John "Jack" H. Magoon Jr., chairman of Hawaiian Airlines for 25 years and a member of an influential kama'aina family, died yesterday November 24, 2003 in Honolulu. He was 87. Magoon became president and chairman of Hawaiian in 1964 after gaining majority ownership from Honolulu financier Harry Weinberg. He remained president for about 18 years and continued as chairman until 1989. To Hawaiian Airlines, Magoon was a "friend and father figure to many in our company," helping shape the airline over one-third of its 74-year history, according to a written statement from the company. "It is with deep sadness that the Hawaiian Airlines 'ohana learned of the passing of Jack Magoon today," the company said. "Under his guidance, Hawaiian spread its wings across the Pacific and became an increasingly important player in Hawai'i's tourism-based economy. "Perhaps more than any other individual, Mr. Magoon defined Hawaiian as an airline distinct in the world by the character of its people." During his tenure, Hawaiian expanded beyond its role as an interisland airline and started

flying to the Mainland. It became a subsidiary of HAL Inc., and in 1987 developer Christopher Hemmeter offered to buy the company for \$100 million, or \$50 per share, but he pulled back after the October 1987 stock market crash. In 1989, Peter Ueberroth and J. Thomas Talbot led a group acquiring a controlling interest in Hawaiian. In a previous interview, Magoon noted the airline's gross revenue increased from \$5 million to \$375 million while he was chairman, though it also went through periods of losses. Magoon was born in Honolulu on Dec. 2, 1915, and went to Punahou School, graduating in 1933. He lived near Diamond Head with his wife at the time of his death. Family members said he will be remembered for his long tenure and influence at Hawaiian and for his trademark attire. "He was known for wearing his seersucker suit," said son-in-law Peter Dudgeon. "He had five or six." At various times, Magoon was on the board of directors of family real estate investment firms Magoon Estate Ltd. and Magoon Brothers Ltd., his own real estate holding company Hawaiian Securities & Realty, as well as Hawaiian Trust Co. Ltd. and First Insurance Co. of Hawaii Ltd. He was a board member of Kapi'olani Medical Center, landowner Castle & Cooke and other organizations. Before buying a majority interest in Hawaiian Airlines, Magoon ran a laundry business in Hawai'i. He also invested in a laundry business and bowling alley on Maui. After leaving Hawaiian, he invested in Coffees of Hawaii Inc. on Moloka'i. Elizabeth Puanani Kalolo Makia -- She was one of the early "hula maids" of New York City, a Maui girl who learned to dance professionally in the Big Apple. But everyone knew her as "Auntie Betty" and today they are mourning her death. Elizabeth Puanani Kalolo Makia died July 2, 2003 in New York. She was 88. Makia was the matriarch of the Hawaiian entertainment community on the East Coast for decades, family and friends said "Everyone knew her," said her daughter-in-law, Lynn Makia. "She was the epitome of true aloha, in her generosity, her love, her faith, her caring and her giving. She never said a bad word about anyone. Auntie Betty did not know how to dance when she moved to New York in 1938, following her husband, musician Sam Makia. Other hula dancers from Hawai'i taught Makia and she started dancing in 1940 Makia danced in the Hawaiian Room of the Hotel Lexington from 1947 to 1958. She performed with Hal Aloma, Johnny Pineapple and dancers Tutasi Wilson, Napua Wood, the Mossman sisters and Momikai Alair Adria Imada, who filmed a documentary on Makia, called her "a natural performer. "She was somebody who had this

incredibly warm and sassy demeanor," Imada said. "Even though she stopped dancing professionally in 1958, she was just a natural. Whenever the camera rolled, Makia's face lighted up and she danced, Imada said. Imada said Makia loved being around young people and worked until age 85 at a fast-food chicken restaurant in Greenwich Village called Pluck University. "We filmed her at Pluck U.," Imada said. "She loved being busy. She wasn't even deterred by having to take two buses to get to work every day." Makia loved New York City and considered it her home. She and her husband lived a few blocks from the Hotel Lexington. The couple always opened their home during the holidays to former Hawai'i residents and entertainers. Christmas Eve was a big event with beautifully wrapped gifts freely handed out and plenty of food. Makia had two sons, Leonard "Sonny" Makia and Leonard "Spike" Makia. Sonny died in 2001. Frank J. Manaut, who rose from management trainee to lead Hawai'i's largest financial institution through the 1980s, died early yesterday October 19, 2003 in his Portlock home after struggling with Alzheimer's Disease. He was 79. Manaut, who had been head of Bancorp Hawaii Inc. and its Bank of Hawaii subsidiary, died at 12:01 a.m. He had been diagnosed with Alzheimer's when he left the bank's board of directors at age 70. Manaut tried to remain active on several other community boards but resigned from them all within a few years, Manaut's son, Peter, said yesterday. "It's been a long, slow progression," Peter Manaut said. "The last three, four, five years, he'd been at home under full-time care." Before then, Manaut was a vigorous member of several organizations, which included the Hawai'i Business Roundtable, Pacific Basin Economic Council, East-West Center Foundation and Chamber of Commerce of Hawai'i. He was a trustee of the Nature Conservancy of Hawai'i, financial vice president of Punahou School, a board member of the Honolulu Academy of Arts, director of The Queen's Medical Center and a member of the finance committee of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Honolulu. Among his many honors, the Honolulu Elks Club gave Manaut its "Citizen of the Year" award in 1985. In 1989, the Aloha Council of the Boy Scouts of America honored Manaut as its "Distinguished Citizen" of the year. Manaut was born in 1924 in Alhambra, Calif., and graduated from UCLA, Harvard Business School's Advanced Management Program and the Pacific Coast Banking School. During World War II and the Korean War, he served as a Navy officer. Manaut's career with Bank of Hawaii began in 1950 when he was hired as a management trainee. Within four years, Manaut was branch manger of the Waipahu, Kaimuki and Ala Moana branches. In 1961, he became assistant to then-president Rudolph Peterson. By 1971, Manaut was in charge of all general banking and in 1976 rose to the title of president of Bancorp Hawaii Inc. and Bank of Hawaii. Jean Singlehurst Mason was partially paralyzed with polio as a young woman, but life in a wheelchair didn't daunt her. She became an activist on behalf of disabled people, lobbying for removal of barriers and creation of handicapped parking stalls more than 30 years ago. "As a member of the Governor's Committee on Employment of the Handicapped, you have helped lay the groundwork for many of its programs and objectives," said then-Gov. George Ariyoshi in a 1976 proclamation. "You have performed a very valuable and commendable service to the people of Hawaii, especially during the committee's formative years." Born in 1926, Mason died Monday April 14, 2003 in Straub Hospital at the age of 76. She was born in San Francisco and grew up in Hawaii, the daughter of the late Thomas and Carol Singlehurst, a co-founder of Carol & Mary clothing store. She worked as personnel administrator in the shop and, after moving to California in 1976, was employed in the Hewlett Packard corporate office in Palo Alto. She returned to Hawaii in 2000 after the death of her husband, Dr. Carl Mason. She contracted polio in 1954. She was named Hawaii Polio Mother of the Year in 1956. She served as chairwoman of the Committee on Architectural Barriers for Abilities Unlimited in 1970 when it was concerned that Aloha Stadium be built with access for the disabled. She was a volunteer fundraiser for the March of Dimes. Mason attended Punahou School, Palo Alto High School, Dominican College and was a graduate of Stanford University. She is survived by son Michael; daughters Lynn Mason Haia and Jeanne Chasey; sister Gay Singlehurst Fraser; and six grandchildren. Burial will be private. Jean Singlehurst Mason contracted polio when she was 27, but she didn't let that stop her from raising a family and becoming a leading advocate for people with disabilities. Mason, who was active in the community despite being in a wheelchair for most of her adult life, died Monday April 14, 2003 after a brief illness. She was 76. Longtime friend Alice Guild said Mason lived life to its fullest. "For 50 years she lived life and viewed life from a

wheelchair, but in all of the years that I knew her she never missed anything because of being confined to a wheelchair," Guild said. "She worked hard most of her life and she certainly threw herself into causes for the physically handicapped." Lynn Mason Haia said her mother "was a rare woman who took on the challenges of adversity and created a remarkable life." Mason, a Punahou alumna, received a degree in psychology at Stanford University, where she met her husband, Carl Mason. The couple moved to Honolulu where Carl Mason began his internship at The Queen's Hospital. In 1954, just a year after their son was born, Jean Mason was diagnosed with paralytic polio. Mason spent eight days in an iron lung. She survived the polio and gave birth to two daughters during her rehabilitation. In 1956, she was recognized as the Hawai'i Polio Mother of the Year for her "remarkable courage against overwhelming odds." "She went from almost total paralysis to the point where she was driving a car and taking care of her children and having a family. But it didn't happen overnight," Guild said. Mason worked as personnel administrator in her family's Carol & Mary store. In 1970, she served as chairwoman of the Committee on Architectural Barriers for Abilities Unlimited, which researched and reviewed provisions that would help the new Aloha Stadium meet the needs of disabled people. Mason also lobbied for parking stalls, curbs, ramps and smooth sidewalks to accommodate disabilities. In 1976 the Masons moved to California, where Jean Mason worked for Hewlett Packard. Since her retirement, she served as a patient advocate for Stanford Hospital. After her husband died in 2000, Mason returned to Hawai'i. "I don't think she felt that she had been cheated in any way. She honestly felt that life had been good to her," Guild said. "She had a great sense of humor, never felt sorry for herself and really was a wonderful example to people to really be grateful for what they have and to maximize their opportunities." Mason is survived by her daughters, Jeanne Mason Chasey and Lynn Haia; son, Michael; six grandchildren; and sister, Gay Singlehurst Fraser. Private service have been held. Bat Moi Kam Mau, 97, known around the world for her local-style manapua, died April 4, 2003. She co-founded the Char Hung Sut dim sum restaurant and created the larger "Hawaiian-size" manapuas, her family said. "That name was synonymous with gifts always taken to neighbor island people," said family friend Blossom Tyau, who was raised on Maui. "All ethnic groups ... stopped there to take home boxes and crates of manapua to share." Bat Moi's son Harry said the buns his mother made were very lean.

"She used the best pork she could get and twice cooked it. That's why no more grease. People would take our buns all over the world. ... It can travel good. They're still doing it all the time." His mother was born in Yin Jai Boo village in Chungshan, China, and met her husband, Harry Marn Sin Mau, when he was visiting from Hawaii. As was customary at the time, their meeting and marriage were arranged by the village matchmaker, who was her husband's cousin. The couple came to Hawaii when she was 15, and she worked on his family's farm at Atkinson Drive and Ala Moana, raising flocks of ducks and three children. She began working at Dole Cannery when her children were older, making candied apples for military forces. The job was declared "essential for the war effort" in World War II. After the war, she learned to make dim sum, bite-size Chinese dumplings of pork, taro, chicken, shrimp and spices. They were so popular that she opened the Char Hung Sut Restaurant in 1946. She began work at 2 a.m., preparing dim sum ingredients before opening for business before dawn. The store was open every day of the year and served jook (Chinese rice soup) until 10 p.m. "I don't know how she did it," said Harry Mau. "Back in those days, we had sit-down service and a lot more items on the menu. Somehow, Mom was able to get by on just three or four hours of sleep every night." She created the "big Hawaiian-size" manapuas and char siu manapua, he said. "We island people, we love to eat." Manapua, or mea ono puaa ("mea ono" for cake or pastry, and "puaa" for pork) was what native Hawaiians called pork buns, or char siu bao, popular on dim sum menus. The buns sometimes are filled with coconut, black bean paste or chicken, but char siu pork has always been the favorite, Mau said. "Now lots of places super-size them," he said, "but back then everyone made them smaller." When she retired, he said, "we stopped doing a lot of things. We served the best duck noodles in town, but we stopped that because Mom didn't cook anymore." However, she would still drop by the restaurant on her way to play mah-jongg and sit at the table and make pork hash and half moons, he said. The family-operated restaurant still opens at 5:30 a.m. but no longer has table service. It only does takeout, closing at 2 p.m. and taking Tuesdays off, he said. Mau said his mother went to China regularly to pay respects to ancestors during Ching Ming, and she enjoyed visiting Las Vegas and Macao. "People know her. She's famous. They would see her up all night playing blackjack in a gambling hall." She is survived by two sons, Harry and Clarence, both of Honolulu; daughter Anna Mau, of Los Angeles; a sister, Mary Kam Lee, of Honolulu; six grandchildren; and 11 great-grandchildren. Letuli Olo Misilagi also known as "Freddie Letuli," --Paramount Chief Letuli Olo Misilagi, father of Samoan fire knife dancing and a community leader, died Tuesday Jul 22, 2003 in Honolulu. He was 84. Letuli, known as Talking Chief Olo, spread Samoan culture to Hawaii and the rest of the world. He was in Polynesian films. Letuli also served two terms as an American Samoa senator from Leone, working to keep drugs out of the community. "To me, Talking Chief Olo personifies what a Samoan chief is all about (by) the way he lives, his home and cultural knowledge," said Gus Hannemann, liaison and consultant to the American Samoan Senate. "Samoan people love him because of his love for his people," he said. Between tears, Cha Thompson, of Tihati Productions, said: "Chief Olo was a person -- and I mean this with every ounce of respect and aloha -- who could ride with the high and could crawl with the low. He was a man of humble beginnings but had a huge heart and was very funny." Born in 1919, Letuli was renowned in his younger years for his fire knife dancing abilities and was instrumental in organizing the World Fire Knife Competition, said photographer and longtime friend Barry Markowitz. "The culture of Samoa

and the favorable view of Samoa have been greatly furthered by his fire knife dancing," he said. His dancing ability even got him the nickname Fred Astaire, said Thompson. PAUL MARUO MIWA, the first chancellor of the University of Hawai'i-Hilo, died March 25, 2003 at the Hilo Medical Center. He was 82. Miwa, the son of a Honolulu farmer, graduated from Mid-Pacific Institute in 1939 and worked for his father until he enlisted in the Army in 1943. He saw service in India, Burma and China before going to Japan with occupying U.S. forces in 1945. He was awarded the Bronze Star for exemplary service during ground combat in Burma, and remained with the civil intelligence section of the Far East command after the war. He attended Doshisha University in Kyoto, and earned bachelor's, master's and doctorate degrees from Syracuse University, where he was a professor of Afro American affairs, director of the Peace Corps Training Center and consultant to the New York State Education Department. He served as deputy director of research and special assistant to the mayor of Syracuse from 1957 to 1963. In 1967, Miwa was named assistant vice president for academic affairs of the State University of New York at Albany, but returned to Hawai'i in 1970 to become chancellor of the UH-Hilo campus. "Paul Miwa was also a 'local boy' who, no matter how good he had it made" on the Mainland "felt the tug of these incomparable islands," UH President Harlan Cleveland said after recruiting Miwa. For many years he was UH's point man at the Legislature. Miwa

resigned as chancellor in 1975 to return to teaching, eventually was named acting chancellor at West Oahu College, and served as acting chancellor for that and the Hilo campus simultaneously beginning in 1984. He joined the cabinet of Big Island Mayor Bernard Akana in 1988 as deputy director of research and development, but resigned a year later for health reasons after suffering a heart attack. He was president of the Hawai'i Division of the American Cancer Society, a member of the MIS-CBI Campaign; Elks Hilo Lodge #759; 2-10 Golf Club; and the Piihonua Houselots Kumiai and Community Association.
