JY DIN SAKYA, founder and abbot emeritus of the Hsu Yun Temple in Nu'uanu and a venerated teacher to thousands of Hawai'i's Chinese Buddhists, died March 13, 2003 after a long illness. He was 85. Yellow banners inscribed with couplets of Chinese poetry in his honor have begun arriving from all over the world at the temple on Kawananakoa Place in Nu'uanu. Chanting of sutras for his safe passage into the Western Paradise began the moment of his death and will continue at the temple pending funeral services Sunday at Borthwick Mortuary. Sakya was born Nov. 17, 1917, in the river town of Shao Guan in Fujian province, China, to a well-todo family engaged in building materials and vegetable sales. His horoscope reading at birth said he would become a high-ranking military officer and die at age 30, but an inspirational meeting with the Zen master Xu Yun led Sakya into a religious life. He survived both the Japanese invasion of China in World War II and the Chinese Communist attacks on religious activities thereafter. Sakya excelled at a six-year primary school and the Roman Catholic Li Qun secondary school, was admitted to a three-year college at age 17, and — despite the astrologer's warning — planned to enter Chiang

Kai-shek's military school, Whampoa Academy, in Canton. It was then, in 1934, on a holiday visit with other teenagers to Nan Hua Monastery, that Sakya first met Xu Yun. "Something happened to me when I looked into his face," Sakya wrote later in his book, "Empty Cloud, The Teachings of Xu Yun." "I suddenly dropped to my knees and pressed my forehead to the ground, kowtowing to him. My friends were all astonished. I had never kowtowed to anybody in my life." Xu Yun encouraged to become a priest at the temple, where he was ordained in 1937. Sakya said Xu Yun asked him to carry his teaching to the Territory of Hawai'i, where Chinese immigrants for years had been petitioning for a monk to teach Buddhism and establish a temple. Sakya moved to Hong Kong in 1949 and began immigration procedures which would bring him, alone and ignorant of English language, to Honolulu in 1956. The Chun Hoon family made space available for his teachings at a School Street property, and by 1965 — after fund-raising efforts that included using borrowed pots to boil peanuts for sale — the landmark Chinese-style temple was built on Kawananakoa Place. For Hawai'i's faithful, temple board member Jeanne Lum said, Abbot Sakya "was Buddhism personified. "His major principle was to accept things, and he never complained, never scolded or got angry at anyone, and always believed that if you would just do kindness to a bad person the person gradually would change," she said. His stoic acceptance of whatever happened in life was summed up in the Chinese word "ren," meaning fortitude, Lum said. But Sakva also "showed when he was happy. He would kind of laugh, and he had a wonderful smile." Abbot Sakya retired at age 80 and was succeeded by Abbot Fat Wei, but continued his work at the temple, and was still copying handwritten sutras into Chinese characters on his computer daily until shortly before his death, she said. There are "tears of sadness" at the temple now, Lum said, "but we are not supposed to show that; we are supposed to let him go." Traditional Buddhist services will be held at Borthwick Mortuary from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Sunday, followed by a funeral drive past the temple and back to the mortuary, where refreshments will be served. The abbot's remains will be returned to the temple following cremation on Monday. [Adv 21/03/2003]

Paul Scheuer, a longtime University of Hawai'i professor who pioneered a new branch of marine chemistry, died Sunday Jan 12, 2003. He was 87. Scheuer joined the UH chemistry department in 1950 and became one of its most prominent and distinguished members. He published hundreds of scientific papers, brought in millions of dollars in grants, and created the branch of chemistry for which he became known as "the father of marine natural products." Scheuer was the first chemist to chronicle the compounds produced by sea life. He studied the molecular chemistry of coral reef organisms, and isolated and tested compounds for their potential use by the pharmaceutical industry. "He is the person who should be credited with putting this department on the map," said Roger Cramer, a chemistry professor and former chairman of the department. Although Scheuer's research work was unparalleled at the university, possibly his greatest contribution was his influence on generations of chemistry students who went on to establish careers of their own. One of his students was Joyce Tsunoda, longtime chancellor of the university's community colleges and now vice president of international education. Tsunoda was a 19-year-old sophomore at the university in 1957, and like many women of Asian ancestry at that time, she was headed for a career in teaching or nursing. But after taking one of Scheuer's courses, she had a life-changing experience. "I happened to enroll in Paul Scheuer's introduction to organic chemistry, and it was so fascinating that I changed my major," Tsunoda said. "I ran away from the College of Education and went into majoring in chemistry and went on to get my doctorate." Tsunoda said Scheuer helped her get a scholarship and provided her with encouragement and support throughout her career. He also became a great friend, she said. "There are good researchers and there are good teachers, but it's not very frequent you find a person who excels in both. And that's what Dr. Scheuer was," Tsunoda said. Scheuer officially retired in 1985, but he continued to work in his Manoa campus office until late last year. Jonathan Scheuer said his father published more than 100 scientific papers after he retired. Scheuer was born on May 25, 1915, in Heilbronn, Germany. A Jew, he fled from his native country during Hitler's rise to power and headed for the United States. He started as a tannery apprentice and sorted and packed calf and sheep leather. He began his chemistry career when he took night classes to understand the process that changed cowhide into leather. Scheuer earned his undergraduate degree at Northeastern University and did his graduate work in organic chemistry at Harvard. In addition to his son Jonathan, Scheuer is survived by his wife, Alice; daughters, Elizabeth Carlson and Deborah; another son, David; grandson, Joshua; and sister, Ruth Rosenstack. Toyo Shirai - With the death of Toyo Shirai last Thursday at the age of 87, Hawai'i lost of one its golf Hall of Fame legends. Shirai's accomplishments were many: A first-rate golfer who played in two U.S. Opens. A golf instructor who patiently and kindly taught hundreds of youngsters including his three sons. Among his students were Guy Yamamoto, who won the 1994 national public links championship, and David Ishii, winner of the 1990 Hawaiian Open and one of Hawai'i's premier golfers who went on to become among the all-time career money leaders on the Japan tour. A high school golf coach at Kaua'i High. A head professional and superintendent, both at the same time, at the Wailua Golf Course on Kaua'i from 1946 to 1965. A self-taught golf course architect who turned Wailua into one of the top 10 municipal courses in America, according to Golf Digest, by designing the entire back nine and renovating some of the holes of the original nine-hole

layout. The United States Golf Association has been so enamored of Wailua that it selected the course to be site of three U.S. Men's Amateur Public Links Championships (1975, 1985 and 1996), the most of any venue in the 78-year history of that national event. Frank Hannigan, a former USGA executive director, said a claim can be made that Wailua is the finest publicly owned golf course in the United States, thanks to "Toyo Shirai, a man of exceptional talents and devotion to the game." "Toyo did a heckuva job, and Wailua speaks for itself," added long-time friend Art Fujita. Golf notwithstanding, Shirai's first priority always was his family. "I guess I'm a true golf widow now," said his wife, Yoshie, who was at his bedside at home when he died peacefully nearly six years after he suffered a debilitating stroke. But she had never really been a golf widow in their 57 years of marriage. She was Toyo's constant companion everywhere, including the years when his Kaua'i High School golf teams traveled to the other islands for competition. She was a "golf mom" to many of Kaua'i's top players including Ishii, Guy Yamamoto, George Yamamoto, Del-Marc Fujita, Deron Doi, Jonathan Ota and Tommy Hines — looking after them, even to the point of making sure that they had only 14 clubs in their bags. Yoshie, though, did not see her husband play in his two U.S. Opens — 1948 at the Riviera Country Club in Los Angeles when Shirai and Guinea Kop became the first Asian Americans to compete in the national championship, and in 1949 at the Medinah Country Club near Chicago. She had just given birth to their first child, Martha, when Shirai saw Ben Hogan win at Riviera. When she retired after teaching 31 years at Farrington High School, Martha Shirai took piano instead of golf lessons. But she did try the game. "I still have my clubs in the closet," she said. Her three brothers — John, Sam and Arthur all played high school golf for their father. "John was probably the best of the three," Yoshie said. An Air Force retiree who now lives in Honolulu and works at Barbers Point, John Shirai represented Hawai'i along with Charlie Barenaba in the 1968 U.S. Junior Amateur at Brookline, Mass., qualifying for match play before losing in the second round. He also reached the 1976 Manoa Cup semifinals. Sam Shirai still lives in Lihu'e, where he works for the State Department of Health. Arthur Shirai, an Air Force Academy graduate who served in Bosnia and Serbia, resides in Kent, Wash., and is a dispatcher for Alaska Airlines after retiring from the Air Force. They were all like brothers to Ishii, who first took lessons at the age of 5 from Shirai. "I used to spend most of my time during the summers and weekends at Wailua with (Shirai)," Ishii said, from Japan. "Everybody on Kaua'i, anybody who ever golfed in Kaua'i, he helped. He was always available to talk about golf. His biggest thing was patience. He never lost his temper, never got angry.

He was a real soft-spoken person," Ishii said. The two kept in touch even when Ishii played for the NCAA champion University of Houston golf team. "David would write Toyo letters five pages long," Yoshie said. Guy Yamamoto, New Ewa Beach Golf Club's general manager and another of Shirai's Kaua'i High standout golfers, said, "As kids, we just knew him as Mr. Shirai, our coach and teacher. But as you grow older, you appreciate his accomplishments as you get to know more about him. They were huge. And he played in two U.S. Opens." Playing at Riviera and Medinah gave Shirai some ideas on designing golf holes, according to Yoshie, who met her husband in 1946 when he took the job at Wailua after moving from the Waialae Country Club, where he rose from barefoot caddy to become an assistant pro. BENJAMIN SIGAL, a pioneer in Hawai'i labor law who also was a tenacious fighter for the civil rights of the underprivileged, died March 12, 2003 in Honolulu. He was 96. Sigal was born March 27, 1906, in Philadelphia. He earned his law degree at Harvard Law School and established himself as a top labor attorney on the East Coast. He moved to Hawai'i in 1966 and became a partner in the law firm Shim, Sigal, Tam & Naito. Sigal quickly became one of the top labor lawyers in the state. He represented numerous unions, including the Honolulu Symphony musicians, University of Hawai'i Professional Assembly, the Hawai'i Government Employees Association and the Professional Air Traffic Controllers' Organization. Sigal also was a board member of the American Civil Liberties Union of Hawai'i and played a major role in determining how ACLU cases were handled. Intermediate Court of Appeals Associate Judge Dan Foley was the ACLU's first staff attorney in 1984. He called Sigal his mentor. "The early civil rights lawyers in this state were really the labor lawyers. These guys were combination labor/civil rights advocates so they were really pioneers," Foley said. "I remember his passion and commitment and single-mindedness as far as the working person, the underprivileged minorities. "He was very forceful, he was committed, he was very focused," Foley said. "He knew how to mix it up. He always had an opinion and wasn't shy about giving it." Raymond Tam was a law partner with Sigal for 20 years. "The one thing I remember about him was he's a fighter, but he always played by the rules," Tam said. Harold Silva coached two league football championships at Kahuku High in the 1950s, but his biggest impression was left on those whom he coached and taught. Silva, who also coached football at Iolani School, died Aug. 18 at Maui Memorial Hospital. He was 80. "I think about him all the time," said Leo Reed, who played for Silva's first championship team in 1956. "They don't make coaches like Harold Silva anymore. He cared about his players, not like when you go up to college, where it's like a meat factory. He cared about each player." After graduating with a teaching degree in 1950 from the University of Hawai'i, where he was a tackle on the football team for coach Tommy Kaulukukui, he taught at Iolani School. He was appointed football coach several games into the 1952 season to fill in for the legendary Rev. Kenneth A. Bray, who became ill and retired from coaching. Silva would coach Iolani through the 1955 season, compiling a 17-17-4 record. In 1956, he transferred to Kahuku. It didn't take long for him to make a difference. He guided the Red Raiders to the Rural O'ahu Interscholastic Association title that year. The season before, Kahuku was 1-9. He also led it to the 1959 title. He coached at Kahuku through 1962, compiling a 43-23-2 record in his

seven seasons. Reed, head of the Teamsters motion pictures division in Hollywood, said Silva was a disciplinarian. "He was a perfectionist," Reed said. "Everything was 100 percent. Even when we broke the huddle, we sprinted to the line." Silva also left an impression on the North Shore's youth. Junior Ah You, a 1968 graduate of Kahuku, used to watch Silva conduct Red Raiders practices when he was in grade school. "As a young kid watching practice, I was in awe," Ah You recalled. "He also was my history teacher. He had a tremendous influence on my life. The way he coached, he was like a general on the football field." Silva later became athletic director before becoming a counselor at McKinley from 1966 to 1975. He went on to be a counselor at Niu Valley Intermediate and later at Kaimuki Intermediate before retiring in 1980, serving 23 years and nine months in the Department of Education. Silva was born in Wai'anae, where he attended elementary and intermediate schools before attending Saint Louis College. He was drafted into the Army and served in Europe during World War II. Silva is survived by his wife, Betty; son Harold; and brothers, Adrian and Albert. Services will be held at the Diamond Head Mortuary from 10 a.m. to noon on Sept. 28. [Adv 16/09/2003]

Harold Silva - The coach responsible for putting Kahuku High School on its successful football path will be missed by his former players. Harold Silva died Aug. 18 on Maui at age 80. "He was the Vince Lombardi of Kahuku," said Junior Ah You, a former Red Raiders standout who went on to star in the Canadian Football League. "He's the guy who started it all." Ah You was younger than high school age the first time he saw Silva coaching at Kahuku, but he was struck by Silva's "demeanor and decorum." "He was strict at times and some players at first thought he was being mean, but he wasn't that at all," Ah You said. "Even guys he was hard on all learned to respect him." After coaching at Iolani, Silva came to Kahuku for the 1956 season and the Red Raiders immediately won the Rural Oahu Interscholastic Association championship after placing last the year before. "I was a freshman in 1955 and we went over to play Kauai High," said Ronald Akiyama, a four-year player who Silva switched from fullback to quarterback in 1956. "They only weighed about 140 pounds and we had a bunch of guys about 180 and 200, but they ran circles around us. "Harold Silva changed that. He told us we had to be smart to play football, not just big and strong." Kahuku finished second in the league in 1957 and '58, but regained the title in '59. Louis Santiago was a part of both championship teams, and he also has fond memories of his former coach. "He started the dynasty," Santiago said. "If it weren't for him, Kahuku might still be down.

"The last time I saw him was a few years ago at the school's 100th anniversary. They honored him at halftime and we all made sure we went up and said hello. He taught me a lot and he changed my life." Santiago will always remember Silva's five D's -- discipline, dedication, determination, drive and desire. "I told my children about those same things he taught me," said Santiago, who had three boys go on to play for the Red Raiders. Santiago said Silva was like another father to many of the players and would drive them in his '57 Thunderbird to scout other games. Eni Faleomavaega, a congressman from American Samoa, remembers playing for Silva. "He was one of the best coaches they ever had at Kahuku," Faleomavaega said. "He was rough and tough, but that's the spirit of Kahuku and they don't expect anything less. I'd like to give my deepest condolences to his family." Silva coached many other people who went on to be successful in their careers, including Leo Reed, a retired policeman, and Frank Kalama Jr., a retired principal. "Coach Silva had an impact and an influence on my life. George W. Steele - Described as a "truly professional journalist," George W. Steele started his newspaper career as a copy boy at the Charleston Gazette in West Virginia in 1965. Steele, a wire editor and copy editor at the Star-Bulletin for 22 years, was found dead yesterday Mar 13, 2003 in his Makiki apartment. He was 56. Born in 1946, Steele came to Hawaii as a Gannett Fellow in Asian Studies at the University of Hawaii in 1978. He worked briefly for United Press International in Honolulu before returning to his native West Virginia in 1980. He stayed for only one winter before accepting a job as wire editor at the Star-Bulletin in 1981. "The rhythm and life in Hawaii fit his spirit," said Kathy Hull, a cousin. Star-Bulletin Editor Frank Bridgewater said: "He was a friend to everyone in the newsroom, who always had a joke -- not necessarily a good one -- to share. "George cared immensely about the Star-Bulletin and routinely went beyond his assigned duties to help make the paper better," he added. "To George, the newsroom really was his home, and the staff was his family," said Assistant Sports Editor Sjarif Goldstein. "He treated me like a son. I learned a lot about being a journalist from him. But he was also a class clown of sorts. He'd give everyone from the top on down a good ribbing, but he was his own biggest target. He was one of those who really made the newsroom a community, and he will be missed as much as anyone would be." Lucy Witeck, president of the Hawaii Newspaper Guild, said Steele had served on the executive committee of the union for several years. "He was a staunch union member," she said. At the Charleston Gazette, he worked his way up covering police, courts and education and became assistant city editor in 1977. "He wrote like a dream," said Mary Hogue, a former wife in Charleston. "He covered many interesting assignments and also things that bothered him ... like mine disasters." Steele is survived by an uncle and aunt in West Virginia and numerous cousins on the mainland. Michael Stennis - Former University of Hawai'i quarterback Michael Stennis, who went on to become a successful businessman and high-ranking official in the California state university system, died Sunday October 26, 203 morning in his Los Angeles home. He was 45. "This university was fortunate to have him come through the school," said K5 sportscaster Artie Wilson, a close friend for more than 25 years. "It's a very sad day. Not only has his family lost a father and a husband and a son, but we've lost a good friend and the world has lost a good man." UH defensive coordinator George Lumpkin, who recruited Stennis, recalled: "He was a great athlete, a great artist and he had a great business mind. I used to wonder how one person could have so much going for him." Stennis, who attended UH from 1976 through 1980, was the first African American to start at quarterback for UH. "We came in together as freshmen," said Blane Gaison, who is athletic director at Kamehameha Schools. "We both came in as quarterbacks. We

went at it head to toe. We were both competitive, yet we were roommates and good friends, if not best friends." Gaison eventually moved to defensive back and, for the 1980 season, Gaison and Stennis were named co-captains. "We started off as competitors, but ended up finishing together," Gaison said. "We walked out loving one another." After receiving a degree from UH, Stennis returned to Los Angeles to help run his family's chain of restaurants throughout California. For eight years, Stennis served as a trustee for the California state university system. A few years ago, he received an honorary doctorate degree from Cal State-Monterey Bay. He sponsored several inner-city youth programs in Los Angeles. Stennis and his business partner, basketball great Magic Johnson, were prepared to open Fat Burger restaurants in Honolulu when Stennis was diagnosed with stage-4 colon cancer in November 2001. "They gave him a couple of months," Erin Stennis said of her husband's prognosis. Stennis and his wife formed the Stennis Family Foundation, a not-for-profit organization designed to educate the minority community about colon cancer. Erin Stennis said the foundation has paid for colonoscopy procedures for patients without medical insurance. Despite two surgeries and several rounds of chemotherapy, "he got up, like a Warrior," Erin said. "He would get up every day and swim and exercise on the bike and run. He kept his body in shape. He started to read voraciously. He consumed so many books to try to keep his focus. He just read, read, read. It was his way to deal with the pain." At the end, she said, "he was tired. He fought. He was the hero." Stennis also is survived by children Michael Jr., Pilar and Todd Marabella. His nephew, Sean Stennis, is a UH wide receiver. JAMES "JIMMY" SUEYOSHI, a high-school dropout who became one of the top chefs in Hawai'i despite never taking a formal cooking class, died April 11, 2003. He was 75. Sueyoshi also started the culinary program at Leeward Community College in 1971, and was named Outstanding Chef by the Professional Cooks of Hawai'i in 1972. Sueyoshi was born in Fukuoka, Japan, on Aug. 27, 1927, and his family moved to Hawai'i when he was 3 months old. As he began his second year at McKinley High School, Suevoshi's father got sick and Suevoshi made the tough decision to leave school and get a job as a dining room helper at the Niumalu Hotel, where the Hilton Hawaiian Village now stands. Sueyoshi made his way into the kitchen and got his first major job in 1948 as first cook in the Skyroom at the old airport. His career began to take off as he landed executive chef jobs at Liberty House Garden Court and Michel's at the Colony Surf. Although his career was flourishing, Sueyoshi left the big kitchens in 1971 to launch the food service program at Leeward Community College. The idea was to combine classroom work with practical experience. "He was selected because he had such a reputation as being a local boy, understanding the food service industry," said Fern Tomisato, coordinator of LCC's culinary program. "For many years he was closely connected with the coffee shops and dinner houses right around the Leeward area. So many of our original students found employment right in this community." Today, the college offers a variety of courses including food sanitation, baking, cooking and serving. Students also work in the school's fine-dining restaurant, The Pearl. Tomisato said many LCC graduates have gone on to careers in the food service industry and they have people like Sueyoshi to thank. "During that time (the 1960s), local boys weren't chefs. They always brought in the chefs from Europe," she said. "He was one of the first chefs in one of these finedining, European kind of restaurants." Suevoshi will be inducted into the college's Culinary Hall of Fame during the school's "Taste of the Stars" event May 3. "We're recognizing him because we wanted to do something that would give the message to our students that you can have a lifetime career in the culinary field," Tomisato said. Masaru Sumida, an innovative farmer whose family farm produces half of the state's watercress, died Thursday. He was 84. Tauese Pita Sunia - American Samoa Gov. Tauese Pita Sunia valued his traditional culture but possessed a vast knowledge of modern and world affairs. "He represents the example of bringing the best of two worlds together," said Papalii Failautusi Avegalio, director of the University of Hawaii's Pacific Business Center Program. Sunia died Wednesday night Mar 26, 2003 on a Polynesian Airlines flight to Honolulu. He was suffering abdominal pains and was to receive medical treatment here. He was 61. Sunia was born on Aug. 29, 1941, in the village of Fagatogo, where his parents served as ministers. He graduated from Kearney State Teachers College in Nebraska in history and political science with a certificate in secondary education. "Hawaii has lost a dear friend," said former Honolulu City Councilman Mufi Hannemann. Taugaifala "Rags" Scanlan, president of Royal Guard Security in Honolulu, grew up with Sunia in America Samoa.

"He was a great guy, dedicated to his family and a hard worker," Scanlan said. In 1992 he served as lieutenant governor for former Gov. A.P. Lutali. Sunia was elected governor of American Samoa in November 1996 and reelected in 2000. For nearly eight years, he served as chairman of the Congregational Christian Church in American Samoa and oversaw church affairs in Samoa, the United States and New Zealand. Avegalio said he learned from Sunia that one should always firmly embrace one's culture and language and at the same time be able to benefit from Western knowledge and education. Muriel "Sis" Shingle Sutherland, granddaughter of James and Abigail Campbell and an heir to the Campbell Estate, died Sunday Dec 14, 2003 in Honolulu. She was 93. Sutherland was the oldest of three surviving grandchildren to James Campbell, a Scottish carpenter who became one of Hawai'i's most notable 19th-century land-owning businessmen. The estate, the state's second wealthiest landholding trust, is worth more than \$2 billion. The estate is set to terminate in 2007 and its assets will be distributed among more than 30 direct heirs. Sutherland held 5 percent interest. Although she was a beneficiary of the large estate, she lived a normal life, said her son, Fred Trotter. "She was just one of those people you wanted to be around," Trotter said. "You're not going to find her in the annals of Hawai'i history because she was just an average person." Sutherland was born in Honolulu on Dec. 26, 1909. She graduated from Punahou School and attended the Notre Dame Convent in San Jose, Calif., and Briar Cliff College in Iowa. She returned to Hawai'i and married Fred E. Trotter. She later married Ross Sutherland, who owned several clothing stores in Hawai'i. Trotter said his mother was a homemaker who raised four of her own children, as well as the children of several relatives who died. She also was active with the Red Cross and The Oueen's Medical Center. Trotter said his mother was a dependable person who was well-liked and had many friends. Sutherland also was very close to her brothers and sisters, he said. "There was a time when there wasn't anybody who was anybody that she didn't know. But she never used that. She never had to," Trotter said. "It's people like that who make Hawai'i what it is." Sutherland is survived by sons, Fred, Robert "Lindy" and Jon Sutherland; daughter, Alicia "Auwe" Morris; brother, James Shingle; sister, Louise Stevenson; 15 grandchildren; and 17 greatgrandchildren.
