Kekoa David Kaapu - Great things were expected of Kekoa David Kaapu, a protege of both the late Gov. John Burns and former Honolulu Mayor Frank Fasi. "If he had stayed where he was supposed to have stayed, he would have been governor in our state," said Eileen Lota, a former city clerk when Kaapu was on the Honolulu City Council who had known him since his family lived in an old-style Hawaiian grass home among the taro patches in Punalu'u. Kaapu died of unknown causes at his Mo'ili'ili apartment on Wednesday Oct 15, 2003 at age 66. Kaapu never reached the lofty political heights predicted for him. But he left behind a loyal following of supporters

who admired him for his patriotism and unwavering convictions, his endless string of fights on behalf of underdog causes and his stubborn belief that good could come from an act as simple as handing out a plumeria to a stranger. As recently as Tuesday, Kaapu was in the news, filing a lawsuit seeking to block a new bus fare system planned by the city on the grounds that it was done improperly and without proper input from the public. "He was just interested in public issues," said Jim Hall, a longtime friend who helped Kaapu with the bus lawsuit. "But he wasn't the type to go organize a campaign committee or fund-raiser. He'd just get petitions. He'd hang around the university or the community and say, 'Hey, this is important.' " Other movements he was involved in included the successful effort to save the Honolulu Star-Bulletin and the failed attempt to get then-Councilman Andy Mirikitani recalled. He also questioned the policies of Bishop Estate, which operated Kamehameha Schools, his alma mater. He was born Feb. 2, 1937, in Honolulu. As a youth, he spent weekends earning spending money by sewing and selling coconut hats to tourists in Punalu'u. He attended Harvard University through a Navy ROTC scholarship and later was commissioned as an officer in the U.S. Marine Corps, serving as an aviator and an intelligence officer. In 1962, at 25, he ran unsuccessfully for the state House of Representatives but caught the eye of Burns, who tapped him to be an administrative assistant at \$8,000 a year. Two years later, the Democrat won a seat on the City Council. When then-Mayor Neal Blaisdell chose not to run for re-election in 1968, Kaapu left the Council to challenge for the city's top post only to lose to Fasi, his former Council colleague. Kaapu supported Fasi in the general election. And when Fasi became mayor, he appointed Kaapu as a deputy managing director and urban renewal coordinator for the city. Kaapu, however, resigned from the administration in 1971 to run against Fasi. The parting left a deep rift between Kaapu and Fasi, who was accused of planting a spy in Kaapu's housing agency office. Kaapu returned to the Council in 1975 and became the head of a subcommittee charged with investigating alleged impropriety involving the city's Kukui Plaza project. When he announced in summer 1976 that he would be running for mayor and switching parties to become a Republican, he was ousted from the chairmanship of the Kukui committee as well as his post as vice chairman of the Council. "He was a conscientious public servant," Fasi said. "Sometimes we didn't agree, though. I'm sorry to see he's gone. He did what he had to do. He was a likeable person, and he had a good sense of humor also. We lost someone who helped build the present state of Hawai'i." Kaapu's political career went into a steady decline after leaving the Council in 1979 despite his being a perennial candidate for a variety of different seats. "He was just a

little anxious," said Lota, the former city clerk. "But he was that kind of boy, though. He wanted to move ahead as fast as he could." Ever the optimist, Kaapu said in 1971: "Success in elective politics is not beyond reach even when facing a million dollar war chest and a formidable political machine. In our democratic system, the individual voter still decides the outcome of elections no matter how much is spent to influence his thinking and to manipulate his actions. The voter is always capable of making up his own mind after considering the issues if they can be properly presented." Through the defeats, Kaapu maintained a sense of civility. He would show up at the campaign headquarters of those who vanquished him and offer his support. Councilwoman Ann Kobayashi, who beat Kaapu in 2001 for the Council seat she now holds, described him yesterday as "a sweet, kind man" and "a gentleman." In later years, Kaapu was often seen wearing a Harvard T-shirt, shorts, sneakers without socks and a flower in his ear. He earned a reputation for handing plumeria blossoms to strangers he would bump into at the supermarket, on TheBus, or on the sidewalks. Ron Lockwood, chairman of the McCully-Mo'ili'ili Neighborhood Board, said whenever his wife returned from shopping around the neighborhood wearing a flower in her ear, "I knew exactly who she had bumped into. He was just one of those pleasures in life that are now gone."

Abraham "Purple" Kahui - Hawai'i lost a piece of aloha last week. Another former beach boy has died. Abraham "Purple" Kahui, 74, was born on Ni'ihau and raised on Kaua'i, said his widow, Max Kohn Kahui. The couple was married in 1985 and lived in Punalu'u. Kahui died March 4, 2003 at Castle Medical Center of complications from surgery for lung cancer. Kahui was a Waikiki beach boy in the late 1940s and '50s, Max Kohn Kahui

said. He also was a retired mason. Kahui was at home in the ocean and was among the regulars who swam near arriving ocean liners in Honolulu Harbor and dove for coins that the tourists would throw, she said. He was a champion canoe paddler and bodysurfer who got his nickname in the 1940s from a tourist, she said. "Some girl said, 'You're so dark, you must be purple,' " she said. "And it stuck." Kahui said her husband's epitaph should say he never met a stranger. "He loved people," she said. "He would go up in an elevator and meet people. Some of them are still his best friends." One of them was Canadian resident Jacqueline Wilson. She and her late husband, Don, met Kahui on the beach in 1963 during their first trip to Hawai'i. The Wilsons were standing on the beach as a pair of beach boys named Happy and Papa Dave sang and strummed their ukulele. All of a sudden, Kahui had his arms around the couple's shoulders boasting he could out sing the other men, which he did. They had been friends ever since. They drank beer every afternoon at 4 p.m. They closed down the Barefoot Bar some nights. Kahui taught the Wilson children to surf and once, when he arrived for a three-day visit in Canada, he stayed for three years. "His heart was just as pure as could be," Jacqueline Wilson said. "He enjoyed everything." Except getting dressed up. "He would wear only shorts and most of the time, he would hardly wear a shirt," said Lynn Burns, one of Kahui's sisters. "He was a very simple guy, a simple man." Max Kohn Kahui met the beach boy in 1960 shortly after arriving in Hawai'i. They even talked of marriage, but that didn't happen until 25 years later. They traveled a lot, she said. Australia, New Zealand, the Caribbean. In London, they went to see "Les Miserables." "He couldn't stand it because he had to wear a jacket," she said. "He went into the lobby where they had a pub, and they had it on television there. He liked it then because he could take his jacket off and drink beer." Hiram K. Kamaka, whose political career took him through a wide range of elected and appointed posts, died Dec. 18, 2003 in Honolulu. He was 76. Former Gov. George Ariyoshi first met Kamaka in 1954 when the young attorney, just out of Creighton University law school, volunteered to work on Ariyoshi's first campaign for the territorial House of Representatives. Kamaka won his own House seat in 1958. He retired as a lawmaker in 1968, but that was only the first of several "retirements." Almost immediately he was called back by Gov. John Burns as budget director, Ariyoshi said. "I don't think he played much," Ariyoshi said with a laugh. "He was a really hard worker. "In addition to being very competent, he was a very nice, very decent person. He was very low-key, and everybody liked him." Kamaka sought the mayor's seat in a three-way Democratic primary race in 1980 with Frank Fasi and Eileen Anderson. Anderson went on to win the general election. But when Fasi unseated Anderson four years later, the mayor appointed Kamaka to serve as budget director, even though the cost of the campaign had driven Kamaka to file for bankruptcy. Kamaka's debts didn't worry Fasi, who at the time called his appointee "the best budget director available anyplace in this state." Kamaka held various posts under Fasi, including a 1986 appointment as parks director. The administration refused demands from the citizens' group Common Cause Hawaii that Kamaka's résumé be made public; Kamaka later released it. Kamaka continued his law practice between political jobs. In 2000, he represented Dream Cruises Inc. in the company's 2000 tangle with the city Liquor Commission over its sale of liquor to minors. His other activities included service with Little League and rodeo associations, as well as boards of the Queen Lili'uokalani Trust, the Central YMCA and the Oahu Bowling Association. Kamaka is survived by a sister, Alana Kamaka, and a brother, Terence Kamaka. Kanemi Kanazawa - Cards and pictures covering a bulletin board in the waiting room of Kanemi Kanazawa's office testify to the meticulous dental care he provided for generations of patients. The longtime Honolulu dentist, former detective, military intelligence officer and war veteran died Saturday Nov 1, 2003 at his son Peter's home. His 87th birthday was today. "The night before he died, we all went for trick-or-treating, wheeling him around

(in a wheelchair)," his son said. "He really lived a full life." Kanazawa and his twin brother, Kinji, who died Oct. 8, 2003, were the last of seven children born to Sakijiro and Haru Kanazawa. They grew up in Moiliili, attending Kuhio Elementary and Washington Intermediate Schools and McKinley High School. Kanemi took premedicine at the University of Hawaii where he and his brother won gold medals for being the best soldiers in ROTC. He was active in sports, including wrestling, soccer and rowing. After graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1939, Kanazawa became a detective in the Honolulu Police Department. He and other detectives, including former Gov. John Burns, were assigned to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for counterespionage investigations before World War II. Kanazawa joined the U.S. Army Dec. 15, 1941, and was commissioned as a captain from the ROTC when the 442nd Infantry Battalion was formed. Because of martial law, he had to ask permission to marry a "native," and he and Harumi Hanada, of Maui, were married March 8, 1943. He served as a military intelligence officer in the Counter Intelligence Corps. He also served as an infantry unit commander in Europe and the Pacific before he was discharged as a captain in 1946. He was wounded twice and hospitalized in France and England. After the war, Kanazawa worked his way through Northwestern University dental school in Chicago, supporting his wife and two children. He returned to Hawaii in 1953 and opened his dental practice. He was in the same office at 1415 Kalakaua Ave. for at least 45 years. Peter Kanazawa joined the practice in 1989 and has continued it since his father retired in April. Patients remember Kanemi Kanazawa's keen interest in discussing current events and other topics while their mouths were full of instruments. Children were treated to a gentle tweak on the nose when he finished. Peter Kanazawa said he sees gold crowns and other work done by his father 30 or more years ago: "You know if they're not done right, they wouldn't last. "More than the things I learned from him was being able to practice with confidence that there was a guy next to me with that much experience who could bail me out," he said. "That allowed me to maintain a large range of dentistry." Kanazawa was president of the Honolulu County Dental Society in 1964, the Hawaii Dental Association in 1968 and the Hawaii Service in 1970. He was a member of the Hawaii Dental Association Board of Trustees and House of Delegates from 1969 to 1984. The Hawaii Dental Association gave him a Distinguished Service Award in 1987 as "one of the wisest leaders of our association who has been the stabilizing force for many years." He served as an instructor at Northwestern University, the University of Hawaii, Kapiolani Community College and St. Francis Hospital. He was first

chairman of the Division of Stomatology of the John A. Burns School of Medicine. He received the Distinguished Service Award of the Hawaii Society of Dentistry for Children in 1968 and was awarded many fellowships for his leadership and service. Over the years he was active in Boy Scouts, the Moiliili Community Center and the Language School. He was an active member of the Moiliili Hongwanji Mission, serving in various positions on the board of directors. Survivors include another son, Chris, also of Honolulu; a daughter, Lisa Mizono, of San Francisco; six grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren. Ann Kang, a longtime Iolani School teacher who pioneered the school's girls athletic program and became a pillar in Hawai'i's vast but tight-knit volleyball community, died Monday Jun 30, 2003 night at Straub Hospital. She was 47. Kang, the former Ann Goldenson during her University of Hawai'i volleyball playing days (1976-77), had been suffering from amyotrophic lateral sclerosis for the past 19 months. The incurable affliction, commonly known as "Lou Gehrig's Disease," attacks nerve cells and pathways in the brain and spinal cord. The result is a loss of muscle control and movement. A fund-raiser for Kang last November generated \$125,000 toward her medical expenses. But the disease accelerates quickly, and many patients succumb within two or three years of diagnosis. Kang coached her final season last fall with the help of a custom-made cane, and she had been wheelchair-bound since early this year. Cathy Lee Chong, Iolani's director of communications, said Kang was on campus Monday but later developed breathing problems. She died "peacefully" with her family and close friends at her side, Chong said. "It's a huge loss to high school volleyball, and to the volleyball world in general," said UH coach Dave

Shoji, who recruited Kang from a California junior college. "Anybody who knew Ann understood that with her, everything is for the kids. Iolani will get another volleyball coach, but they will never truly replace her." Kanoe Kamana'o, the 2001 Advertiser State Player of the Year, played four years for Kang at Iolani and will enter this fall as Shoji's top recruit. "Mrs. Kang was an inspiration for everyone on and off the court, because she repeatedly told us to have fun and 'spread the smiles,' " Kamana'o said. "She was a fighter, but even after a bad play she kept smiling. The one thing I'm happy about is winning the state championship, because nobody can ever take that away from her." As a Rainbow Wahine player, Kang helped UH to its first 20-win season in 1977, when it finished as the national runner-up. As a coach at Iolani, she helped launch the school's girls athletic program after 115 years as an all-boys institution and guided the Raiders to their first state volleyball championship in 2001. "When people think of Iolani volleyball, they think of Mrs. Kang," said Chris Blake, who will take over Kamehameha's volleyball program after assisting Kang for three seasons. "That's a tribute to what she's done there." As an organizer, Kang founded and then ran the prestigious Iolani Invitational for 20 years. Featuring top high school girls teams from Hawai'i and the Mainland, it still is considered the state's premier preseason volleyball tournament and is the only tournament of its kind in any girls sport here. "Dozens of college players have gone through that tournament, and they always were treated very well by Ann," Shoji said. Kang's legacy, however, most likely will live in the hundreds of lives she touched as a teacher and coach at Iolani, where she spent 24 years. In Kang's first year there, Iolani had a limited number of girls only in grades 7 and 9, and in those early times she coached volleyball, basketball, softball and swimming. And Kang, believed to be Iolani's first female physical education teacher and coach, immediately adopted the school's "One Team" philosophy, passed down through the generations from Father Kenneth Bray in the 1930s. The belief is that no player is more important than another, and every action should serve the team as a single unit. In practical terms, "One Team" also means if one player is given a lei or carton of juice after a game, then everybody should get one. And if one person doesn't get the lei or juice from his parents, then nobody gets one. "I was a team captain and played on junior national and national teams, but I've also been the last sub," Kang said last October. "I know how important each player is, and I try to treat everyone the same." From those humble beginnings, Kang aided Iolani's development into a power in almost every girls sport, as evidenced by four state championships in 2001-02. "On the girls side, she just came aboard and took charge," said Eddie Hamada, the

former athletic director who hired Kang. "She knew her stuff, and she grabbed it and didn't take one step backward. She saw the boys program and wanted the girls to be in line with it, and now we are very proud of our co-educational program. Ann was a big part of that." Hamada, an Iolani icon who played for Father Bray, said Kang epitomized the "One Team" mantra. "She grasped it right away and always kept that in mind," Hamada said. "That helped so much, because just saying it is not enough, and sometimes people go their own way. To know that she believed in it and was a part of it, well ... we were so happy to have her. She'll always be in our hearts and minds." Kang is survived by husband, Alan; a son, Barry; a daughter, Marci; mother, Joyce Goldenson of Huntington Beach, Calif.; brothers Craig Goldenson and Bruce Goldenson. ELIZABETH KALILI KAUAHIPAULA, the longest serving pioneer kupuna in the Department of Education's Hawaiian programs, died Sunday June 8, 2003 after a brief illness. Kauahipaula, who worked until this year in the Waiiau Hawaiian Language Immersion Program, was 88. Kauahipaula, who worked until this year in the Waiiau Hawaiian Language Immersion Program, was 88. She was the oldest continuously employed kupuna in the Leeward district and possibly the state, said Kalani Akana, a colleague. Kauahipaula often rose at 4 a.m. to catch the bus to school. "In her capacity as kupuna, she has influenced and taught countless numbers of children and teachers," Akana said. "What was once her humiliation became her honor." Kauahipaula was once banned from speaking her native language in the classroom. When she was a child, her knuckles were struck with a ruler till they bled, then she was placed in a corner of the classroom or made to wear a dunce cap for speaking Hawaiian, Akana said. Kauahipaula, like many others of her generation, received only an eighth-grade education, but those who knew her said she was a born teacher. "Teaching was her life's work," said Akana. "Seeing the children blossoming and proud to speak their language was what she lived for." She never dreamed that her skill in the native language, once the object of scorn, "was something that she would later want to be proud of," he said. Kauahipaula was a Hawaiian-language

specialist at Kamehameha Schools and also volunteered to teach Hawaiian and the Hawaiian culture at the Anuenue Hawaiian Language Immersion and Samuel Kamakau schools. Kauahipaula also taught at the Queen Lili'uokalani Children's Center in Wai'anae and Central O'ahu, at several hula halau and at her home. "It's a great loss to our Hawaiian youth," said Hailama Farden, a Hawaiian language teacher who first met Kauahipaula when he was a fourth-grade pupil some 25 years ago. Although Kauahipaula was born on O'ahu, she spent most of her childhood on the Big Island with her parents, David Kapu Brown and Lizzie Kalili Kaeha. Many of those school days were in Waiakea, where her father built the family house on homestead land. It was a rural existence where the only place to find running water was a nearby stream. "She wanted to share the culture because that's how she grew up," Akana said. "People like myself had to go to school to learn what she actually lived." Kauahipaula was a very simple person, yet very deep in her thoughts and ideas, said Melelani Pang, the president of 'Ahahui 'Olelo Hawai'i. She was always telling students, "Mai hilahila," which means don't be ashamed, Pang said. "It was such a general statement but when she said it, different people could have different perceptions," Pang said. "To her, that statement held not only for language, but also for culture, lifestyle and who you are as an individual." Kauahipaula and others like her are hard to replace because of their extensive influence on the lives they touched, he said. "Kupuna was like my hanai grandmother," Farden said. "She encouraged me to become a teacher and to share the language." One of Kauahipaula's greatest desires was to see the Hawaiian language become the first language for Hawaiians, he said. She also wanted Hawaiians to know their culture and their history. Kauahipaula accomplished some of these goals by teaching and also by serving as host of the longest-running Hawaiian language TV talk show, "Manaleo," which airs on Channel 53 at 7 p.m. Saturdays. The program's mission is to perpetuate the Hawaiian voice for generations. Kauahipaula was also a board member of 'Ahahui 'Olelo Hawai'i, the state's only Hawaiian language association, as well as a consultant to Ka Haka'ula a Ke'elikolani Hawaiian Language College in Hilo. Wilfred N. Kawamura, founder and chief operating officer of the popular W & M Bar-B-Q Burger in Kaimuki, died Thursday Oct 16, 2003. He was 86. W & M is a landmark on Wai'ala'e Avenue, with the sweet smell of its flame-broiled hamburgers seducing passing motorists and pedestrians. Although parking is limited, W & M draws loyal customers, as well as first-time patrons who are enticed by word of mouth. Kawamura said he got into the food business after an acquaintance

opened a milk stand and thought a hamburger stand would make a good neighbor. After five years, the Kawamuras moved to their first Kaimuki location, at Wai'ala'e and Ninth avenues. But the couple lost their lease and closed the diner 20 years later. Three years after that, a new eatery was opened at its present spot next to City Mill. Ito Kinase of Kane'ohe, the oldest known person in Hawai'i and one of the oldest in the world, died Friday Jan 24, 2003. She was 113. Kinase endured a World War II internment camp, outlived two husbands and beat cancer twice. She was always willing to try new things, including marijuana at 80 years old, horseback riding at age 90 and a hike up Diamond Head at 100. Born in Japan on Dec. 31, 1889, Kinase arrived in San Francisco in 1916 when she was 27. The new wife of a railroad worker from Pasco (now

Lavey), Wash., she had refused to be a picture bride and insisted on seeing the man she would marry. Her family later moved to Redmond, Ore., where she operated a truck farm and raised five children. Kinase moved to Hawai'i in 1961 with her second husband to help care for one of her grandchildren. Kinase's daughter, Joyce Iwamuro of Kane'ohe, once described her mother as strong-willed and a survivor who adopted the American lifestyle but never learned to speak English. According to the Gerontology Research Group, which registers seniors over 110 years old, a 115-year-old Japanese man is the world's oldest person. Following him on the list were 10 other people, including Kinase, registered at 113 years. The rankings can change as more people are documented. Kinase was listed as the sixth-oldest person in the United States. Interviewed last year at 112, Kinase expressed surprise that she had become one of the nation's oldest people. Fusayo Koike, whose Japanese-language show was a fixture on Maui's radio waves for nearly 50 years, died Monday Jun 30, 2003 at Maui Memorial Medical Center. She was 93. "The Yamato Program," featuring Koike and her husband Haruo, provided music, news, death notices, information on club activities, and live interviews with visiting entertainers and officers from Japanese training ships that called at Kahului Harbor. The program first aired on KMVI in 1947, at a time when members of Maui's Japanese community were still unsettled over wartime accusations questioning their loyalty. The Koikes reassured the community that it was OK to reconnect with their heritage, said the couple's daughter, Claire Ching of Wailuku. "I think they filled a gap after the war for the older people, many of whom were plantation workers," she said. "During the war they couldn't speak the language. They were afraid to speak it." When her

husband died in 1977, Koike continued the program another 17 years, and was honored with a proclamation signed by President Ronald Reagan in recognition of having the longest-running ethnic radio show in America. "That was our bible. It was the only communication we had with the Japanese people of Maui," said Masa Hokama, owner of Hokama's Music, a longtime Wailuku business that advertised on "The Yamato Program." "We didn't have a Japanese-language newspaper. It was the only way to get information on obituaries and all that was going on in Maui's Japanese community. She did us one good job. Everybody loved her." Koike was born Feb. 23, 1910, in Keahua Camp on Maui. In 1942, when she was pregnant with her second child, her husband, a scholar and Japanese language teacher, was held at an internment camp on Maui and later transferred to a camp in New Mexico. "She had no idea whether he was alive or dead," Ching said. Koike moved in with her parents and was working at a plantation store when Haruo returned home after three years of internment. In 1947 she was offered a job as a radio announcer at KMVI. "It was something she was completely untrained for," Ching said. A couple months later, Haruo joined the show, and the Koikes were on the air six days a week. They were responsible for the entire program, including writing the scripts, selling ads and handling the technical aspects of the broadcast. They often brought their two children with them to the station. "I don't know how she did it, but she learned how to operate all that equipment," Ching said. They also appeared at many Japanese cultural events. When the Maui County Fair was held at the old Kahului fairgrounds, the Koikes hosted a popular song contest. After Haruo died, the radio show became too much for Fusayo to handle alone, and it was cut to two days a week, and then to Sundays only. She retired in 1994 at age 84. "I used to have her station on all the time. I loved her Japanese program," said Susanne Hotta, owner of Gilbert's Formal Wear, another longtime Wailuku business that advertised on "The Yamato Program." "She always told about who died, what was going on with Japanese cultural things. All the Japanese used to listen to her." Hokama said Koike was one of his best customers, accounting for four pages in the music store's sales ledger. She was also his best promoter, he said. When listeners would call to find out about the songs she played, Koike referred them to Hokama's Music. "She was my No. 1 saleslady. I just loved her," said Hokama, who would bring Japanese recording stars to the radio studio for interviews. Koike also compiled tapes of Japanese songs that are used today for o-bon dances on Maui. Her voice can still be heard on the tapes introducing the songs. Services will be at 4:30 p.m. Sunday at Wailuku Hongwanji Mission, with a reception to follow. Nakamura Mortuary is

Auntie Alice Kuloloio, a revered kupuna and healer who spent much of her later years engaged in Native Hawaiian activism, died Tuesday Jul 22, 2003 morning at her Kahului home. She was 88. Kuloloio joined with young activists to support Native Hawaiian causes that included the movement to stop the military bombing of Kaho'olawe, protests against the closing of Makena Road by developers, and concern over the unearthing of mass burials for a resort at Honokahua. Auntie Alice offered her support, wisdom and spiritual inspiration at a time when it was unpopular for elders to get involved, said Dana Naone Hall of Hui Alanui O Makena. "She was the best," Hall said. "She offered us the foundation for so many different kinds of things we did." Kuloloio was born Nov. 24, 1914, in Pa'uwela, Maui. She worked for Maui Pineapple Co. for 35 years. She was taught by her mother to identify la'au lapa'au, or medicinal herbs, by the pattern of their veins. Along with the late Uncle Harry Mitchell and the late David Ka'alakea, Kuloloio founded La'au Lapa'au O Maui to help perpetuate the Hawaiian healing art. Over the years, she served on the boards of numerous Hawaiian organizations, including the Council of Hawaiian Elders. She was also named to the first Maui County Cultural Resources Commission. "She was so well known on Maui," Hall said. "She could hold her own with (former Maui Mayor) Hannibal Tavares. She could be seen scolding (Maui County) Council members." Services have yet to be announced. [Adv 24/07/2003]

Alice Ka'ohiki Ahuna Kuloloio, a spiritual leader for many Hawaiian activists on Maui since the mid-1970s, died Tuesday Jul 22, 2003 morning at her home in Kahului. She was 88. Born in 1915, Kuloloio was a cannery worker at Maui Pineapple Co. for 35 years and a United Church of Christ deacon for more than 30 years. Hawaiian cultural specialist Charles Maxwell Sr. said Kuloloio had a wealth of information about native customs and spirituality and shared her knowledge with younger people. Maxwell said he often turned to her for spiritual advice in determining the protocol for reburial of the remains of hundreds of native Hawaiians at Honokahua in West Maui in the late 1980s, after a developer had uncovered them during a resort project. "There's nobody on Maui that is equivalent to her," Maxwell said. Kuloloio also supported the endeavors of young people who formed the Protect Kahoolawe Ohana in the mid-1970s, a group that wanted the Navy to

halt the bombing of Kahoolawe. Her single-story, tin-roof home on Maalo Street in Kahului frequently became a place for meetings and overnight stays for Ohana leaders. She also backed the native Hawaiian group Hui Alanui O Makena in its successful fight for the continuation of beach access at Makena, despite a resort developer's initial objections. Hui Alanui member Dana Naone Hall said Kuloloio had a way of speaking to people, including Maui County Council members, that enabled them to listen to her criticisms. "She could scold the Council members, but she did it in such a loving way, they couldn't do anything but accept it," Hall said. Hall said Kuloloio's support meant a lot to Hawaiian activists who quite often faced initial opposition from the community. Friends said Kuloloio turned to prayer and focused on developing the spiritual strength in people. "She was a foundation for a lot of what we did," Hall said. Protect Kahoolawe Ohana member Colette Machado, a state Office of Hawaiian Affairs trustee, said Kuloloio was one of the few kupuna on Maui to initially support efforts of young Hawaiians to halt the Navy's bombing of Kahoolawe and reclaim the island. The Navy is scheduled to return Kahoolawe to the state for civilian use in November. "She was her own person. ... She will be sorely missed," Machado said. Kuloloio is survived by her daughters Comfort M. Sado and Justine K.M. Wallace, sons Wallace E. "Mogie" and Leslie A.A. Kuloloio, 17 grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren. DAVID MAKAHANOHANO KUPELE was a child of the streets who became a man of God. Many knew him as a Waikiki entertainer during the 1950s and '60s, a singer/composer who wrote the oft-performed "Lehuanani" and who appeared with legendary baritone Alfred Apaka. But his family and friends also remember his gritty beginnings and his gentle final years. Kupele, whose middle name means "majestic eyes," died May 14, 2003. He was 81. Services will be held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at Hawai'i Kai Baptist Church. Kupele was born in the Hansen's disease settlement at Kalaupapa, Moloka'i, the first of 12 children whom his father, a permanent resident there, helped deliver, said Kupele's youngest daughter, Kealani Gillis. Right away, health officials took the infant to O'ahu, where he lived with a succession of relatives and on the streets, "living off his wits," Gillis said. As a teenager he returned to the settlement to live with his parents and work as a cowboy for territorial officials. Gillis isn't sure when, but at some point her father taught himself the musical skills he used as a performer. He was a

bass player who also played 'ukulele and sang. He got his musical start in the late 1940s. While serving with the merchant marine in California he joined a Hawaiian band that played Sandy's 5-Mile House in Sacramento, Gillis said. In the early '50s he was back in Honolulu, playing at Harbor Tavern with a band called Hawaiian Chimes. He went on to write "Lehuanani" to help a friend mark the first birthday of her daughter, as well as "Birds of Paradise," "Four Lovely Dolls" and "Mu'umu'u Built for Two," which debuted in the Hilton Hawaiian Village Tapa Room with two dancers wearing an oversized mu'umu'u. As a member of Apaka's group, which was adopted by industrialist Henry J. Kaiser, he performed throughout the Mainland and Canada. "He was always full of energy," Gillis said of her father. "When he was with Alfred Apaka, he was always the one with all the energy making jokes in the background." He was "tough," she said, a former reserve police officer who would ultimately retire from the public defender's office. In 1973, Kupele was involved in a head-on traffic collision and, while recovering, found religion. He began going to church and wrote religious songs, Gillis said. Ken Newman, retired pastor of Hawai'i Kai Baptist Church, knew Kupele for about a dozen years. Newman will give the eulogy on Saturday. He called his friend "a man after God's own heart." "He was very gentle, loving, compassionate, always concerned about others," Newman said. "He was our greeter at the door where people came in. After a while I began to call him Mr. Aloha. That describes him pretty well." Sometimes, Kupele played 'ukulele or sang during the services. And for years, Kupele and fellow church member Asa Yoshimoto regularly visited incarcerated youth offenders, Newman said. "A lot of young people, their lives were changed by that," Newman said.
