mayor Neal Blaisdell, her opponents painted her as "a friend of Hanoi" and "Patsy Pink" because of her anti-war voting record. Despite criticism, Mink held to what she believed was right. "I don't think that weighing the mail is the answer," she once explained. Mink won 2 percent of the vote in Oregon's 1972 Democratic presidential primary in a campaign that made the withdrawal from Vietnam its only issue. Even as a critic of the war, Mink found she could count on strong support from organized labor, and from the \$5 and \$10 backers upon whom she had always relied. Mink and Abzug joined forces again to move feminist causes from the political fringe to the mainstream. In what is perhaps Mink's must enduring legacy, she was among the authors of the landmark Women's Educational Equity Act, known as Title IX, which required equal support for men and women in academics and athletics at any institution receiving federal money. The law triggered a boom in women's college athletics programs. "She earned an honored place in American history as the author of Title IX," said U.S. Rep. Neil

Abercrombie, who represents Hawai'i's 1st District. "Her legacy survives on every school and college campus in America." After 12 years in the U.S. House, Mink sought a seat in the Senate in 1976, but lost the Democratic primary to Hawai'i's other House member, Spark M. Matsunaga. In 1977, President Jimmy Carter named Mink assistant secretary of state for oceans and international, environmental and scientific affairs. Later she became president of the liberal political action group Americans for Democratic Action, a national post she held for three years. The group tried to promote her as a potential vice presidential candidate. Back on O'ahu and living in Waipahu in 1983, she was elected to the City Council and served more than two years as chairwoman. Clearly restless and missing the ability to influence more than zoning regulations, Mink ran for governor in 1986 but lost in the primary. Two years later, she ran for Honolulu mayor and lost. In 1990, she got another shot at Congress when Daniel Akaka was appointed to fill the Senate vacancy left by the death of Spark Matsunaga. She won the special election to serve out Akaka's term in the House. But the Capitol she returned to was a far different place than it had been in the 1970s. Old liberal friends such as Abzug were long gone, many of them replaced by a new breed of centrist Democrat less friendly to labor and expansive social programs. When Republicans took over the House in 1994, Mink found herself marginalized, and still unwilling to compromise, found also that her legislation languished. In addition to her husband and daughter, Mink is survived by her brother, Eugene Takemoto of 'Aiea. Funeral arrangements are pending. Moe, who resided in Laie, died Saturday Dec 4, 2002 at the age of 73. Born on the road to entertainers Tau and Rose Moe on July 13, 1929, in Kyoto, Japan, Lani was destined for the stage. "He was always imitating people backstage," said his sister Dorian Moe-Vineula, and one

night just got pushed onstage. Lani began playing the ukulele at age 3 and became adept at a variety of string instruments. When Lani got older, he became the family's lead singer. "He had a beautiful voice, basically a balladeer and a crooner, something like Alfred Apaka," said Ishmael Stagner, a Hawaiian music historian. The family performed in Paris at the Moulin Rouge and at the Casino in Monte Carlo. Despite their success abroad, few in Hawaii have heard of Moe and his talented family, who were among the first to bring Polynesian music and dance to the world. "The Moes just simply entertained to a different public and were not known at home," said Stagner, who is trying to get recognition by the state Legislature and the governor for the family. The Moes' lives were the stuff of movies. When living in pre-World War II Germany, Lani was the champion moneyraiser for German children's charities and rode with Hitler in his Mercedes-Benz. During a performance in Germany, the family, who had helped Jewish friends, was tipped off that the Gestapo was in the audience waiting for them. After the show, the family fled the country, eventually ending up in India. "Their next gig was in Japan, but then the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor and the family had to stay in India," Stagner said. Tau insisted that if his two children wanted to perform onstage, they must learn everything backstage, and Lani excelled in choreography and set and costume design. On the road, the children had private tutors who traveled with them. Lani learned French, German, Spanish, Hungarian and Hindi. Lani also mastered classical dance and performed with several European dance companies. "We were the first Polynesian group as an act that did Polynesian at the beginning, ending with modern dance and acrobatics," Moe-Vinuela said. "I think we were a little too far ahead of our time. I go to Waikiki and they're doing all this now."Upon the family's return to Hawaii in 1982, Lani taught dance at Brigham Young University-Hawaii until his death. Ernest Morgado - When Ernest Morgado cooked up a batch of teriyaki chicken for a group of farmers in 1955, little did he know that he would go on to be the "Huli-Huli Chicken" king of Hawai'i. Morgado, a businessman and community leader who changed the face of charity fund-raising when he came up with the Huli-Huli chicken idea, died Tuesday Nov 5, 2002. He was 85. No cause of death was released. Morgado was the head of Pacific Poultry when he barbecued his first chickens at a farmer's meeting. The gathering expected to be fed and Morgado decided to broil some chickens that had been marinated in special teriyaki sauce. The farmers loved the chicken and asked for more. Morgado quickly realized he had a hit and began to market the teriyaki chicken. "He just started doing it as fundraisers. It was a recipe that my grandmother used to make and it just went from there," said Kathy Vest, Morgado's daughter. With the idea hatched, Morgado needed to come up with a name for his new product other than teriyaki chicken. "Huli-Huli," he said, came quite by accident. Morgado barbecued the mass quantities of chickens between two grills. When one side of the chicken halves was cooked, someone would shout, "huli," Hawaiian for "turn." Morgado liked the name "huli-huli" so much that he registered the trademark with the Territory of Hawai'i in 1958 and the federal government in 1965. Over the years, schools, charities and other nonprofit organizations have sold Huli-Huli chicken as a way to raise money. Jaren Hancock, Pacific Poultry vice president of marketing and Morgado's stepson, said he could not guess how much has been raised selling Huli-Huli chicken."As far as the numbers are concerned, I really don't know. But I guarantee you that it's in the millions," Hancock said. Many competitors have come and gone, but Huli-Huli chicken has withstood the test of time. In 1986, Morgado began selling the sauce in local stores. "People kept saying, 'We want to buy the sauce,' so that's when he finally decided to sell the sauce," Vest said. "Even on the Mainland I talk to people who have been here and they say, 'I know Huli-Huli.' " In 1981, Morgado entered the Guinness Book of World Records for the largest chicken barbecue ever. His company cooked 46,386 chicken halves at a fund-raiser for Iolani School. Morgado was born in Hilo, and his family moved to Honolulu when he was a youngster. He graduated from St. Louis School and served as a chief petty officer in naval intelligence during World War II. Following the war, Morgado got into the grain business and soon found himself building the first mechanized livestock feed manufacturing facility in the Philippines. In the 1960s, he moved to Honolulu and oversaw the construction of the city's first bulk grain elevators at Honolulu Harbor. As a side job, Morgado got together with chicken farmer Mike Asagi and founded Pacific Poultry in 1954. The company sold chickens under the 'Ewa brand. In addition to his business, Morgado served as the vice consul for Portugal. In 1981, he was awarded the Honolulu Portuguese Chamber of Commerce's "Council's Cup" for his years of service. Morgado also served on the state Board of Agriculture and was a longtime member of the Outrigger Canoe Club. He is survived by his wife, Fay; sons, Jaren and Brent Hancock; daughter, Kathleen Vest; eight grandchildren; and 12 great-grandchildren. Ernest Frank Morgado - Huli Huli Chicken king Ernest Frank Morgado died Tuesday Oct 5, 2002 at 85. "He coined the term 'Huli Huli Chicken' and patented it," said John Farias, a longtime friend and former state agriculture chairman. "That's how Hawaii has Huli Huli Chicken, because of Ernie." Morgado, one of the founders and president of Pacific Poultry Co., which distributes fresh poultry under the Ewa Brand, began Huli Huli Chicken fund raising in Hawaii. "He was low-key, but highly competitive in business matters and a great father, grandfather and great-grandfather," said son Jaren Hancock, vice president of marketing for the company. Morgado marketed his Huli Huli sauce in Europe, Japan and on the mainland. The trademark was born out of the Hawaiian "huli huli," meaning to turn repeatedly. Chicken halves are cooked on metal frame screens that are turned over a charcoal fire. Son Brent Hancock said Morgado provided barbecue chicken for farm bureau meetings in the late '50s or early '60s, and they started receiving requests for private parties and other functions. Hancock said the chicken got so popular that Morgado decided to start charging more and eventually patented Huli Huli Chicken. Born in Hilo, Morgado graduated from St. Louis High School. He served in World War II as a chief petty officer in naval intelligence and served on the state Board of Agriculture from 1974 to 1981. In the 1960s, as Hawaiian Grain Corp.'s president, he oversaw the building and operation of Honolulu's first bulk grain elevators at Pier 23. But Morgado was more than a businessman. He co-founded the Portuguese Chamber of Commerce in 1977 with Honolulu City Councilman John Henry Felix and served as honorary vice consul to Portugal until his death. Morgado was very active and supportive of Portuguese culture. "He was a godsend to the Portuguese community," said Laura Figueira, board member and past president of the Portuguese Chamber of Commerce. "He will be sorely missed." A second-generation Portuguese, he traced his roots back to the 14th-century Azores. "He made numerous trips to Portugal, the Azores and Madeira, telling the story of the Portuguese in Hawaii," Felix said. "He was extremely proud of his Portuguese heritage." Sister Agnes Jerome Murphy, a pioneer in providing services to children and adults with special needs, died Oct. 7, 2002 in Honolulu. She was 89. Sister Agnes was the founder of the Special Education Center of Hawai'i. The nonprofit center was created in 1965 when Sister Agnes realized children with mental disabilities were poorly served in Hawai'i's schools. With a \$3,000 church loan, the eighth-grade teacher at Star of the Sea Catholic School in Wai'alae set up a special education center in two classrooms. Today the nondenominational organization has four centers on O'ahu serving adults and children, with an annual budget of \$7 million. "She was a woman ahead of her time, a visionary," said SECOH executive director Mary Jossem. "Long before women were doing what women are doing today, she was doing it way back then. She's really a role model for today's women." Sister Agnes was born on Aug. 1, 1913, in Worcester, Mass. She entered the Sisters of Notre Dame in Waltham, Mass., in 1932. In 1950, Sister Agnes moved to Hawai'i as a missionary and joined the staff at Star of the Sea School. She realized early on that there were few programs to help the mentally disabled, and in 1958 she earned a master's degree in special education at the University of Hawai'i to attack the problem head-on. Sister Agnes' center for special-needs children began with just two instructors. In 1978, she secured a lease on state land at Diamond Head and raised enough money to build a permanent center. SECOH has evolved over the years, and serves primarily adults with physical and mental disabilities. SECOH also has a day service for people with Alzheimer's disease and dementia. "Sister was known for taking the people that no one else in the community would want," Jossem said. "Anyone who came to her with a problem, she'd say we'd take them no matter what, because she felt that we needed to serve those that no one else wanted to serve or were able to serve." "She was tenacious, persistent, until she got what she wanted for the people that she was serving." Sister Agnes retired in 1997, but remained active with SECOH. She also was a member of Delta Kappa Gamma Society, the International Society of Women educators, and served on the Hawai'i State Planning Council on Developmental Disabilities. John F. Murphy - Retired Castle & Cooke Vice President John F. Murphy negotiated with employee unions for almost three decades, before wholesale warehouses provided well-stocked relief during waterfront strikes. "In 1948, things like toilet paper were really scarce, so things were difficult on the waterfront," said his son Rob. "But that was an important time in my dad's career," said his oldest son, Jack. Murphy died Nov. 6, 2002 at 95. Murphy first came to Hawaii when he was stationed at Pearl Harbor during World War II as a staff member for the chief of naval personnel from 1944 to 1945. He returned to the islands a year later when Castle & Cooke hired him from Industrial Relations Counselors of New York. Murphy's regular duties often included figuring out employee hours, wages, payrolls and job descriptions. He retired from Castle & Cooke in 1974. Murphy also served as chairman of Honolulu Symphony Society's fund-raising drive for two years before being elected the organization's president. "Classical music was always a very important part of his life," Jack said. "It was something that he enjoyed and wanted to extend his interest in his abilities and energies in a way that he could contribute to the world of classical music." Murphy lived through another kind of strike in 1968 when symphony musicians staged a walkout because of a disagreement over a salary raise. The musicians union ordered its members back to work after two days. Murphy also served on the Palama Settlement board of trustees and the Hale Kipa board of directors. He was born in Worcester, Mass., on March 7, 1907. Murphy attended New York University and the Harvard School of Business. He met his wife, Marion, in high school in a drama club. They married in 1929. Murphy is survived by wife Marion; sons Jack, Don, Rob and Neil; six grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren. Private services.
