Harold Falk, 78, who served as the administrator in charge of the state's prisons and as a deputy chief in the Honolulu Police Department, died

Friday Jan 31, 2003 at his home in Lanikai. Daughter Carol-Louise Carper said yesterday that Falk's death of a heart attack "was a shock," and that her father had not had heart problems before. "He was a quiet man, a good father and the best friend anybody could have," said Carper, the oldest of Falk's three children. "He was a very straightforward and honest person," said former Gov. John Waihee, who appointed Falk as deputy director for law enforcement when the Department of Public Safety was formed in 1990. Falk went to work for the state prison system as a consultant in 1985, then served as director when it was part of the Department of Social Services and Housing. He was director of the newly formed Department of Corrections from 1987 to 1990 when it was made part of the new public safety department, which also included sheriffs, the security force, harbor patrol and narcotics officers. Having served 37 years in the police department and overseen state prisons, Falk "had experience in both corrections and law enforcement. I appreciated his integrity and his judgment," Waihee said. Though Falk retired within a year of the Department of Public Safety's creation, "he was able to get the place better organized and running." "We're going to miss him and we appreciate his service," Waihee said. Then-American Civil Liberties Union attorney Daniel Foley said in a Star-Bulletin article in 1991 that Falk was "at the forefront of (prison) reform." "It was really under Harold in 1987 when we first started seeing progress under the consent decree" under which Hawaii prisons were operating at the time. But Carper said she'll always see her father as a policeman. "HPD was his life," she said, recalling going to the Honolulu Police Pistol Club with him as a child. Since retiring in 1990, Falk played golf and was a season ticket holder for University of Hawaii sports, while also remaining a fan of his former hometown team, the Green Bay Packers, Carper said. He also served 12 years on the Kailua Neighborhood Board, where he focused on public safety issues. "He was a pillar of the board, he was an anchor," said fellow board member Knud Lindgard. "He was a quiet person, but whenever he spoke people listened. His thoughts were usually very clear and very straight. A lot of people followed him and I'm one of them. "He was straightforward, no smoke and mirrors. If there's an issue we'll look at it fairly and squarely and that would be it," Lindgard said. "He will be sorely missed. I will miss him personally." Falk is survived by his wife of 57 years, Priscilla; Carper; son Harold III and daughter Michelle Wilson. Arrangements were incomplete [SB 09/02/2003] yesterday.

Harold J. Falk Jr - Retired Honolulu Police Deputy Chief Harold J. Falk Jr., who served as a state corrections official in the 1980s, died Feb. 7, 2003

at his Lanikai home. He was 78. Falk also was a 12-year veteran of the Kailua Neighborhood Board. He attended the board's monthly meeting the night before he died, and his death came as a shock to many board members. "He was an active participant like he always was," said Donna Wong, a board member for 20 years. "He was quiet, but when he did talk, people really listened because he had really constructive, important things to say." Falk was born on Dec. 5, 1924, in Brooklyn, N.Y. He was raised in Green Bay, Wis., and joined the Navy in January 1942. Falk was stationed at Kane'ohe and fell in love with Hawai'i and his future wife. Priscilla Abreu. The couple married in 1946 and settled in Lanikai. That year, Falk joined the Honolulu Police Department. His daughter, Carol-Louise Carper, said the department was his life. "He joined the Police Department to better himself," Carper said. "He worked himself up through the ranks on his own merit." In 1974, Falk was named assistant chief and four years later was named deputy chief under Chief Francis Keala. Falk retired from the department in August 1983. Police Chief Lee Donohue said Falk was a fitness proponent who wanted officers to better themselves. Falk sought to improve relations between the rank and file and commanders by setting up intramural sports. "We lost a great community leader and police officer," Donohue said. "He was a skilled administrator, and even after retiring he was involved in the community." Although retired, Falk served as a consultant with the state Corrections Division. In 1987, then-Gov. John Waihee tapped Falk's expertise in law enforcement and named him director of the new Department of Corrections. In 1990, Falk was appointed deputy director of the Department of Public Safety. He oversaw the sheriff's office and Narcotics Enforcement Division. Falk retired again in 1991, and for the past 12 years he was active with the neighborhood board. He recently worked with the Kailua police station to develop ways to reduce crime in the area. Falk is survived by his wife, Priscilla; children, Carol-Louise Carper, Harold J. III and Michele Wilson; four grandchildren; brothers, Raymond, William, Ernest and Allen; sisters, Carolyn Arcand and Adele Phillips. Joseph A. Ferrario, bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Honolulu from 1982 to 1993, died Friday evening at St. Francis Medical Center. He was 77. "I have lost a very dear friend," Bishop Francis X. DiLorenzo said of his predecessor's death. DiLorenzo was grieving Ferrario's death, and had no further comment yesterday, said Patrick Downes, a diocesan spokesman. DiLorenzo became bishop in 1993 after Ferrario, who had been suffering heart problems that led to quintuple heart bypass surgery, retired. Pope John Paul II appointed Ferrario third diocesan bishop of Honolulu in 1982. He was installed during a ceremony June 29 at Neal Blaisdell Center. Ferrario was not new to Hawai'i at that time. He had become a priest in 1951, ordained at the Cathedral of St. Peter in his hometown of Scranton, Pa. By 1957, he was teaching at St. Stephen Seminary in Kane'ohe, now the Diocesan Center. Father Terrence Watanabe, parish priest at St. Philomena in Salt Lake, was a freshman at the seminary the last year Ferrario taught Greek and math to the upperclassmen. "I was very afraid of him," Watanabe said. "He had a nickname: The Spider. The upperclassmen would taunt us, telling us that he would sneak around at night, trying to catch us breaking curfew, and that he was very quiet, and you wouldn't hear him coming. "He wasn't really that bad. That was just the reputation they passed on to us, and I didn't talk to him my whole freshman year. I just made sure our paths wouldn't cross." Watanabe said he got to know Ferrario through his work with youth groups after Ferrario left the seminary and began working for the diocese. Over time, the two men became close friends. "In recent years, he was living in Kailua and it was more difficult to see him," Watanabe said. "We tried to get him to take an apartment over here in town. I think he was a little lonely at times, but I tried to talk to him on the telephone a lot." Father Gary Secor, vicar for clergy and director of vocations for the diocese, said he met Ferrario as a youth, too. Ferrario had been an occasional visiting priest at St. John Vianney, Secor's childhood parish, and later a leader in Hawai'i's Catholic youth ministries. Secor said he hadn't had to deal with the disciplinarian side of Ferrario the high-school seminarians would have seen. He said he grew close to Ferrario when the older man was parish priest at St. Anthony in Kailua, Secor's first assignment after ordination. "He had a very

gentle, affirming strength about him," Secor said. "He was a very good example and a good mentor." Secor and Watanabe both talked about Ferrario's love of the liturgy, the public part of the church's worship. Ferrario became a leader in the diocese as the church was implementing reforms from the Second Vatican Council, which closed in 1965. The reforms included deep changes in the liturgy. Among other modernizations, priests were required to face their parishioners and speak in the language of the congregation, instead of Latin, the traditional language of the church. Many priests and parishioners found the changes difficult. "A lot of priests left," Watanabe said. "They felt betrayed. He understood their reluctance — he came from the old church as well — but he also understood that we needed to move forward." Ferrario studied the documents of Vatican II, understood them clearly and worked to embody their teachings, Watanabe said. "He lived them," Watanabe said. "He wasn't afraid of change, and he challenged others to be more open and understanding." "Bishop Joe," Secor said, "was a bridge builder. He was trained in the old school, but young enough and intelligent enough to take the best of both the old and the new. "That is what we called him. Bishop Joe. That was unique at the time — calling a bishop by his first name. He certainly wasn't a stuffed shirt. In the best sense of the word, he was a gentleman." Secor said he had last seen Ferrario on Thursday at luncheon for the diocesan staff at St. Stephen. The older man looked tired, Secor said, but happy. "He seemed to be enjoying himself," Secor said. "He always enjoyed the gatherings we had." The later years of Ferrario's time as bishop became even more stressful, when, in 1991, he was accused of molesting a boy in the 1970s. The church cleared Ferrario of charges, and a judge dismissed a civil case against him. Although his heart problems had intensified then, he had been well in his last years, said Downes, who was hired by Ferrario in 1982. "It was quite a shock," Downes said of Ferrario's death. Ferrario had been active and had not been ill until Friday, Downes said. The retired bishop had been working half time at St. Stephen Diocesan Center in Kane'ohe, raising scholarship money for Catholic school children as vice president and CEO of the Augustine Educational Foundation, an institution he had established. He had returned to his home in Kailua, next to St. Anthony's, when he began to have chest pains shortly before 5 p.m. Friday. A friend took him to Castle Medical Center, where he was met by DiLorenzo and other friends. DiLorenzo administered the sacrament of the sick. Ferrario was alert and aware of what was going on, but became sicker as the evening progressed, Downes said. Castle officials transferred him to St. Francis Medical Center after his condition worsened. The bishop and Ferrario's other friends followed him there. Ferrario died at 10:25 p.m. He is

survived by his sister-in-law, Marianne Ferrario and two nephews and nieces. Services are pending. [Adv 14/12/2003]

Muriel Macfarlane Flanders - While Hawaii knew her as a generous philanthropist, Muriel Macfarlane Flanders spent her lifetime composing songs of Hawaii. "She was a poet," said her daughter Alice Guild. "It was just a natural evolution into songwriting. When she found the perfect word or stanza, the perfect way to capture a thought, it was like finding an Easter egg." Until two years ago only one of her songs, "Sea Breeze," had been commercially recorded (by Jack de Mello in the early 1960s). But on her 92nd birthday, an album of 15 of her songs, performed by artists including Tony Conjugacion, the Cazimero Brothers and the late Moe Keale, was released by Mountain Apple Co. Flanders, 93, died yesterday Jan 24, 2003 morning. Before her death, she was the eldest living grandchild of wealthy businessman and landowner James Campbell, whose estate remains one of the largest private landholders in Hawaii, and daughter of Abigail Kamokila Campbell. Flanders found a way to combine two of her loves -- music and Hawaii's children -- by donating funds to start a music program at Hale O Ulu, a high school in Ewa for youths in crisis run by Child and Family Service. "I remember her telling me she only wanted the best ukuleles for the children, and 'the very best ukuleles are the Kamaka ukuleles,'" said Geri Marullo, president and chief executive officer for Child and Family Service. "You call the Kamakas, and you tell them it's for the children.' So our children have the best ukuleles. "We're going to miss her very much, but her ukuleles will always be treasured," Marullo said. Flanders, who played the piano by ear, wrote both lyrics and music, incorporating Hawaiian legends and stories she was intrigued with Flanders was a major donor to dozens of organizations and institutions. She was dedicated to beautifying the environment, contributing toward many Outdoor Circle projects, including a rest area on the makai side of Diamond Head and beautifying Lanikai Point. "She did so many great things for the community and never wanted any credit for it," said Mary King, board member of the Lani-Kailua Outdoor Circle. "She would give in any way anybody asked her to." Her husband, Walter Flanders Jr., came up with the idea for the CD and approached de Mello about it, but died in 1999 before it was released. "She was definitely the grande dame of Hawaii," said de Mello, who produced the CD "Songs of Muriel Flanders," which has done well commercially. He describes her as a gracious, warm and wonderful lady. "She was such beautiful spirit inside," he said, and outside "she was gorgeous, she was stunning and had such a persona about her, such an aura." For Conjugacion, Flanders' death was difficult to handle. "I feel a part of myself is dying because those people are who I am. An entire era is passing on," he said as he wept.
