Rachel Haili - When Rachel Haili opened Haili's Hawaiian Foods in 1950, poi was so plentiful it was sold by the barrel. Over the years, the Hawaiian food staple has been in decreasing supply and the cost to run a business has soared. But two things remained constant at Haili's Hawaiian Foods and the family matriarch made sure it stayed that way: customers were treated with respect and served good food, and the Haili family would support each other through thick and thin. "She always allowed us to express our views," said Lorraine Alo, one of Rachel and Peter Haili's six daughters who continue to run the business. "She passed her knowledge on to us and she was always very adamant that, 'OK, you disagree with your sisters and you have your fights, but by the end of the day you go home and you're sisters. You're not working partners.' She always stressed taking care of each other and making

sure that we're OK." Rachel Haili, founder of the Haili's Hawaiian Foods at the Ward Farmers Market, died Oct. 3, 2003. She was 85. Haili was born Rachel Moi Lin Ching on April 17, 1918, the youngest of 11 children of Chinese immigrants. After graduating from Mid-Pacific Institute, she worked as a waitress at Lau Yee Chai and also worked the lines at the pineapple cannery. She married Peter Haili, a full-blooded Hawaiian, and began her food service career as co-owner of the Family Inn, a bar and restaurant that served Hawaiian food. But with six daughters, Rachel Haili felt that operating a bar was not appropriate, so in 1950 the couple opened Haili's Hawaiian Food at what was then known as the Ala Moana Farmer's Market. Daughter Rachel Haili said her dad was more the PR man, while her mom had the business sense. "People loved coming and talking to them," Rachel Haili said. "They had a charge account for special customers who couldn't afford to pay. They knew some people lived from paycheck to paycheck and ... had kids and they needed the food, but payday was next week. So my dad would let them charge and they would come in and pay the next week." The girls were encouraged to follow their own interests and never forced into the business. But each wound up making Haili's Hawaiian Foods their career. "We always came back here because we didn't want it to close down," Rachel said. "And we enjoyed working together." Although she was Chinese, the elder Rachel Haili perpetuated the Hawaiian culture by sharing her knowledge of Hawaiian foods. She regularly provided the food for the old "Lucky Luck" TV show. "Mom made sure that we learned our Chinese traditions and culture," Alo said. "But because of the family and my dad, we had a good Hawaiian background. It was very important to her that we were proud of our Hawaiian heritage." Although work was very important to her, Rachel Haili enjoyed life. She often took her grandchildren on trips to China and Las Vegas. "If you're looking at what a successful person is, I think my mother would be a good example," Alo said. "She maintained her business life, but she also had a family life. It wasn't all material." In 1997, Rachel and her family were honored by the Native Hawaiian Chamber of Commerce with the O'o Award, which recognizes exemplary achievement in business, the professions and community service. Haili is survived by daughters, Donna Pang, Sandra Antone, Roberta Ahnee, Rachel, Lorraine Alo and Carol Ann Hirayama; 20 grandchildren; 32 greatgrandchildren; and three great-great-grandchildren. Helen Halm - Almost 50 years ago, Helen Halm grew a factory out of the back of her husband's accounting offices on Waialae Avenue with the help of her mother's recipe book and her family's labor. Today, Halm's Kim Chee is one of the island's most popular brands of the Korean favorite and will be the dish of honor at Halm's memorial service. Halm, who died Nov. 14, 2003 at her Honolulu home, was 85. "The reason she started (the business) was just to give her something to do," said Halm's son, Samuel. "It was hard work. She used all fresh ingredients (and) went out personally to talk to the people in the markets." Halm said he remembers himself and his sisters sitting in front of the television nightly while the factory was running and stripping codfish for use in his mother's products. Helen Halm's husband, children and sister also pitched in at the factory, he said. When the Halm family moved to Guam three years after the company was started, the kim chee factory and rights to the Halm brand were put on the market. The label was sold again in the 1980s and is now operated by Halm's Enterprise Inc. Owner Mike Irish said that even though the Halm's Kim Chee label has not been in the hands of its namesake for decades, having Helen Halm's brand on the shelves is "promoting her legacy." After six years on Guam, Halm returned to Hawaii but never went back to making kim chee for anyone other than family. Her son said that at one time she had hoped to start a brand of Korean-style hot sauce, but the plan never came to fruition. "Dad retired. He always like to be doing something and always had some clients on the side.

She would give him a hand." Irish said he met Halm twice over his more than a decade of the company's ownership. Both times, she came to tell him that "you're doing just fine," he said. "She was always happy and proud. I told her, 'You let me know, because that's your name up there." Halm is also survived by daughters Diane Murayama and Deborah Stolberg, brother George Chun, sister Nora Wesley, six grandchildren and eight greatgrandchildren. Services will be private. Clarence "Japan" Handa - Longtime Honolulu crime syndicate figure Clarence "Japan" Handa died Nov. 15, 2003 in Fort Worth, Texas. Handa, the father of three sons and a daughter, was 73. He died in federal prison. "He was an excellent father," said Howard Handa, Handa's son. "He was a quiet, humble man." Handa is best known for his 1988 testimony against California drug gang member Anthony Williams, who was convicted in the shotgun murder of undercover Honolulu police officer Troy Barboza. "My father said no outsider should come into town and kill a cop — get HPD out shaking everything up," Howard Handa said. Barboza had been a witness in a drug distribution case against Williams. The 24-year-old police officer was in his Manoa home when he was shot through the window on Oct. 22, 1987. In exchange for his testimony against Williams, Handa was given probation on a state court drug conviction. According to federal authorities, Handa, whose criminal career dated to 1962, had faced 46 different criminal charges over the years. He had been convicted of 16, and had been sentenced to one

year in jail. Howard Handa said many of the charges against his father were connected with gambling, which he said was his father's love. Not long after Williams' conviction in state court, Handa was arrested by federal authorities on drug distribution charges. According to federal documents, Handa had said he felt confident about continuing to sell cocaine because he did not expect to be "bothered by the cops" while he was cooperating in the case against a cop killer. But one of Handa's associates turned on him, cooperating with federal authorities to avoid a long prison term. Handa was convicted. In 1990, a visiting federal judge from California sentenced him to 30 years in prison without parole. Howard Handa said the prison term was tantamount to a death sentence for his father, who was in poor health. It took a while for the older Handa to realize he would never see the outside world again, he said. "It's not easy to accept that you're going to die in prison," he said. He said he was disappointed that his father's cooperation against Williams did not carry any weight 14 years later, when his father was dying of lung cancer and wanted to come home. "They must have really hated my father, huh?" he said. Handa is survived by his wife, Shirley; sons, Steven, Raymond and Howard; daughter, Karen; sister, Akiko; and six grandchildren. Patrick W. Hanifin - Honolulu attorney Patrick W. Hanifin, one of the key legal advisers behind federal lawsuits challenging Hawaiian entitlements, died Saturday June 14, 2003 after complications during heart surgery. He was 48. Hanifin was born May 7, 1955 in Honolulu, at the same hospital where he died, The Queen's Medical Center, said his younger sister, Teresa

Hanifin Wong. He was a graduate of Saint Louis High School (Class of 1973), the University of Notre Dame (1977, magna cum laude), Harvard Law School (cum laude, 1980) and the John F. Kennedy School of Government (1986). He worked at two local law firms before becoming a partner of Im Hanifin Parsons in 2000, his sister said. Hanifin represented 13 Hawai'i residents who in 2000 successfully sued to stop the state from banning non-Hawaiians from running for seats on the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. He then worked for plaintiffs who challenged the validity of Native Hawaiian programs. In March 2002, those plaintiffs filed suit against OHA and the state Department of Hawaiian Home Lands claiming they were unconstitutional race-based programs that discriminate against non-Hawaiians. U.S. District Judge Susan Mollway removed the United States as a defendant in the lawsuit in September, finding that the plaintiffs had legal standing as state taxpayers and could only challenge state money for the programs. At the center of the conflict, though, is who ultimately will control 1.4 million acres of former crown and government land returned to Hawai'i from the federal government when it became a state in 1959. H. William Burgess worked with Hanifin on the case, which was to have been heard in federal court yesterday. Mollway postponed the case until Sept. 8 after hearing Friday that Hanifin had driven himself to the hospital with chest pains, Burgess said. "He is one of the most brilliant lawyers I have ever met, but I don't think it will have any affect on the suit," Burgess said. "We will forge on. The suit, on the merits, is exactly the same." Kenneth Conklin was one of the 13 who sued in 2000. He called Hanifin "a fallen warrior" who believed in equality for all. His death leaves "a big hole" in the movement against entitlements, Conklin said. "The movement is larger than any one person but he knew all the issues," Conklin said. "He had a grasp of the big picture and the ability to argue the small details with great eloquence and persuasiveness." [Adv 17//06/2003]

Adm. Huntington "Hunt" Hardisty, who served as head of U.S. Pacific Command in the late 1980s and early 1990s, a time of tremendous change in the balance of power worldwide, died Oct. 1, 2003 in Hartford, Conn. Chris Hemmeter, the developer and dreamer whose name was synonymous with super-sized projects in the 1970s and 1980s and who became one of the most influential people ever to do business in Hawai'i, died Thanksgiving morning November 27, 2003. He was 64. Hemmeter — who last month said of his battle with cancer, "I can beat it by years" — died surrounded by relatives and friends at his home in Brentwood, Calif. Hemmeter was once as familiar in Hawai'i as any politician or entertainer. He was the state's first - and possibly last - businessman-as-celebrity, Hawai'i's own Donald Trump at a time when bigger was always better and excess was nothing to apologize for. He developed restaurants, retail stores, hotels and, eventually, such destinations as the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Waikiki and luxury resorts on Maui, Kaua'i and the Big Island. Mark Hemmeter said his father, who had fought Parkinson's disease and cancer since the mid-1990s, died peacefully and was not in pain. "He waited until Thanksgiving morning, which was his favorite holiday," said Mark Hemmeter, who heads Hemmeter Cos., based in Boulder, Colo. "It was a beautiful morning in Los Angeles and the whole family was around him. You couldn't pick a better way to go at home. All the children and grandchildren — everybody was in town." The developer considered Hawai'i home though he had been back only three or four times since he left 13 years ago. His last visit was in October, to celebrate his birthday with his family and Hawai'i friends. Christopher Bagwell Hemmeter was born in Washington, D.C., on Oct. 8,

1939, and raised in the San Francisco Bay Area. He graduated with honors from Cornell University with a degree in hotel management and landed in Hawai'i in 1962. He briefly accepted a job as a management trainee at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel, but soon resigned to pursue a dream of developing and owning resorts in the Islands. Those who knew him spoke of his infectious, fun-loving attitude. Mostly, though, they reflected on his vision and creativity. "I remember when the Hyatt Regency went up this very young man would talk to us about ideas he had that just seemed almost unbelievable," longtime friend and real-estate broker Cathy George recalled yesterday. "And then they always started happening. And you wondered, 'How did he do this one?' "And the projects just got bigger and bigger and bigger." Hemmeter's lavish — some would say ostentatious — projects in the 1980s came to symbolize the pinnacle of Hawai'i's 30-year economic expansion after statehood in 1959. His designs all seemed to grow bigger and more extravagant with each new deal, incorporating endless marble corridors, brass-plated adornments and splashing waterfalls. "Chris was a man of great vision and energy," former Hawai'i Gov. Ben Cayetano said vesterday. "More than anyone else, he changed the nature of resort development in Hawai'i." His projects helped publicize the state's visitor industry and attract high-spending Japanese tourists that fueled an economic boom. Hemmeter resorts, though criticized by some as gaudy and lacking in Hawaiian character, were studied by developers around the world for the room prices they could command. "In my mind he revolutionized the hotel industry — not only in Hawai'i, but in many parts of the world," said Larry Johnson, former chairman and CEO of Bank of Hawaii, and one of Hemmeter's closest friends here. "Each of the resorts he created was an experience, with unbelievable art, waterfalls, animals and birds," Johnson said. "He wasn't necessarily building for the upper crust, he was building for the average guy who really hadn't had a chance to experience these new and innovative things." In 1988, Forbes magazine named Hemmeter one of the 400 richest Americans, with \$225 million in assets. Although he had an affinity with the average Joe, he also hobnobbed with the rich, famous and powerful. He once said he wanted to be known as the "only person who rides in a Rolls-Royce in a dirty shirt, sweaty Bermudas and goes barefoot." "He was the kind of guy who could walk with kings and the common man," Johnson said. "He was a good friend of Jimmy Carter's, and Ronald Reagan stayed in his home. But he treated the hotel janitor the same as presidents." Before he began building hotels, Hemmeter thought he would make a name for himself managing them. Only months into the three-year program as a management trainee at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel, Hemmeter told the

manager he wanted to own hotels instead. Asked where he'd get the money, Hemmeter recalled responding: "I have no idea, but somehow I'll put it together. If I have to be a bartender or whatever, that's my goal, that's my dream, that's what I want to be." He quit, borrowed some money, and with partners developed two fancy restaurants, the Top of the I and Pier Seven at the Ilikai Hotel. He went on to develop more restaurants, which he reportedly sold for \$1.5 million in 1965. After an unsuccessful bid to buy the land under what is now the Sheraton Waikiki, Hemmeter partnered to develop the Hawaiian Regent Hotel, which opened in 1971. Then he persuaded Bank of Hawaii and a consortium of lenders to finance construction of the Hemmeter Center in Waikiki, which would house a Hyatt Regency hotel and various retail and commercial businesses. Opened in 1976 at a cost of \$100 million, the 1,260-room twin-tower hotel dominated Kalakaua Avenue and represented the largest construction project and private loan in Hawai'i. Hawaii Business magazine named Hemmeter its 1977 businessman of the year, and the developer went on to build more hotels with eye-popping excess in architecture, art, boat shuttles, waterfalls, pools, animal collections and other features. For his real-estate projects which included the Hyatt Regency Maui, King's Alley shopping center, the State Office Tower and renovation of the Armed Forces YMCA -Hemmeter's timing was generally impeccable. At the height of Japanese real-estate speculation in the late 1980s, he sold most of his properties for tens of millions of dollars over initial development costs. Hemmeter served on the boards of powerful organizations in Hawai'i, among them First Hawaiian Bank, Punahou School, the Hawai'i Visitors Bureau and Hawai'i Hotel Association. Hemmeter made unsuccessful bids to become a legislator, buy Hawaiian Airlines, acquire Bank of Honolulu, and rescue the World Football League. His fortunes ebbed and flowed in unison with Hawai'i's own. For three decades his financial ascent more or less paralleled that of America's newest state. Then, in 1990, as Hawai'i's economy was entering a protracted downturn. Hemmeter lost out on a billion-dollar plan to develop what would become Aloha Tower Marketplace. Angered and growing more disillusioned with the business climate in Hawai'i, Hemmeter left the state and would never again see the success he had enjoyed for nearly 30 years. Convinced his next fortune awaited him in New Orleans, he sold officials on the idea of leasing him city property to develop a \$1 billion casino. In 1997, after several years of financial struggle and the failure of more than one of his Louisiana casino investments, Hemmeter filed for personal bankruptcy. By the time of his bankruptcy, his health had begun to fail. He developed Parkinson's in 1995 and, after that, cancer of the liver.

Those who knew him said that up to the beginning of this month he believed he could beat cancer. But about two weeks ago he had begun to accept the inevitable. Hemmeter is survived by his wife of 25 years, Patricia; seven children, Mark and wife, Lisa; Chris and fiancee, Debi; Katie and husband, Cully; Kelley; Shane; Brendan and wife, Brook; and Holli; his sister Sally Younge and husband, Eric; brother Dr. Mead Hemmeter and wife, Mari-Jo; sister-in-law Karen Cook; and six grandchildren, Taylor, Maddy, Annabelle, Austin, Ryan and Quinn. George Herbert "Buck" Henshaw, a World War II prisoner of war who went on to become a set designer for TV shows including "Magnum P.I." and "Hawaii Five-0," has died. He was 85. Henshaw died Aug. 20 at The Queen's Medical Center, according to a news release from his publicist. The

Steve Hirano, a well-known political strategist, lobbyist and marketing professional, died Friday Dec 19, 2003 at his home. Hirano, 57, died of cancer. "He had his family around him from the time we brought him home," said his wife, Amy Hayashi Hirano. Hirano was highly respected as a lobbyist, and his political work spanned both major parties. He worked with Democrat John Waihee in his bid for lieutenant governor, and, in 1986, with Republican D.G. "Andy" Anderson in his race for governor. Anderson was defeated by Waihee. Both men remained close friends of Hirano, Havashi Hirano said. Hirano worked for five years with the Board of Water Supply as a consultant and a lobbyist, said Clifford Jamile, manager and chief engineer. "He was very energetic," Jamile said. "Extremely full of life. He was a guy who was full of ideas — wonderful ideas." Hirano's success as a lobbyist was tied to his credibility among lawmakers, Jamile said. "He had a unique ability to work both sides of the aisle in both houses," Jamile said. "He had tremendous credibility among legislators. They knew him, and they knew they could trust him. When he gave his word, he worked hard to see to it that any promises made were kept." Because Hirano embraced life so enthusiastically, Jamile said, his death was hard to accept. "He almost seemed invincible," he said. Hirano's marketing work paired him with a variety of companies. He recently helped Norwegian Cruise Line establish its presence in Hawai'i. Hirano preferred working behind the scenes, his wife said, but once, the near-invincibility that Jamile saw in him was demonstrated in a very public manner. In August 1994, Hirano was working as a publicist for a circus appearing at Blaisdell Center when a 9,500-pound elephant attacked and killed her trainer, then made a run for it. Hirano was trying to close and lock a gate when the elephant, Tyke, charged through, knocking Hirano to the ground. Hirano tried to roll out of the way, but Tyke pinned him with her feet and assumed the "killer pose," aiming her massive head at the man beneath her. Police fired their weapons at Tyke, momentarily distracting the elephant and allowing Hirano to escape as the animal fled toward Ward Avenue. The elephant eventually was killed. Hirano kept his fondness for circus animals, and later worked with Ringling Brothers, visiting an elephant-training facility in Florida, Hayashi Hirano said. "He came back energized because he saw the animals were well taken care of," she said. After escaping Tyke's wrath, Hirano began collecting elephant curios. "It was his way of saying he was alive, that everything was all right," Hayashi Hirano said. "He had stuffed elephants, carved elephants, glass elephants, pictures of elephants. ... "People would look at that and say, 'Are you nuts?' He'd just smile and say, 'I like elephants.' "He was a special guy," she said. "He didn't really want to go, but I think God had a greater plan."In addition to his wife, Hirano is survived by his children, James and Julie Hirano; stepchildren Stephanie Koester and Scott Hayashi; and three grandchildren. Jyun "Curly" Hirota, a former two-sport athlete and baseball coach at the University of Hawai'i and winner of four Japan World Series with the Tokyo Giants in the 1950s, died Sept. 10, 2003. He was 81. Hirota, along with Japan Hall of Famer Wally Yonamine, helped pave the way for Hawai'i's Japanese Americans to play professional baseball in Japan in the 1950s. In 1952, the Tokyo Giants acquired Hirota upon a recommendation by Yonamine, who played his first year as a Giant in 1951. Yonamine said

Hirota, who was nicknamed "Curly" for his curly hair, impressed the Giants with his toughness as catcher. "They really respected him," said Yonamine, who met Hirota when both played with the Asahi baseball team in the mid-1940s. "I remember, one time, the ball hit him in the finger and split his finger. They thought he had to rest because his finger was split. But he said, 'No, no.' He just taped it up and he played. Curly had a lot of guts." Yonamine said Hirota's success allowed more Japanese Americans from Hawai'i, such as Andy Miyamoto and Richard Kashiwaeda, to play with the Giants. "When I first brought players to Japan, I wanted to bring players that the team would respect so that we can bring other Niseis to Japan," said Yonamine, who is in Japan assisting with his wife's pearl business. "Curly was the first guy I brought to Japan. He did so well as a catcher — the people liked him and respected him — that's the reason why Andy Miyamoto and other guys had a chance." After graduating from McKinley High School, Hirota enrolled at UH in 1940. He played baseball and earned league all-star honors under coach Tommy Kaulukukui. When World War II started, Hirota joined the Varsity Victory Volunteers, a group of Japanese-American students who volunteered their services in support of the U.S. military in noncombative roles. Hirota played football for the Volunteers and baseball on the side. During the war years, Hirota played baseball for the local Athletics team (formerly called the Asahis) against military service teams. Because of the war, Japanese American baseball teams were prohibited from having Japanese names, and all football and baseball games had to be played during the day. Hirota played against Joe and Dominic DiMaggio, Joe Page, Joe Gordon, Walter Masterson, Charles Silvera and Walter Judnich in the eight-team league. After the war, Hirota continued his studies at UH as a scholarship athlete playing football and baseball from 1946 to 1949. In his final season, Hirota was selected co-captain of the UH football team. "He was a great football player and maybe an even better baseball player," said Dr. Richard Mamiya, a former UH football player (1946-50) who played with Hirota. "He was a running back. Curly was a little guy, but he was tough, tough, tough. By action, he was a leader." During the summer of 1948, under the sponsorship of Mackay Yanagisawa, the Hawai'i All-Star Baseball team and Hirota toured the Mainland playing against the Harlem Globetrotters. (Although famous for basketball, the Globetrotters also played baseball.) The Globetrotters and the Hawai'i team played 68 games in two months in such venues as Yankee Stadium, Polo Grounds, Crosley Field, Shibe Park and others. After graduating in 1949 with a business degree in economics, Hirota received an offer in 1950 to play Japan professional baseball for the Tokyu Flyers. Hirota declined the offer for family reasons. In 1952, he accepted an offer to play with the Tokyo Giants and narrowly missed out as Rookie of the Year. As the starting catcher, he saw the Giants win the Central League Championship and the Japan World Series in 1952, 1953, 1954 and 1955. Some of his teammates were Yonamine, Kashiwaeda, Bill Nishita, Douglas Matsuoka and Miyamoto. Hirota ended his career with the Giants in 1956 with a career batting average of .260 and four Japan World Series. On his return to Hawai'i, Hirota worked 13 years with Bishop Trust Co. while coaching the Asahis. In 1965, 1966 and 1967, under athletic director Young Suk Ko, Hirota coached the UH baseball team. In 1970, Hirota became the farm team manager of the Japanese professional baseball team Kintetsu Buffaloes and led the farm team to its first championship in 23 years. Hirota returned to Hawai'i in 1973 and worked as the assistant events manager and then events manager for Aloha Stadium. He also served as the U.S. scout and representative for the Kintetsu baseball organization. Hirota retired from Aloha Stadium in 1994. Hirota was born in 'Ewa Beach. Emily "Honey" Ho, mother of entertainer Don Ho and boss of the roughand-tumble nightspot in Kane'ohe where he got his start, died Tuesday Jan 14, 2003 night of natural causes at Castle Medical Center. She was 90. Honey Ho became a legend from Waikiki to Las Vegas as a wise, earthy woman who critiqued her son's performances and mothered his show business friends. She was born Emily Silva in Kaka'ako on July 18, 1912, one of eight children of a clerk in the military warehouse on Ala Moana near the present location of Restaurant Row. Her father brought home damaged canned goods to supplement his salary and to help feed his family. Nicknamed "Honey" as a baby, she kept a pet duck, picked kiawe beans for pin money, worked in the Dole Cannery and sang in the Kawaiaha'o Church choir. She remembered visits by her glamorous aunt, Emily Porter-Akau-Stupplebeen-Conradt, known as the "Songbird of Hilo." She was underage when fell she in love with James Ah You Puao Ho and had to get permission from her mother to marry. She said the couple walked from her house to the church for the ceremony on Dec. 24, 1928, then to the house of his parents to live. As their family grew, the Hos' scant income forced them to move frequently in search of housing they could afford. Don Ho remembers helping his mother feed pigs in Wai'alae. The family moved to Kane'ohe when a job presented itself. A schoolteacher's husband had invested in a combination gas station, icehouse and café on Lilipuna Road and the teacher asked Honey Ho if she would run the restaurant on school days until classes let out. With no experience, Honey took charge serving Hawaiian food and her special hamburgers. Business quickly improved. In 1939, James Ho urged his wife to take over the lease and name the place "Honey's." The family lived in a room behind the kitchen. The boys slept in the garage. As Kane'ohe grew, Honey's became a neighborhood landmark, attracting lines of customers and especially soldiers from the nearby Marine base during World War II. James Ho kept an iron pipe wrapped in newspaper behind the bar to stop fights. When Honey banished somebody from the bar, the offender would usually return the next day begging to get back in and she would relent. "Running a business like Honey's, you can always spot those who are unhappy," Honey Ho said in a 1971 interview with the Honolulu Star-Bulletin. "They pull the label off the Primo bottle while they talk, they fidget, and sometimes they try to drink too much. I try to help, to get them in a happier mood." Business was so good that in a few years the operation was moved to a larger building on Kamehameha Highway. Profits from the restaurant enabled Honey and James Ho to buy their first house, which became a second home for friends of her son Don while he attended Kamehameha Schools and the University of Hawai'i. In 1959, the failing health of his parents forced Don Ho to cut short his career as an Air Force officer and return to Honey's to take over the bar. His entertainment career began when he started playing his electric organ and singing behind the bar. By 1961, Don Ho was in Waikiki, on his way to stardom. Honey's closed in 1976 and was torn down to make room for an ice cream parlor. James Ho died in 1977 at the age of 70. Honey Ho is survived by her brother, Manual Silva Jr.; children, Doris Castro, Donald, Ben and Dennis Ho, and Keala Ho-Dwyer; 23 grandchildren, 40 great-grandchildren and 10 great-greatgrandchildren; and nephews, nieces and friends whom she considered 'ohana. John C. Hodel, former longtime editor of the Raleigh Register, died after a fall at his home in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii Jul 10, 2003. He was 83. Leroy Holley, a bar operator and friend for decades to Hawaii union members, business executives and politicians, died June 1, 2003 in his

Kailua home. Holley, 74, was known as a politically connected lobbvist, although he always avoided that term, preferring to be known as just a local guy who could help people get things done, mostly for the good of working people. He knew sailors, longshoremen, fighters and some gangsters as well as politicians and business tycoons because of his role as owner of Smith's Union Bar, a Hotel Street watering hole populated by a wide representation of Honolulu society. It was also something of a sanctuary. If you knew Leroy, or his wife and bartender Gail, trouble simply would not follow you in from the street. The word apparently was out that you don't mess with his friends. He was a storyteller, a generous host and, yet, with all his connections, a man whose name seldom appeared in the press. Friends recall that Holley was "quiet and effective" long before Gov. George Ariyoshi used that as his campaign slogan. James Burns, a judge on the Intermediate Court of Appeals and son of the late Gov. John Burns, said Holley was "a real local boy who had many friends in all different places." "Leroy had just lots of local connections on both sides of the street," labor and business, Burns said. "In fact, all sides of the street." Some of the characters were considered shady, or worse. Holley was just a friend to them all and "for the working man," Burns said. One of the rare times Holley got publicity was in the early 1990s when he hit the news as a self-described close friend of Charles "Charley" Stevens, an alleged organized-crime figure who was convicted of murder in 1979, a conviction later overturned. Holley told the Honolulu Advertiser that he stopped meeting Stevens after the FBI questioned him about his friend. Tony Rutledge, president of labor unionrelated nonprofit Unity House, said Holley was a friend of working people. "He was always ready to listen and help. He helped resolve a lot of problems behind the scenes. He was just a friendly guy. "When you work in a bar, you get to meet a lot of people and make a lot of friends. He was genuinely an honest, straightforward guy," said Rutledge, whose father, Arthur Rutledge, once worked as a bartender at Smith's Union when Holley's father ran it. Neil Dietz, Honolulu port agent for the Seafarers International Union, worked closely with Holley when Holley was a consultant for the nowdefunct American Hawaii Cruises, whose ships were manned by SIU workers. "His style of operation is from a generation we will never see again," Dietz said. Dietz said he has heard many lobbyists and political proponents of businesses over the years say they were promoting a position to create jobs and do good things for local residents. But he said he felt Holley was the most genuine of them all, helping the cruise line because it provided local jobs. American Hawaii Cruises gained from Holley's influence in the state Legislature, since he persuaded politicians year after

year to keep in place a special exemption for American Hawaii so it did not have to pay a state tax normally applied to transportation businesses. Holley was born in Honolulu and educated at the Saint Louis College. He was a merchant mariner after World War II and cruised the Pacific. He went to work at Smith's Union Bar, which had been opened by his father, Joe Holley, and married bartender Gail. They sold the bar in 1994. Gail died in 2000. Holley was a member of Gov. Burns' "kitchen Cabinet" and knew a lot of people, daughter Gailene Holley said. He once told Chip Carter that his father, Jimmy Carter, might win the race for president "since no one was paying much attention to him," she said. Gailene also believes her dad was the "Chinatown oddsmaker" often quoted anonymously in the media for his election predictions. Holley is also remembered as a guy who loved dining out and was always quick to invite friends to join him in Honolulu's best restaurants. Gailene said, "He loved a good meal and once boasted that the last time we ate at home was 1974." Information about survivors was not available, and services are pending. [SB 07/06/2003]

Hardy Hutchinson III, a former newspaper reporter, radio personality and lobbyist for many organizations, died May 6, 2003 in Hilo. He was 74. Hutchinson was executive director of the Hawai'i Automobile Dealers Association. He also represented the Hawai'i Farm Bureau, Hawai'i Fresh Milk Industry and Hawai'i Cable Television Association, and was a familiar

figure at the Legislature, where he lobbied on behalf of these groups. Longtime friend Walsh Hanley said Hutchinson was one of the best lobbyists in the state. Hanley is the past-president of the HADA and owns several dealerships on the Big Island and Kaua'i. "The way Hardy was the most effective lobbyist was he knew everything that was going on in the Legislature. He knew who the key players were on everything," Hanley said. "He could really get a sense for what was going to happen." Hutchinson argued against proposed taxes that the industry felt would hurt consumers and auto dealers. As spokesman for the Farm Bureau, he fought water-rate increases that would affect farmers. But Hutchinson also fought for measures that he thought would help the community. In 1988, he was presented the Traffic Safety Now Distinguished Service Award as the principal lobbyist for safety-belt legislation in Hawai'i. "Quite often, there is legislation that goes in that the legislators don't really understand the implications of, so the idea of an association was to get them the facts," Hanley said. "Hardy made sure they decided based on the facts, and he was very effective with that." Hutchinson was born on May 4, 1929, in Oakland, Calif. His family moved to the Big Island when he was 3. Hutchinson graduated from Hilo High and attended the University of Oregon and University of Hawai'i. He worked at radio stations in Hilo and later in Honolulu. Key to Hutchinson's effectiveness at the Legislature was his ability to keep track of bills, his knowledge of the committees and how they would handle bills, Hanley said. "He knew all the players and what they were playing," Hanley said. Hutchinson's lobbying expertise extended to Congress, where he showed Hanley the ropes when he began work for the National Automobile Dealers Association. Born May 4, 1929, in Oakland, Calif., Hutchinson moved with

his family to Hilo when he was 3. He attended Hilo High School, the University of Oregon and the University of Hawaii. Over the years, he moved back and forth between Oahu and the Big Island. Hutchinson worked at KGMB radio and KGMB-TV, and was a stringer for the Star-Bulletin's sports department. He also worked for a Big Island newspaper and radio stations. Along with Frank Valenti, he "re-created" baseball games in the days before live broadcasts. "They would do things like hit pencils against the microphone and have reel-to-reel tape with background sounds," said former wife Shirley Hutchinson. "It was up to the broadcasters to elaborate. When things were slow coming over the teletype, they would have continuous foul balls." Hutchinson also worked for Kamehameha Schools in public relations and was active in the community and in civic clubs. Among other things, he helped get Kalaheo High School established in Kailua, said Shirley Hutchinson. He also served as former president of the Hawaiian Civic Club of Kailua, Oahu. Hutchinson is survived by wife Ellie; sons Hardy IV, John and Kihei Hutchinson and Gustav Beckert; daughters Kilani Hutchinson, Napua Froman, Daphne Fabisiac and Peni Bechert-Wong; grandchildren; and great-grandchildren.
