Herb Campos - Former Maui Fire Chief Herb Campos, an active community volunteer, champion of Native Hawaiian health and Office of Hawaiian Affairs trustee, died Tuesday Jul 1, 2003 at the age of 68. Campos, who had survived cancer, a massive stroke and several heart surgeries, died at Maui Memorial Medical Center following a heart attack. Born on O'ahu, Campos graduated from Saint Louis High School in 1953 and joined the Honolulu Fire Department before moving to the Maui Fire Department in 1971. He worked his way up from driver to training officer to deputy chief and then chief, appointed by then-Mayor Hannibal Tavares. He led the department from 1985 to 1990. Interim Deputy Chief Alan Cordeiro, who began his career working with Campos in Kihei in 1974, remembered Campos as a happy man and devoted father. As fire chief, Campos was an excellent leader who worked with county politicians to keep the department well-equipped, Cordeiro said. Among his accomplishments were the construction of the Kahului and Napili fire stations. When Linda Lingle was elected mayor, Campos retired and ran unsuccessfully for County Council. Campos then took a job as Maui branch chief for HMSA and became a volunteer for numerous Valley Isle causes. When he wasn't working as a Little League coach and Boy Scout leader, Campos was a leader in several organizations geared toward improving the health of Native Hawaiians. He was also a board member of the Maui Food Bank and was active with the

American Cancer Society. In May 1998, he was appointed to the OHA board after the death of Maui trustee Abraham Aiona. He served for six months and lost in his election bid for a full term. In 2000, Campos suffered a massive stroke while on vacation in Las Vegas. Although he recovered, his impaired speech prompted his retirement from HMSA. Cordeiro said he last saw Campos at last month's opening of the Wailea Fire Station. "He was in good spirits," Cordeiro said. His wife, Leilani Campos, said her husband fell ill Tuesday after mowing the lawn. His death came 2 1/2 months shy of their 50th wedding anniversary. "He was a good man," she said. "He always put others before himself." Aaron Chaney - Hawai'i's real estate community lost one of its guiding principals on Monday as industry veteran Aaron Chaney died. He was 80. Chaney's real estate career in Hawai'i spanned more than 50 years, a distinction that made him a Realtor emeritus with the National Association of Realtors. It was his work ethic that influenced untold numbers of local real estate professionals who worked for him over the decades. "So many people think of Aaron as the dean of property management in Hawai'i, and he was certainly that," said longtime partner Wendell Brooks Jr. "But it was his ethical approach to business and personal discipline towards work that made him a great professional. "Aaron's idea of a half-day on a Saturday was to come in at 6:30 instead of 5:30 in the morning and to leave at 3:30 instead of 5:30," Brooks said. That work ethic enabled Chaney to build a fledgling property management business into the state's largest. A 1940 graduate of Punahou School, Chaney served in the Army and after World War II joined Cooke Trust Co. as an office clerk. At the time, trust companies handled property management in Hawai'i. Chaney eventually became vice president at Cooke Trust. In 1960 with the help of his wife, Betty, Chaney established his own property management firm, which Brooks joined a few years later as a vice president. "It was fortuitous that he went out on his own," Brooks recalled. "The condo business just started to explode." Chaney was chairman of the state Real Estate Commission in 1960-62 and became president of the Honolulu Board of Realtors in 1963. In 1959 and 1984 he was named Realtor of the year. Chaney continued to run his own firm until 1981 when Brooks, who went to work for Castle & Cooke, rejoined his old friend to establish Chaney, Brooks & Co., a company they sold in 1988 to a subsidiary of Nihon Building Service Co. in Japan. Still, Chaney stayed on as a volunteer consultant until retiring in 1995. Steve Sombrero, who took over as chief executive officer of Chaney, Brooks & Co. earlier this year, said Chaney at the time called him to wish him well in running the company, which last year exited the condo association management business. "He had a very sharp mind, and was very concerned about the business and offered to help," Sombrero recalled. "He was amazing." Steve Sofos, who for 16 years worked for Chaney before establishing his own firm, Sofos Realty Corp., said Chaney will be remembered as the undisputed dean of Hawai'i commercial real estate. Wah Ming Chang, an Academy Award-winning animator and a Carmel Valley artist, died Monday Dec 22, 2003. He was 86. Chang worked as an artist for more than seven decades. He worked on three Walt Disney films and as a Hollywood costume designer and sculptor. Born in Honolulu to two artists, Chang moved to San Francisco with his family in the early 1920s. In San Francisco, they managed the Ho Ho Tea Room, a hangout for bohemian artists. Artist and journalist Blanding Sloan, a regular customer, took an interest in the 6-year-old Chang after he discovered him sketching portraits on the back of his mother's menus. By the age of 9, Chang had his own show at a downtown San Francisco art gallery. After his mother died, Chang moved with Sloan and his wife to their Hollywood home and started creating film sets for the Hollywood Bowl at the age of 16. Chang met his wife, Glenella Taylor, while working with Sloan in Dallas on "The Calvacade of Texas," a show celebrating the Texas Centennial, in 1936. When a 21-year-old Chang started working for Anaheim-based Disney in 1939, he was the youngest member of Disney's Effects and Model Department. Chang married Taylor in Texas in 1941 — California law at the time did not allow marriage between a Chinese and a Caucasian. Some of his more notable works include a stop-motion animation production of "The Three Bears." Chang created wooden models of Pinocchio and Bambi so that Disney animators could study body movements. He also contributed to "Bozo the Clown," "Tom Thumb," "The Wonderful World of the Brothers Grimm" and "The Seven Faces of Dr. Lao." Chang designed costumes for the film "The King and I" starring Yul Brenner, created masks for "The Planet of the Apes" and made Elizabeth Taylor's headdress in "Cleopatra." He sculpted a series of heads to animate the first Pillsbury Doughboy and made creatures for the TV series "The Outer Limits" and "Star Trek." It was his work on "The Time Machine" that earned him an Oscar for special effects. Chang is survived by a half-sister, Lana Price of Carmel, and several nieces and nephews. George Chaplin, the southern gentleman who helped save The Honolulu Advertiser from financial ruin by shaking it out of its postwar slumber and demanding that it be relevant to new generations of Hawai'i readers, died yesterday Feb 17, 2003 at the age of 88. Chaplin, who lived with his son, Steve, and his family in McLean, Va., died from complications after a fall in which he broke his shoulder. Funeral arrangements are pending, but he will be buried next to his late wife, Esta, in Charleston, S.C. She died in 2001. Chaplin served as editor of The Advertiser for 28 years, retiring in 1986. In 1998, he and his wife moved from their longtime Kahala home to South Carolina, where they could be closer to their children. Chaplin's impact on Hawai'i went far beyond his work at the newspaper. Chaplin immersed himself in a wide array of bold initiatives and civic causes that included his aggressive campaign for statehood, the creation of the East-West Center, the building of the Arizona Memorial and an unprecedented statewide dialogue on growth and planning in 1970 in preparation for the year 2000. But his most passionate work, on the editorial page and in the community, focused on his dream for Hawai'i to build a truly pluralistic society where class, race

and religion didn't matter. "He helped bring the whole community together and was the first editor of The Advertiser to actively try to bring all racial groups together and move forward with the growth of the state," said Thurston Twigg-Smith, the former owner of The Advertiser and a friend and colleague of Chaplin's for more than 40 years. One of Chaplin's boldest decisions still resonates today. In 1962, Chaplin and Twigg-Smith, recognizing that the people and politics of Hawai'i were changing fast, decided to buck the haole Republican establishment that not only controlled Hawai'i business but saw The Advertiser as its mouthpiece. The newspaper endorsed a Democratic newcomer, Dan Inouye, over Republican Ben Dillingham for the U.S. Senate. "When we decided to endorse Dan Inouye for Senate ... that probably changed Hawai'i about as much as a newspaper could change things," Twigg-Smith said yesterday. The endorsement also established a lifelong friendship between Chaplin and Inouye. "At the time it was difficult, if not unheard of as an institution associated with the so-called Big Five, to endorse a Democrat," Inouye said yesterday. "Our friendship has been close ever since. "In many ways, he was the one who kept me honest in my business. If he felt my position was not to his liking, he did not hesitate to tell me so. Anyone who has a friend like that is fortunate." When Chaplin arrived at The Advertiser in 1958, he immediately set about breaking down the barrier between what was seen as an aristocratic, haole, anti-labor institution and the various ethnic communities. Chaplin correctly saw that The Advertiser, which was barely selling 47,000 papers a day and was being trounced by its afternoon competitor, the Honolulu Star-Bulletin, would have to broaden its appeal if it was to survive. He tirelessly went out at night to as many community functions as he could fit in, working the circuit of the ethnic chambers of commerce, local Cherry Blossom and Narcissus Queen contests and any other event where people might be gathering. Chaplin's son, Steve, a retired State Department official, said his father was determined to build on Hawai'i's foundation of ethnic tolerance. "He saw that Hawai'i offered opportunity in lots of ways that more stratified communities on the Mainland didn't," Steve Chaplin said. "He thought that the relationship between the different ethnic groups in Hawai'i, while not problem-free, was far better than any he had seen in different parts of the Mainland." Chaplin, himself, had been stung by prejudice in his student days at Clemson College in South Carolina and his early years as a newspaperman in the South. At Clemson, a military school, he was taken aside by the colonel and told that he was the top cadet in the graduating class but he wouldn't get the honor because he was Jewish. Chaplin was born in Columbia, S.C., on April 18, 1914, the son of East European immigrants.

His father, Morris Chaplin, was 15 when he left Bialystock, Poland, in 1906 and made his passage across the Atlantic. At Ellis Island, a bureaucrat cut off the beginning and end of his last name, Tschaplinsky. He went to work in a shoe factory near Boston, attended night school and learned to read, write and speak English. Chaplin's mother, Netty, worked as a seamstress. The family later moved to South Carolina and it was at Clemson, where Chaplin majored in chemistry, that he discovered he was much more interested in editing the school newspaper, the Clemson Tiger. After working his way through school by starting and running a college news bureau, he got a job the day after graduation in 1935 as a reporter for \$10 a week on the Greenville Piedmont. Two years later, in his early 20s, he was city editor, had his salary raised to \$35 a week and married Esta L. Solomon of Charleston, S.C., whom he had met during his college days. In 1940, Chaplin was one of 12 journalists chosen from more than 200 applicants for a Nieman Fellowship at Harvard, providing an academic year with faculty status. He specialized in race relations, believing that a crisis was brewing in his native South. In June 1941, he returned to the Greenville Piedmont but after Pearl Harbor entered the Army and wound up in Hawai'i as the first editor and officer-in-charge of the Mid-Pacific Edition of Stars & Stripes, the armed forces newspaper. After the war, he served as managing editor of the Camden Courier-Post in New Jersey, then as managing editor of the San Diego Journal, from which he went to take over as editor of the New Orleans Item in 1949. The Item was the largest paper in Louisiana and among Chaplin's favorite editorial topics was statehood for Hawai'i. His editorials campaigning for statehood brought him to the attention of then-Advertiser publisher Lorrin P. Thurston, who was looking for someone to take over the news operation. In December 1958, on the eve of statehood and the jet age, Chaplin arrived back in Hawai'i. But almost from the moment of his arrival, Chaplin clashed with Thurston over the editorial direction of the newspaper, as well as its leisurely approach to building advertising and circulation. Quickly finding an ally in Thurston's nephew, Thurston Twigg-Smith, the two unsuccessfully struggled to improve the quality of the paper, to reach out to a broader audience and to reverse years of ill will that had built up against the newspaper. In February 1961, after gaining control of the majority of The Advertiser's stock, Twigg-Smith and Chaplin confronted Thurston and told him he was through. "It was an emotional session," Chaplin wrote in his 1998 history of The Advertiser, "Presstime in Paradise." "Thurston wept and I wept, too, at the sadness of the situation, of his failure to understand that he had let the paper go downhill for years. He signed the letter of resignation." With the creation of a joint operating

agreement with the Star-Bulletin in 1962, The Advertiser regained its financial footing and Chaplin went about improving the newspaper by hiring more reporters and devoting more space to local news. Chaplin was in the tradition of many top editors of his era, believing that community leadership was a key part of his job. He pooh-poohed any suggestion that his involvement in community affairs influenced coverage in the newspaper, but the staff knew when an assignment came with the notation "G.C. MUST," there would be no debate about whether to cover the fund-raiser or speech or award ceremony. Always forward-thinking, in the early 1970s Chaplin launched the Hawai'i 2000 campaign, bringing together leaders from throughout the community to begin planning the future. From tourism to traffic, from economic development to environmental protection, the whole community began to cast its eyes forward and ask where it wanted to go. Retired political science professor Glenn Paige said Hawai'i 2000 "was an example of his vision and total caring about everyone in the state and what would happen in the future." "I think he made a list of about 1,500 people in the community. He tried to draw in as many people as possible — young people, students, any occupation, everybody. (He) got 300 people working for six months in 10 different groups." In 1972, he was among the first American journalists in China. He wrote a long series on that trip, and on trips to Russia and Israel. He served as president of the American Society of Newspaper Editors and received numerous national journalism awards, including the Scripps-Howard Foundation's charter award for "a distinguished contribution to a free press"; two John Hancock awards for economic reporting on U.S.-Japan trade relations; a Champion Media award for writings promoting economic understanding; a National Headliners' award for feature writing and two Overseas Press Club citations for series on Japan, China and Southeast Asia. In addition to his son, Steve, Chaplin is survived by his daughter, Jerri Chaplin of Charleston, S.C.; a sister, Kay Greene of New Orleans; and four grandsons. [Adv 18/02/2003]

Peter C.P. Char, a prominent medical malpractice attorney and chief campaign fund raiser for Mayor Jeremy Harris, died Sunday Jan 12, 2003 after a brief illness. He was 59. Char, a partner in the law firm Char, Hamilton, Campbell & Thorn, practiced medical law in Hawai'i for 25 years, representing doctors, nurses and medical institutions, and providing legal counsel in health-law matters. He was a close friend to Harris, who called

Char the older brother he never had. "He was simply a good man. He was a rock, a pillar of integrity, a man of honor, just an amazing guy," Harris said yesterday after helping Char's family make funeral arrangements. "He lived a life dedicated to his family and his community, and he shared his insight and his quiet wisdom with me. I will be forever grateful for that priceless gift." Harris and his wife, Ramona, were at Char's bedside when he died. In addition to being chief money raiser for Harris' aborted gubernatorial campaign, Char was deputy treasurer of Harris' 2000 mayoral re-election campaign and headed two nonprofit groups: Friends of the City and County of Honolulu and the Environmental Foundation, which raised money for city environmental conferences. In November, Char was called to testify before a grand jury investigating Harris' campaign finances and the awarding of city contracts, but he was not accused of any wrongdoing. Born and raised in Hawai'i, Char graduated from Punahou in 1961, received an undergraduate degree in history from Yale University, and a law degree from Northwestern University. After graduation, he worked as a law clerk in the Supreme Court of Hawai'i. He was formerly a partner at Cades, Schutte, Fleming & Wright and an instructor at the University of Hawai'i's William S. Richardson School of Law. Char's law partner, Roland O.F. Thom, said of his lifelong friend: "He possessed judgeliike skills that he combined with unquestionable integrity in his work and, for that matter, in all his endeavors." Dan Chun, pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Honolulu, said, "So many of his colleagues admired him and felt he was one of the most honest people they knew." Philip M. Chu, noted architect of more than 70 college libraries and dormitories, died Oct. 27 in Honolulu. He was 83. Chu was born in Shanghai, China, on Dec. 10, 1919, and immigrated to the United States during World War II. He attended Oberlin College in Ohio and the University of Michigan. Edward F. "Ed" Chui, who served as a coach, professor, department chairman and athletic director over parts of five decades at the University of Hawai'i-Manoa, died Saturday Nov 15, 2003. He was 78. Chui had the distinction of twice serving as athletic director in stints 14 years apart. Both times the school brought him in to provide a steady hand during times of crisis. In 1961, he took over during a budget crunch that had already prompted the school to drop football because of a \$10,000 deficit. A year later, the school was able to resume the sport against a mix of local clubs and Mainland teams. Chui represented UH at the 1962 NCAA Convention and successfully fought for full-fledged membership for the school before the NCAA Council. "He was a hands-on administrator who worked with his staff," said Ed Inouye, former UH sports information director. Chui also served as chairman of the physical education department from 1965-74. "He was very serious about his job and well-respected," recalled Jimmy Asato, who also taught there. Chui's passion was golf and he twice served as the school's golf coach, from 1958-65 and 1982-89. Chui, a graduate of McKinley High, received three degrees from Iowa, where he also played football for a season until his career was cut short by injury. Frank Conkey was a slight man -- friends describe the transplant from Minnesota as just a smidgen over 5 feet tall and all of 100 pounds. But they also say Conkey, who had been active in a number of Hawaii organizations since he moved here in the 1970s, including spokesman for the Better Business Bureau for more than a decade, had a booming voice from a radio career in his early years, a demanding presence and a massive fervor for helping others. "He was very giving," said longtime friend Nancy Ahn, of Honolulu. "If somebody needed something, he would damn well find out who, what and where." Conkey died Wednesday Dec 17, 2003 of a heart attack at the Aloha Nursing and Rehab Centre, where he was recovering from an injured knee. He was 89. Before coming to Hawaii, Conkey was on a popular 1930s Chicago radio show, "Jack Armstrong, the All-American Boy," wrote flight-training manuals at the Pentagon as a captain in the Air Force during World War II and served as a Scout leader and director with the Boy Scouts of America. In 1970, Conkey visited the islands with his mother, "got a very nice liking" of the state and moved here the same year, said his younger brother, Warren. In the mid-1970s, Conkey took a position as spokesman for the Better Business Bureau, alerting residents of scams and business fraud through the local media. Later, Conkey became a key figure in the annual Hawaii Career and College Fair for the state's high school students. He helped put on the fair for 28 of its 29 years, until this year, said Chaminade University of Honolulu professor emeritus and former fair president Bill Murray. "He was just a super individual," Murray said. "He's the type of guy who never met a stranger. He got to know everybody right away. ... I've lost a tremendous friend." Conkey was also an active member in the Honolulu Press Club, and a number of his friends recounted his portrayal of "Rambo," with a belt of machine gun bullets crisscrossed on his skinny torso, in one of the club's annual Gridiron shows. "I remember Frank as being very creative and communicating with all natures of people -- children, adults, older people. He would inspire," said his youngest brother, David. "I'm an engineer, and I didn't think about how to relate to people, but Frank did," he said. In addition to his work, Conkey was an avid hiker and naturalist. Into his 80s, Conkey was leading walking tours for Lyon Arboretum, said Warren Conkey. He also started a horticulture program for high school students, taking them into the foothills to teach them plant names and the unique terrain. Doak C. Cox, of Honolulu, founding father of the University of Hawaii Tsunami, Water Resource and Environmental centers, died April 21, 2003 at home. Cox, 86, suffered from lung cancer. Dr. Jackie Miller, a friend and associate since 1965, said Cox was well respected by colleagues. Cox was known for his "detailed analysis of any problem or situation and the fairness" he showed in arriving at a conclusion, she said. Miller, a semiretired associate coordinator of the UH's Environmental Center, which Cox started, said he was "incredibly fair, objective and nonjudgmental ... a highly remarkable individual." Born in 1917 in Wailuku, Maui, Cox spent most of his childhood on Kauai. He graduated from Punahou School in 1934 and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in mathematics from UH. He left Harvard University in 1941 -- one thesis short of a Ph.D. in geology -- to join the U.S. Geological Survey from 1941 to 1945. Many years later, Harvard awarded him the long-delayed Ph.D. by accepting many of his

published papers as a thesis. At the end of World War II, he returned to Hawaii as a geophysicist at the Experiment Station of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters Association, from 1946 to 1960. Soon after, he joined UH as a professor of geology, where he remained until 1985. While at UH he founded the Tsunami Research Program at the Hawaii Institute of Geophysics (1960 to 1964), the Water Resource Research Center (1964 to 1970) and the Environmental Center (1970 to 1985). Among his many honors, Cox was the emeritus geophysicist, senior fellow of the Joint Institute of Marine and Atmospheric Research and the graduate faculty of geology and geophysics from 1985 till his death. He served as the tsunami adviser for the Hawaii Civil Defense Division and served on numerous state task forces. In 1995 he received the Governor's Award for Distinguished State Service and a Governor's Commendation. Cox was the only person to serve twice as president of the Hawaii Academy of Science, in 1958 and 1984. He was made an honorary life member of the academy, receiving its first lifetime Achievement Award in 2002. Jim Moncur, director of the UH Water Resources Center, said Cox's death was "a real blow to us all." Celia Cruz, who went from singing in Havana nightclubs to become the "Queen of Salsa," died yesterday Jul 16, 2003, her publicist said. Cruz, who was 77, died of a brain tumor. She had surgery for the ailment in December, but her health faltered. She died at her home in Fort Lee, N.J., according to her publicist, Blanca Lasalle. Her husband, trumpeter Pedro Knight, was at

her side; the pair had celebrated their 41st wedding anniversary on Monday, Lasalle said. Ruben Blades, a frequent collaborator and friend, called Cruz a classy icon whose dynamic performances became her trademark. "Celia Cruz could take any song and make it unforgettable. She transcended the material," Blades said last night. "With Celia, even the most simple of songs became injected with her personality and her vigor." "I don't think you could hear anything she ever did and be indifferent," he said. business when a relative entered her in a radio talent contest, which she won. She later studied music at the Havana Conservatory and performed at the world-famous Tropicana nightclub. In the 1950s, Cruz became famous with the legendary Afro-Cuban group La Sonora Matancera. She left Cuba after its 1959 revolution for the United States in 1960, and never returned. Cruz was branded persona non grata by Fidel Castro's government in Cuba for leaving the country in 1960. She was refused entry when her mother was sick and father died. Asked if she would ever return to Cuba, Cruz said last July in an [interview with the Star-Bulletin](#) to promote her Hawaii concerts, "I hope so, but I will never go there until the present political regime is out of there." With her powerful voice and flamboyant stage shows, Cruz helped bring salsa music to a broad audience. Celia Cruz made her one and only visit to the islands in late July 2002, where she did two well-received shows on Oahu and Maui. "She became a symbol of quality and strength, and she became a symbol of Afro-Cuban music," Blades said. "You couldn't be a fan of Celia and not be a fan of Afro-Cuban music, because she was Afro-Cuban music." Cruz dazzled not only with her voice, but also her personality. Always flashing a wide smile, the entertainer gave a highly energetic stage show, punctuated often by her trademark shout, "Azucar!" in the middle of a song. The word, which means "sugar" in Spanish, became her catch phrase after a waiter apparently asked her, to her surprise, if she wanted sugar in her coffee. Her alliance with fellow salsa star and "Mambo King" Tito Puente resulted in some of the biggest successes in her career. The two recorded albums and regularly performed together, and they were considered legends of the genre. She was also a member of the Fania All-Stars, the Afro-Cuban music collective that recorded for the Fania record label in the 1970s, along with Blades and Willie Colon. She dazzled listeners with fiery songs such as "Quimbara." Blades noted that although she was typically the only woman excelling in the salsa field, she was never intimidated. "She was a proud woman in a male-dominated business where she excelled because she had class herself," he said. She recorded more than 70 albums and had more than a dozen Grammy nominations. She won best salsa album for "La Negra Tiene Tumbao" at last year's Latin Grammy Awards, and won the same

award at this year's Grammy Awards. The life and persona of Cruz can be found on the biographical track from her last studio album, the Grammy-winning "La Negra Tiene Tumbao." There's a lyric on "Corazon de Rumba" that translates to "My flag is happiness, and my purpose is to sing." Among her other best-known recordings are "Yerberito Moderno" and "Que le Den Candela." Called the "Queen of Salsa" and the "diva of Latin song," Cruz remained energetic late into her career, popular with young audiences as well as old. At last year's Latin Grammys, she showed up wearing a frothy blue-and-white headpiece and a tight red dress and gave a hip-shaking performance. In 1987 she was honored with a star on Hollywood's Walk of Fame, and several years later the city of Miami gave Calle Ocho, the main street of its Cuban community, the honorary name of Celia Cruz Way. Cruz also received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Smithsonian Institution, and in 1994, President Clinton honored her with an award from the National Endowment for the Arts. The Recording Academy and Latin Recording Academy issued a statement yesterday that read in part: "One of Latin music's most respected and most revered vocalists, Celia Cruz was an icon of salsa, tropical and Latin jazz music. ... Thank you, Celia, for teaching all of us that life should be lived with much 'Azucar!'" Pop and salsa singer Marc Anthony, a friend who recently paid tribute to Cruz at a gala concert, said in a statement: "We are witnessing the end of an era. She is simply irreplaceable, and it's just an honor to know that she was a part of my life." Blades said Cruz's music and the legacy she left behind would live on. "The real death begins when you forget," he said. "No one is going to forget Celia." [SB 1/07/2003]
