VIOLA "RUTH" ORCUTT BACON, the dean of Hawai'i piano instructors who instilled the love of music in countless youths, died Feb. 22, 2003. She was 103. Bacon's musical career spanned nearly the entire 20th century. Born Viola Orcutt in Gillespie, Ill., in 1900, she began playing the piano when she was 4. At age 12, Bacon was an accomplished musician who played beyond her years. She continued playing the piano well into her 90s and she was honored in 1994 by the Windward Community Arts Council for her 80 years as a piano teacher. Bacon was a respected member of the local music scene. In a joint statement, piano teacher Ellen Masaki, pianist Marianne Miyamura and former assistant Honolulu Symphony conductor and University of Hawai'i music professor Henry Miyamura said Bacon will be greatly missed. "Ruth was a first-rate musician, composer, pianist and teacher," they said. "She was an accompanist for named artists coming to Honolulu in the '40s and '50s, among them (famed saxophonist) Sigurd Rascher." The Miyamuras and Masaki sent their daughters to study under Bacon. Bacon received her music education at Forest Park University for Women in St. Louis, Mo., and at the Chicago Musical College. For her master's thesis she wrote a concerto for piano and orchestra, which she performed with the Chicago Symphony orchestra and the Honolulu Symphony at age 84. Bacon studied under noted pianist and composer Percy Grainger and Ernest Richard Kroeger, one of the finest composers and musicians in St. Louis. She joined the music faculty at the University of Kansas, where she taught for 18 years. During her years in Kansas, Bacon also earned her pilot's license and joined the Civil Air Patrol. After three-straight Christmases with pneumonia, Bacon took a leave of absence in 1946 to teach at Punahou School. Soon after arriving, she met and married Burt Bacon, a field superintendent at 'Ewa Plantation. Ruth Bacon taught at Punahou for 10 years and gave lessons out of her 'Ewa home for 20 years. She also performed as a soloist with the Honolulu Symphony several times. In 1976, the couple moved to Pohai Nani Good Samaritan Retirement Community, where she became its music association's chairwoman and continued to teach. Bacon is survived by nieces and nephews. Baird was born in Joseph, Utah, on July 30, 1922, and first came to Hawaii during World War II with the Navy. During a 1946-48 mission to Hawaii for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Baird met Joy Luana Knapp, whom he married in 1948 and who died in 2000, said Baird's son Randy. His father worked for Honolulu Federal Savings and Loan from 1948 until he retired as president in 1978, Randy Baird said. Baird was active in the Mormon Church, serving as a bishop for the Makiki ward in the early 1960s, a member of the stake presidency for the Honolulu area from 1971-77, a

regional authority from 1978-86 for half of the state, and Hawaii-area family history director in the 1980s and 1990s. Leoncio "Leo" Balan didn't like eating cold food and sleeping on the hard ground in the Army during World War I. So when he was discharged in 1919, Balan joined the Navy. Later he found himself in the thick of World War II action, including the 1942 invasion of North Africa. Balan, one of the last surviving veterans who served in two world wars, died April 10, 2003. He was 104. Balan was born in Mabini, Pangasinan, the Philippines on Feb. 15, 1899. He signed up with the Philippine National Guard and in September 1918 his unit was called to active duty with the U.S. Army. After fighting alongside the British in France, Balan decided against re-enlisting. "In the Army, you sleep on the ground, and you don't eat hot food," Balan said in 1999. "In the Navy, they give you a good bed to sleep in and you eat

hot food every day." With the Navy, Balan saw action at Guadalcanal and was present when Allied troops stormed ashore at Leyte, the Philippines. He was aboard the USS Colorado when it took President Herbert Hoover on a 1929 trip to Latin America. Balan also served on the battleships California, Utah, Idaho and Mississippi. After he retired in 1947 as a chief petty officer, he and his wife, Maria, settled in Wahiawa. He remained active with the Fleet Reserve Association, the Veterans of Foreign War and American Legion. Balan is survived by nephew, Orlando Adames; four grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren. John F. Barretto Jr. - Longtime political activist and former Kauai County Councilman John Barretto died Saturday. He was 69. Barretto filled an unexpired term on the Council for 2 1/2 years in the early '80s. He was defeated in the following election, but won office in 1984. Two years later, he failed in an attempt to unseat Mayor Tony Kunimura. "He was a very feisty advocate, especially for lower property taxes," said former Council Chairman Ron Kouchi, who served with Barretto. "He was like a bulldog; he'd grab you by the ankle and wouldn't let go." Barretto remained active in politics until shortly before his death, often speaking at County Council meetings against government waste, high property taxes and uncontrolled development on Kauai. He last ran for the Council in 2002, despite having had a heart attack and fighting cancer. "John was really a fighter for the little guy and very unafraid to speak up," said County Councilwoman and former mayor JoAnn Yukimura, who served with Barretto on the Council. "I'm going to miss him very much." Barretto was born Dec. 15, 1933, in Kealia, Kauai. At various points in his career, Barretto owned a tow truck service, a scrap yard, a boat repair yard and a charter fishing company. He lived in Kapaa. JIM BARTELS studied the past, worked in the present and planned for the future. Through it all, he brought history to life. Bartels, who helped preserve 'Iolani Palace and Washington Place for future generations, was

remembered yesterday April 21, 2003 by friends and colleagues as a gentle-but-powerful guiding force in the Hawaiian community. He died of complications from cancer Sunday in California. He was 57. "No one else even comes close to Jim Bartels," said longtime friend Jeffrey Apaka. "He was a tutor and a mentor who spoke for the Hawaiian people. There's no one to replace him." Whether it was studying centuries-old archives or facing the modern realities of fund raising and bureaucracies, Bartels brought a sensitive spirit and boundless enthusiasm to his work, friends said. His accomplishments will help people better appreciate the unique history of Hawai'i and Hawaiians, they said. "He was a sweet and kind man with an absolute passion for what he did," said Regina Kawananakoa, his former wife who remained close to him. "He knew so much about Hawaiian history and was always trying to discover new things." He also had a gift for sharing history. "He had a great quest for knowledge, but even more important he could share that knowledge with others in wonderful, very magnetic ways," said Charles Nakoa, former executive director of the Queen Lili'uokalani Children's Center. Although his academic background was in fine arts, Bartels was a natural historian. Colleagues said his superb research skills grew out of his own sense of pride and dignity in being Hawaiian. "His research was exquisite and it was his real joy, but he only allowed himself a few hours a week because he knew there was so much other work to be done," said David Scott, executive director of the Historic Hawai'i Foundation. A University of Hawai'i graduate, he spent two years in the Navy during the Vietnam War and then worked at the Bishop Museum. In 1971, Bartels found his true calling at 'Iolani Palace. Over 28 years, he worked his way up from researcher to curator and managing director, guiding a restoration process that coincided with a Hawaiian renaissance. "He started as a volunteer and became undisputedly the world's leading expert on that period of Hawaiian history, the late monarchy period," said Alice Guild, former executive director of the Friends of 'Iolani Palace. Longtime friend Watters Martin remembers that Bartels once returned re-created Kingdom of Hawai'i flags because their length was an inch short. "He was very precise," Martin said. "If the carpet wasn't right or the drapery, if it wasn't 100 percent accurate, he sent it back." Bartels resigned in 1998 after a dispute with former Friends of 'Iolani Palace president Abigail Kawananakoa, who sat on a fragile 115-year-old palace throne for a Life magazine photo session. A few months after leaving the palace, he was named director at Washington Place, the 154-year-old home of Queen Lili'uokalani and 13 territorial and state governors. Working with former first lady Vicky Cayetano on a plan to convert the residence into a museum

that would tell Lili'uokalani's story, Bartels oversaw its presentation until he became ill in January. "He had a wonderful way of taking the Hawaiian experience historically and making it understandable to people," added William Chapman, head of the Historic Preservation Program at the University of Hawai'i. "He always gave you the sense that there was a place for everybody in his idea of a Hawai'i kingdom." Gov. Linda Lingle retained him as director of Washington Place. The governor called Bartels a "gentleman" and a "true historian." "He was a curator in the finest sense of the word," she said. "His diligence to maintain the traditions and artifacts of Washington Place and 'Iolani Palace will be his living legacy." Funeral plans were incomplete yesterday but expected to include a memorial service in Honolulu at St. Andrew's Cathedral, next to Washington Place. She was 85. were manaleo (native speakers) and belonged to the manaleo group of the 'Ahahui 'Olelo Hawai'i, a Hawaiian language professional organization that hosts an annual conference for native speakers. Hailama Farden, vice president of the 'Ahahui, said his organization knows of only 120 manaleo still living. It was Farden's childhood memories of Bodnar that impressed on him the cultural treasure that native speakers represent. He said she used to tell the kids to "kilo'i" (throw out) the garbage, but the word sounded like "chilo'i"

when she spoke it. That's the dialect she learned in her birthplace of Ke'anae, Maui. Daughter Marilyn Liftee said her mother was born in a difficult era for Hawaiian speakers, when the native language was banned in schools, but added that the grandfather who helped raise her insisted that she speak Hawaiian at home. Farden, an assistant deacon at the church, said he was thrilled to give Bodnar communion one last time last summer. The passing of manaleo, he said, is to be marked with sadness. "There are so few left," he said. "They are leaving this earth so rapidly, and soon we won't have any more." Among numerous honors in his lifetime, Bowman was named a living treasure by the Honpa Hongwanji Mission and given the Kamehameha School's Ke Ali'i Pauahi Award. For almost 70 years, Bowman's talents helped guide a resurgence of woodcraft in the Islands that inspired a renewal in voyaging canoe building, the restoration of early churches and a rebirth of appreciation for handmade furniture and cultural implements. It was Bowman who created a new koa pulpit for one of the early churches at Kalaupapa on Moloka'i, and who provided guidance for his late son, Wright "Wrighto" Bowman Jr., when he set out to carve the Polynesian Voyaging Society canoe Hawai'iloa from two giant 65-foot Alaskan spruce logs in 1991. But it was the senior Bowman who carved the first 'iako's — crossbars that hold the hulls together — so the society's first voyaging canoe, Hokule'a could be built in the early 1970s. From the open-air workshop under his Nu'uaniu home and his famous "woodpile," Bowman created a legacy of fine craftsmanship that included koa rockers, calabashes, traditional o'o digging sticks, canoe paddles and dining room sets. Some of the equipment was older than he was, and many of his tools had been jury-rigged from things such as old sanding belts and vacuum-cleaner parts. "Over the years, his working with wood brought him most of his recognition," said his daughter, Claire Bowman Graham, "but he taught woodworking at Kamehameha for 23 years, and had so many, many students and was most proud of that. They'd call him up and say, 'Hey, Mr. Bowman, I've got this project, could you help me out?' and he'd say, 'Yeah, come on up.'" For years he helped out people, and he loved doing that.

Early ambition Bowman was born in Hilo on Nov. 5, 1907. Growing up on the Big Island, his imagination was fired by the early canoe-builders at Honaunau, and he determined to become one. But it was a General Electric apprenticeship program for machinery pattern-makers on the Mainland that gave him the precision and skills to put his dreams into practice. Learning that craft allowed him to create templates for the working parts of airplane and automobile engines, oil well rigs and other heavy machinery. Later, his Native Hawaiian roots inspired him to turn to the icons of his own culture and become one of the visionaries behind the Hawaiian Renaissance. "He was especially good at figuring things out," his daughter said. "If you had some kind of problem — anything — my father would just look at it and figure it out, no problem. He had this gift." Bowman returned to Hawai'i after the Great Depression to teach at Kamehameha Schools, where he served for 23 years before becoming an independent craftsman. In recent years, he worked with apprentice Ka'ili Chun, daughter of Kamehameha

Schools President Michael Chun, who will carry on his work, said Bowman's daughter. Chun has purchased and is renovating Bowman's Nu'uaniu home, and will continue his work from the downstairs workshop.

Big Island family Bowman was born to Donald Scott and Mary Mele Elemakule Pa Bowman of the Big Island, and graduated from Kamehameha School for Boys in 1928 before heading to the Mainland. Aside from daughter Lee Claire "Maggie" Bowman Graham, he is survived by son William Kent Bowman; sister Lani Holmes; brothers Waldo, Kent "K.K. Kau'manua" and Jan Bowman; a granddaughter; four grandsons; three great-granddaughters; and four great-grandsons. He was preceded in death by his wife, Elizabeth Kaleilulu'u Whittington Bowman; son Wright "Wrighto" Elemakule Bowman Jr.; sisters Maile O'Donnell, Nina Reed and Donna Olds; and brothers Clifford Ha'alipo, Donald Scott Jr., James Pierre and Francis Moffett Bowman. Alpha Lyons Bowser Jr - Marine Lt. Gen. Alpha Lyons Bowser Jr. was an American hero. Bowser died Sunday at his home in Kailua. He was 92. He saw action in the Pacific in World War II in the New Georgia, Bougainville, Guam and Iwo Jima campaigns and during the Chosin Reservoir and Inchon-Seoul actions in the Korean War. Bowser's 39 years in the Marines spanned five decades. His many decorations included the Bronze Star and Legion of Merit. Betty Bowser described her 20 years of marriage to him as "old-fashioned, happy and full of hours of conversation." "He was dearly loved by everyone," she said. "He lived a very fine life." Bowser retired from active duty in 1967. He moved to San Diego upon retirement before settling in Kailua in 1983. Bowser was born Aug. 21, 1910, in Crafton, Pa. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1932 and immediately joined the Marines. Betty Bowser said her husband did not like ocean sailing and would travel only if he could see land. "He didn't like it, but he joined the Marines anyway," she said. "I always found that quite amusing. Robert E. Talmadge, family friend and vice president for the Aloha Chapter of the Chosin Few, called Bowser "a man of great honor and courage." "He personified the phrase 'officer and a gentleman,' " Talmadge said. Joan Bowser DeLon said people would remember her father for a kind heart, humor and knack for telling a good war story. "The Corps was his life," she said. "He could go on (telling a story) forever. I kept hearing new and different ones. I would never get tired of them." A memorial service will be held Friday at 11:30 a.m. at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific.

Gladys Kamakakuokalani Ainoa Brandt, a revered Hawaiian kupuna and educator, who touched many lives and resurrected pride in traditions such as hula, died last night Jan 15, 2003. She was 96. Brandt was admitted to the Queen's Medical Center on Dec. 26 with an undisclosed illness. A statement released by her family said that she was "at peace, free of pain and surrounded by family and loved ones" at the time of her death. Lynne Waters, a family spokeswoman, said during a news conference this morning that Brandt was feeling weak and admitted in failing health. Despite aggressive care, she failed to rally, she said. A memorial service is being planned for Jan. 29 at Kawaiahaeo Church. U.S. District Judge Samuel King, a longtime friend who visited Brandt's bedside several times in the days

before her death, said in a statement, "Gladys Brandt was one of Hawaii's Living Treasures. Her dedication to education and the improvement of the lot of Hawaiians led to her position as 'every Hawaiian's Auntie Gladys.' She has been a mover and a shaker in every area of Hawaii's social and political life for most of her 96 years. Our hearts go out in aloha to her family. She will be missed." Office of Hawaiian Affairs trustee and former Kamehameha Schools trustee Oswald Stender, also a long-time friend, said "she gave her life, and it was a long life, to her community and Hawaii and especially to the Hawaiian people. This is a tremendous loss and a huge void that makes me very sad." Former University of Hawaii Regent Momi Cazimero, another lifelong friend, said "she has touched me and she has had an impact on many people. As a strong Hawaiian woman, she was a light on a path and she invited me and others to follow her. She provided a path for Hawaiian women to follow. And with that, she has charged them with the responsibility to bring along the next generation and for them to bring along the next." A fierce defender of Hawaiian traditions, Brandt, the former principal of the Kamehameha School for Girls, joined with King and three other writers to produce "Broken Trust," an essay published in August 1997 that harshly criticized the then-trustees for financially mismanaging Kamehameha Schools. Within days of publication in the Star-Bulletin, then-Gov. Ben Cayetano ordered an investigation into the charitable trust that was formed in 1884 to educate children of Hawaiian ancestry. By the end of 1999, the trustees were ousted and organizational reforms had begun. Kamehameha President and Headmaster Michael Chun said, "Mrs. Brandt was a gracious lady who dealt with difficult challenges from the view of doing the right thing first, and then doing it the right way second. She was always concerned with what is right, and not who is right. Clearly, she was a leader with a servant's heart ... an alii in every way that truly counts." King said Brandt's heart and leadership were critical to reform of the trust. "She had been there and run the girls' school. She knew the people and the issues involved and had the reputation of someone who could talk straight without making it personal," King said. Jan Dill, president of Na Pua A Ke Ali'i Pauahi, a group of Kamehameha alumni, parents and teachers, said "because of her stature, she was able to say things that were on people's hearts and minds that they felt unable to say or felt they would not be heard because of their stature." The reverence Brandt drew in the Hawaiian community could be seen last July when Kamehameha alumni, students and parents crowded the school auditorium to talk to the trustees about their controversial decision to accept a non-Hawaiian student to the Maui campus. The air of the auditorium crackled with tension and anger. But when Brandt entered,

everyone, regardless of their position on the issue, stood and clapped in a show of respect. "That was an example of the kind of reverence most people have for her," said Dill, adding, "She was a guiding light for the Hawaiian community and particularly for Kamehameha Schools." Dill and others said Brandt had the ability to bring people together for a greater common good. "She was our stability, our ballast for our conflicts and disagreements," said Dill. "We will miss her because not many individuals can be the ballast for groups who are so passionate in their views." Dill remembered the days following the historic May 15, 1997 march of alumni, teachers and students to Kawaiahao Plaza to protest the then-trustees management. At a meeting after the march, about 100 restless people, angry at the trustees but emotionally charged by the support they received from the march, crowded into a hall near Kawaiahao Church. But their voices instantly dropped to silence when Brandt walked in. And all stood in respect. Cazimero said that one reason Brandt was such a strong leader in the Hawaiian community was her unyielding self-confidence. Cazimero explained that stripping Hawaiians of their language, lands, customs and identities also ate away their confidence. But Brandt helped people find their confidence and their pride. "Aunty Gladys is the symbol of confidence," she said of Brandt, who as principal of Kamehameha's girls' school revived hula, which had been banished as taboo by the missionaries. Born in August 1906, Brandt lived part of her childhood with her hanai mother, Ida May Pope, who was the first principal of Kamehameha's girls' school from 1894 until her death in 1914. Janet Zisk, Kamehameha's archivist, said Brandt told her that she referred to herself as "Miss Pope's hanai daughter and that she was very spoiled by Miss Pope." Brandt was the only girl to attend the boys' elementary school. Years later, Brandt served as the last principal of the girls' school, which merged with the boys' school in 1965. Brandt's father, David Kanuha, taught tailoring in the boys school which also made uniforms for the school. When Brandt was 16, her father changed their last name to Ainoa. Brandt graduated from McKinley High School in 1925. After receiving her teaching certificate from Normal School in 1927, she began teaching in the Maui public schools and later in the Kauai school system. In 1942, she graduated from the University of Hawaii with a bachelor's degree in education. By 1962, she had served as principal at both Kalaheo and Kapaa schools on Kauai and as district superintendent for that island's schools. Brandt became the first native Hawaiian principal for Kamehameha's girls' school in 1963. During her tenure, Brandt wanted Nona Beamer to teach Hawaiian culture at Kamehameha. Beamer said she would only teach if standing hula, which was forbidden for girls, was taught.

Beamer had been thrown out of Kamehameha at one point for dancing standing hula at a tea party for the trustees. Together, the two brought back hula to Kamehameha. In 1969, Brandt became the director of Kamehameha's high school division and then retired in 1971. But her career did not stop there. In 1983 then-Gov. George Ariyoshi appointed her to the University of Hawaii Board of Regents. She served six years on the board, including four years as chairperson. She also worked hard to found the UH Center for Hawaiian Studies, helping guide the project through the board and state Legislature. Stender said that the center almost lost its construction funds because of "a political tug-of-war" between two factions. He said Brandt met with everyone and persuaded them to come together so the center could be built. In March 2002, the center was rededicated in her Hawaiian name, Kamakakuokalani. According to one published account, the name, which came from her maternal grandmother, means "the upright eyes of heaven" and alludes to the "divine imagination of the artist." At the rededication ceremony, Brandt said she hoped the center would preserve the beauty of the culture for future generations and heal the wounds of the past. "In education, not anger, resides our future. In education, not ignorance, resides our hope. In education, not fear, resides justice," she told the audience. In 1998 and again in 2000, Cayetano appointed Brandt to serve as a trustee for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. In a statement, Cayetano said, "She was an extraordinary person. I never met anyone who was so widely respected across all ethnicities. When I asked her to reconsider her OHA appointment, she looked me in the eye and said, 'You rascal.' But whenever I have called upon her to do something for the people of our state, she was always there." Cazimero and others mentioned the strong lifelong friendship between Brandt and another spiritual leader of the Hawaiian community, Msgr. Charles Kekumano, who also authored Broken Trust. Kekumano and Brandt were bound as friends and Hawaiian activists. Neil Hannahs, Kamehameha's director of land assets, recalled that Kekumano held a party for Brandt on her 91st birthday. He said Kekumano draped a lei around her neck and kissed her on the cheek. Brandt replied that she had to wait 91 years for him to kiss her. She was at his side when he died of cancer in 1998. With a loving laugh, Judge King said of his two friends: "I'm sure she is going to meet Msgr. Kekumano and the two of them will figure out an activity that will cause a lot of uproar wherever they are." Brandt is survived by her daughter, Lorita Gladys Wichman, and grandchildren, Blakeslee Conant of Connecticut, Christopher Conant of Honolulu, David Brandt Wichman of New York City, Warren Wichman of Waimea, Kauai, Randolph Wichman of Waialua, Kauai, Anthony Wichman of Koloa, Kauai,

Stephen Wichman of Lake Tahoe, Ca., Lisa Kamakakuokalani Wisotzky of Haydenville, Mass., and nephew Frank Brandt of Honolulu. Brandt was married to the late Isaac Brandt. GARDNER KA'AIHUE BROWN - Until his dying day, Gardner Brown was a caring coach. "His latest baby was the youth volleyball program in the (Police Activities League)," said his youngest son, Paul Brown. "He was lying there in bed, but it was a big concern for him whether or not it would keep going for the kids. One of the other men who helped him run the league assured him that it would keep running and that brought a smile to my dad's face." Gardner Ka'aihue Brown died last Sunday May 11, 2003 at age 78. He was a decades-long volunteer coach for virtually every type of youth sport. He is most remembered for his work with the Pauoa Athletic Club, the Police Activities League, and the Na Opio and Na 'Ohana O Na Hui Wa'a canoe-paddling organization. "Working with the kids was his life," said daughter Nahaku Brown. Brown was born in Hilo and graduated from Hilo High before starting a career in the Army. "He used to love telling people about all the generals and high dignitaries he drove around when he was stationed at Fort Shafter," Nahaku Brown said. "And, of course, he used to coach the military kids." After his military stint, Brown coached volleyball, basketball, baseball and softball for Pauoa Athletic Club. He was also a key figure on the Pauoa Neighborhood Board, and helped lead the construction of the gymnasium at Booth Park. Na Opio, an organization for paddlers ages 18 and younger, started in 1983 with Brown's assistance. "He started the petition to get Na Opio chartered," said June Leialoha, president of the Hui Wa'a paddling organization. Brown served as an official in various

capacities for Hui Wa'a, and would show up at regattas even after he "retired" from official duties. "Everybody knew who Mr. Brown was," Leialoha said. Especially the kids. Brown would often walk around with a bag of candy to pass out to the youths who could solve his riddles. "His favorite thing was asking kids, 'What is one and one?' " Nahaku Brown said. "They would all say two, and he would say, 'No, one and one is 11.' And he'd laugh every time." Brown had six children of his own, and all were skilled athletes. Most notable, Nahaku Brown was an All-American setter for the Hawai'i women's volleyball team, and Paul Brown was a standout pitcher for the UH baseball team and was drafted in the second round by the Boston Red Sox. Paul Brown pitched a perfect game for UH in 1987 — still the only one in the program's history. His most vivid memory: "My teammates were mobbing me and they all wanted to go out and celebrate after. But I didn't want to go out with them. I just wanted to go home and talk about the game with my dad." Following his father's lead, Paul Brown is now a baseball coach. "A lot of who I am is a reflection of my father," he said. Brown never made any money as a youth coach, and that was how he liked it. "He died a rich man in his emotional bank account," Paul Brown said. "That's what counts more than anything." Leialoha added: "He put all his efforts into fighting for the kids. That makes him a great man." Brown is survived by six children: Gardner Brown Jr., Tanna Pestana, Louise Snyder, Christianna Nahaku Brown, Adele "Pewee" Ornelles and Paul Brown. Frederick E. Buck, who owned a chain of clothing stores in Hawai'i and was considered a retail pioneer in Waikiki, died Saturday Feb 1, 2003 in Honolulu. He was 83. Buck was born in San Francisco on May 31, 1919, and moved to Hawai'i in 1948 when he was recruited as a men's wear buyer for the McNerny Co. Buck later left the retail business and joined wholesaler Alfred E. Shaheen Co. But in 1955, Buck and his first wife, Nancy, launched their retail business when they opened Lana'i Sportswear on Lewers Street in Waikiki. Over the years, Lana'i Sportswear expanded to more than 20 locations in Hawai'i and California, and was the first tenant in the International Market Place in Waikiki. Radio personality Michael Buck, one of Frederick Buck's two sons, said his father was successful because he was an "out-of-the-box" thinker who always had the customer in mind. "He knew from the very beginning that everybody who spent their last hard-earned dime to get over here needed to be treated properly," Michael Buck said. "He thought that the hotels should be teaching the aloha spirit and we went out of our way in our stores to do that." During the Vietnam War, the

elder Buck joined other retailers and provided discounts to soldiers who were on rest and recreation here. He coined the term "R&R Discount" that appeared in advertising booklets throughout Waikiki. In addition to the clothing stores, the Buck family ran a primitive art shop and opened the state's first color copying store.
